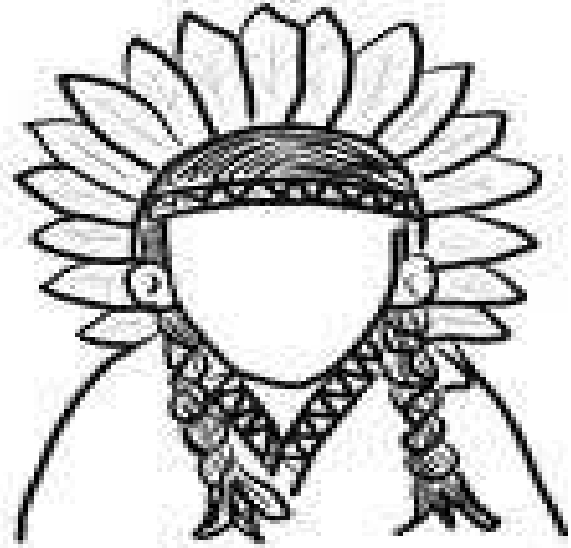
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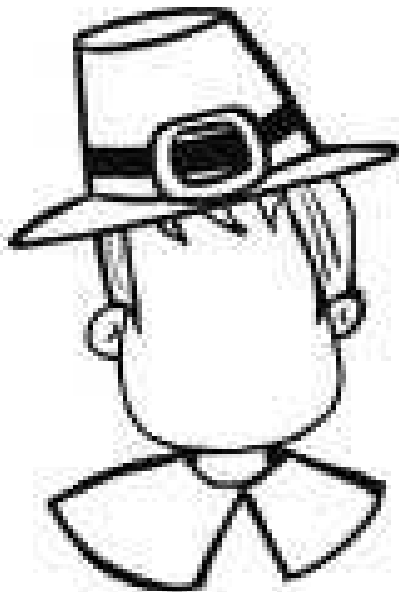

Toy Safety

- Tips to help choose appropriate toys for children:
- ✦ **Magnets** — For children under age six, avoid building sets with small magnets. If swallowed, serious injuries and/or death can occur.
- ✦ **Small Parts** — For children younger than age three, avoid toys with small parts, which can cause choking. Look for sturdy construction, such as tightly-secured eyes, noses and other potential small parts.
- ✦ **Ride-on Toys** — Riding toys, skateboards and in-line skates go fast and falls could be deadly. Helmets and safety gear should be sized to fit.
- ✦ **Projectile Toys** — Projectile toys such as air rockets, darts and sling shots are for older children. Improper use of these toys can result in serious eye injuries. For all children under 8, avoid toys that have sharp edges and points.
- ✦ **Chargers and Adapters** — Charging batteries should be supervised by adults. Chargers and adapters can pose thermal burn hazards to children.

Be a label reader when shopping for toys! Look for toy labels that give age and safety recommendations and use that information as a guide. And, before allowing your child to play with a toy that he has received as a gift, read the instructions carefully.

- To prevent both burns and electrical shocks, don't give young children (*under age ten*) a toy that must be plugged into an electrical outlet. Instead, buy toys that are battery-operated. Pay attention to instructions and warnings on battery chargers. Some chargers lack any device to prevent overcharging.
- Children under age three can choke on small parts contained in toys or games. Government regulations specify that toys for children under age three cannot have parts less than 1 1/4 inches in diameter and 2 1/4 inches long.
- Children under age 8 can choke or suffocate on uninflated or broken balloons. Remove strings and ribbons from toys before giving them to young children.
- Immediately discard plastic wrappings on toys before they become dangerous playthings.
- Watch for pull toys with strings that are more than 12 inches in length. They could be a strangulation hazard for babies.

Family FUN Holiday Recipes!

Pumpkin Recipe Pancakes

- 2 1/2 Cups pancake mix
- 2 Tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 Tablespoon cinnamon
- 1 12-ounce can evaporated milk
- 1/2 Cup pumpkin
- 3 Tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 eggs

raisins or chocolate chips for decorating the face
 Mix first pancake mix, brown sugar and cinnamon in bowl. Add in milk, pumpkin, vegetable oil, vanilla and eggs and blend together until smooth. Fry on griddle or skillet. Then have kids decorate



Bread and Celery Stuffing

- 1 (1 pound) loaf sliced white bread
- 3/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1 onion, chopped
- 4 stalks celery, chopped
- 2 teaspoons poultry seasoning
- salt and pepper to taste

1 cup chicken broth
 Let bread slices air dry for 1 to 2 hours, then cut into cubes.

In a Dutch oven, melt butter or margarine over medium heat. Cook onion and celery until soft. Season with poultry seasoning, salt, and pepper. Stir in bread cubes until evenly coated. Moisten with chicken broth; mix well.

Chill, and use as a stuffing for turkey, or bake in a buttered casserole dish at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 30 to 40 minutes.

Traditional Pumpkin Pie

- 3/4 Cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- 2 large eggs
- 1 -15 oz can pumpkin
- 12 oz. evaporated milk

unbaked 9 inch deep dish pie shell

Mix dry ingredients (first 5) in small bowl and set aside. Beat eggs in large bowl and stir in pumpkin. Then add dry ingredients. Gradually stir in evaporated milk and pour into pie shell. Bake in a 425 degree oven for 15 minutes then reduce temperature to 350 degrees and bake 30-40 minutes, until knife inserted near center comes out clean.

**1 3/4 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice can be substituted for the cinnamon, ginger and cloves

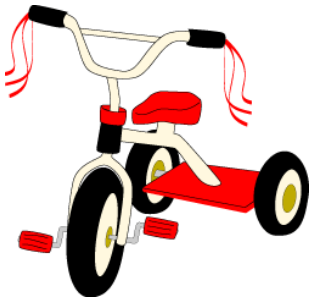

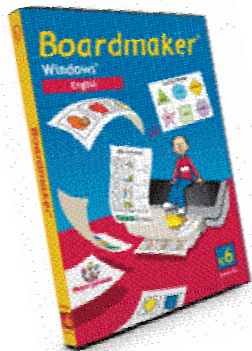
