- Log onto **WOIS.org**, type in the **Site Key egg830** in the left navigation pane.
- Click on **Schools**, then **School Search**, next **Start School Search** (in the middle of the page in blue).
- Start by clicking on **Location**, choose your state, and click on **Save changes**.
Note: As you click on each heading, be sure to click on **Save changes**.
- Next choose **Education Program**, click on programs you are interested in – click **Add to list**, save changes.
- Choose **Type of school**; make your selection, **Save changes**.
- Continue to examine blue options (tuition, sports, etc.) to narrow your search, **Save changes**.
- Once search is narrowed, choose at least two schools you are interested in, click on **Compare selected schools**.
- Use the **School Compare – Results** page to fill in the chart below. For further information needed in the chart, click on the school name. This will take you to the school page which has more detailed information.
