The judges selection committee will present its recommended roster of compensated and non-compensated judges and alternates for the 2016 US Figure Skating National Championships to the USARS Board of Directors at its Semi - Annual meeting in Fall of 2015. Obtaining Board approval at that time will assure that all selected officials may be informed early enough to allow them to plan for the 2016 National Championships. The National Championships will be held in Lincoln, Nebraska, approximately July 24th through August 6th.



Conflicts:

Reporting of conflicts is based on the honor system. We can know of conflicts ONLY when they are listed. There exists distinctions between true conflicts, perceived, and activity related conflicts.

- 1. Conflicts of interest are issues that one may have related to judging a relative, a person with whom one had a personal or sexual relationship in the past, a former skating partner, a former student whom the judge may have taught, a relationship with someone who may employ you or whom you may employ. It is imperative that the membership have assurance that only skating is being considered in an evaluation. While we are trusting of the official's integrity, we are mindful that sometimes appearance may be significant to the membership. It IS wise to avoid the potential of calling into question the integrity of any official/competition.
- 2. Perceived conflicts (Appearance of conflicts) are conflicts in which there might exist the perception of a conflict. There is no prohibition against judging such events, but when possible, the judges' selection committee will try to avoid placing you on such events. In such conflicts, the official does not have any working relationship with the athlete. Such perceived conflicts would include athletes representing the same club as the official, etc.
- 3. If you coach a skater regularly whether or not you derive monetary gain, whether called a consultation or any other term, that is a conflict, and you are expected to list that as a conflict of interest. If you work with a skater or club in any other setting than in a seminar or workshop setting, and your ability to evaluate a skater or club members is jeopardized by that interaction, this is a conflict.
- 4. Involvement in activities normally recognized as the domain of the professional in developing programs and instructional modes are inappropriate for judges and should be considered as conflicts.



For new officials or those renewing their competitive commissions

(a) Standard of Conduct

- (1) The following Judges' Creed Standard of Conduct is established for the guidance of all judges of roller figure skating officiating at all levels of sanctioned USARS competitions.
 - (a) I shall make my judgment to the best of my ability with all humility and then shall keep my own counsel unless questioned officially
 - (b) I shall free my mind of all former impressions, be cooperative and punctual, and do my best always to improve my knowledge and to uphold the dignity of the sport.
- (2) Judges shall not converse with each other or with spectators or contestants while judging. They shall not compare notes with one another and must judge independently.
- (3) Judges may not consult previously prepared marks during a competition.
- (4) When open scoring is used, judges will not write down the announced scores of any skater or team during an event they are judging.
- (5) Judges must not bring any form of electronic communicative system to the judges' stand.
- (6) Judges shall refrain from publishing, e-mailing, texting or tweeting any statements, or making comments in online chat rooms or discussion boards concerning tests and competitions in which they have served as judges.
- (b) Violation of the foregoing rules shall be deemed adequate grounds for appropriate action by the Judges' Selection Committee or by the Officials Committee.

I agree to the following terms:

- 1. I agree to abide by USARS code of ethics and standards of conduct.
- 2. I acknowledge that USARS may take disciplinary action against me if I breach the code of ethics or standards of conduct, and I understand that USARS has a complaint handling procedure in the event of an allegation against me.
- 3. I acknowledge that disciplinary action against me may include downgrading or withdrawal of commissions.
