### **DEFINITIONS OF TERMS**

### **Program Types**

- **Rapid Re-Housing** provides time-limited rental assistance and housing stabilization services to move homeless people into permanent housing as quickly as possible.
  - Programs include CoC-funded & ESG-funded rapid re-housing programs, VA Supportive Services for Veteran Families
     (SSVF) rapid re-housing programs, HUD-funded Veterans Homelessness Prevention Demo programs, and other publicly
     or privately funded rapid re-housing programs.
- Permanent Supportive Housing is permanent housing and supportive services for homeless persons with disabilities.
  - Programs include publicly and privately funded permanent supportive housing programs, CoC-funded permanent supportive housing (Shelter+Care and SHP Permanent Housing), HUD-VASH (Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing)

### **Chronically Homeless**

- Definition: a homeless individual or a homeless family with an adult head of household who:
  - Has a disabling condition (serious mental illness, substance use disorder, developmental disability, physical disability)
     AND
  - Has been homeless and living in a place not meant for human habitation or an emergency shelter continuously for at least 1 year or on at least 4 separate occasions in the last 3 years
