
As we head into the Thanksgiving season, I want to tell you how very grateful I am for the

The boys varsity soccer had a great season, ending their regular season 7-4-1 and finishing just behind the co-champs Berlin and Loudonville Christian in the CHVL. They capped off the season playing extremely well against a talented Mayfield High School team in a losing effort in the opening round of Sectionals.

The girls finished their regular season with a 5-9 record and are headed to Fort Ann for the opening round of sectionals. All-Stars will be announced in the coming weeks for both the boys and girls soccer teams. The girls also played in this year's Pink Game, Doane Stuart's annual Breast Cancer fundraiser and defeated Lansingburg New Lebanon.

The inaugural season for boys JV Soccer ended with a double over time tie with Lansingburgh, which left them 1-5-1 for the season.

This was a re-building year for the Middle School soccer with many younger players this season. Despite this, it has been a productive season so far with 3 wins and 4 losses. The final game will be played at home against St. Gregory's on Oct. 29.

HAT TRICK DUO LEAD THUNDER CHICKENS TO SECTIONALS



A hat trick in soccer or hockey is the utimate accomplishment. To score 3 goals in a game is a tough but not exactly rare feat. But to have two players score a hat-trick in the same game for the same team is almost unheard of. For comparison purposes, the English Premier League, viewed by many to be the best soccer league in the world, has recorded over 200 hat tricks since the its formation in 1992. In that time (1992)

to present day) only ONCE has a team had two players score a hat trick for the same team in the same game. Louise Metz '17 of Troy (midfield) and Antonia DiPreta '18 of Clifton Park (sweeper) amazingly completed a double hat trick during a 6-0 victory against Rensselaer on October 7. This marked Antonia's first hat trick of her DS career and lifted her total to 7 goals on the season. When asked to describe one of her goals from the game, Antonia deferred and shared the credit with her teammate, "[The goal] came off a beautiful cross and I made a run to the near post. When Louise crosses it over, I usually know where the ball is going."

Louise had a second hat trick two days later in their next league game, this time in a 5-0 victory over New Lebanon. Scoring back-to-back hat tricks is also a rarity (achieved only 4 times in the premier league). For Louise, this gave her 11 goals on the season and 5 career hat tricks. Not too shabby for someone who normally plays defense on her club team!

A ROOFTOP PARTNERSHIP OPTOM S IN RENSSELAER





On a sunny, windy October day, students from Doane Stuart and Rensselaer Junior High School gathered on our green roof overlooking the Hudson River and downtown Albany. The seeds of this colaboration were planted this past summer when Karen Urbanski, Principal at Rensselaer Jr/Sr High School, and Lisa Brown, Associate Head of School at Doane Stuart, talked about starting a partnership involving Doane Stuart's green Rensselaer sciroof. ence teacher Adrienne Ladd was interested and


brought the 30 students in her 7th Grade Life Sciences class to Doane Stuart to meet with Doane Stuart 7th graders in Rachel Morgan's science class. Mrs. Morgan's students discussed the five categories of plants found on the green roof, which comprise over 70 species and 60,000 individual plants! Students enjoyed the peaceful space, took in the sun, talked about science and even taste-tested some of the chives that are growing on the roof.

Doane Stuart and Rensselaer students partner together in a number of ways – they compete on combined athletic teams, including last year's record-setting Track and Field team – and the plan is to have more green roof/science collaborations in the future, at all different grade levels. Head of School Pam Clarke has enjoyed the neighborly, community-focused atmosphere; "In my first year here I came to appreciate Rensselaer's collaborative spirit; I love working with 'Mayor Dan' and being a part of this positive community."

Funded by a \$1.4 million grant from the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, the roof reduces stormwater runoff, improves insulation and decreases energy use and expenses. As such, the green roof is yet another example of Doane Stuart's commitment to sustainable practices. Language in the grant states that the roof is expected to be a living, learning space that is an enhancement to the City and County of Rensselaer.


