Milton Dehn, Ed.D., NCSP, is a nationally recognized speaker on cognitive processing assessment and working memory. Dr. Dehn is the author of **Essentials of Processing Assessment and Working Memory and Academic Learning: Assessment and Intervention**.

After working as a school psychologist and training school psychology graduate students for many years, Dr. Dehn is now a private practice school psychologist in Wisconsin and the program director for Schoolhouse Tutoring(r), an agency that provides assessment, consultation, tutoring, and memory training for children with learning and memory problems.

Working memory plays a critical, integral role in cognitive functioning and academic learning. Academic skills and performance depend heavily on working memory. The main purpose of this workshop is to provide psychologists with expertise in:

- Contemporary working memory theory
- Current working memory tests and assessment procedures
- Evidence-based interventions

Information will be provided on:

- Working memory subprocesses
 - Phonological
 - Visuospatial
 - Episodic
 - Verbal
 - Executive

The assessment portion of the workshop will include:

- Working memory measurement paradigms
- Planning selective, cross-battery testing
- Behaviours indicative of working memory problems
- The use of cognitive and memory scales to assess working memory
- A review of new scales specifically designed for working memory assessment

Cross-battery procedures for analyzing test scores gathered through selective testing will also be demonstrated.

Evidence-based interventions for memory, including:

- Mnemonic strategies
- Metamemory development
- Effective instructional methods to support working memory limitations for all learners.
