Inquiry Book

At the end of last term the children brought home their Unit of Inquiry book focusing on the central idea 'Light creates shadows and reflections.' If you have not had a chance to look through this with your child, can you please do so and return by the end of this week.

Mini-beasts Unit of Inquiry

This term we have begun our next unit focusing on the central idea 'Mini-beasts play a role in the environment.'

The students will be inquiring into:

- Different types of mini-beasts
- The role of mini-beasts in the environment
- Our responsibility to care for mini-beasts

Students are invited to bring different examples of mini-beasts into the classroom to share. If possible we would like to keep the mini-beasts for the duration of the term. If you have a live mini-beast which we could borrow and care for during the unit, please let either of us know with a diary note. It would also be greatly appreciated if you could also send to school any resources you have at home relating to mini-beasts. Please ensure that your child's name is clearly marked on the things brought into school. We will take care of them and return them at the conclusion of the unit.

If you have or have had any mini-beasts at home or have an interest in them and would like to come in to talk to the classes about them, please fill in the form on the second page on what you could share and what time would best suit you.

Throughout this unit we will also be focusing on the two attributes of the Learner Profile and two attitudes. It would be beneficial for your child if you could discuss these words at home and focus on them in your daily living.

Appreciation: Being grateful for something. Respect: Being polite and kind to others and the world.
