### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

We strongly recommend that all applicants have English proficiency that is at least equivalent to a paper-based TOEFL score of 500. A TOEFL score is not required for admission; however, students will be required to enroll in the appropriate ESL coursework to improve their English proficiency before they can begin college level work. Not having the necessary English proficiency when you arrive could extend your stay for up to **two additional years**.

- Applicants with TOEFL scores under 500 on the paper-based test (173 on the computerized TOEFL, 61 on the Internet-based TOEFL), or IELTS scores under 5.0 must take the English as a Second Language (ESL) assessment test and agree to mandatory placement in ESL coursework.
- These students will study in the credit ESL program until they successfully complete level 4.
- Students placed in higher levels of the ESL program may take academic transfer classes only with advisor approval.

Students with a TOEFL score of 500 or higher will be allowed to enroll in college level courses.

### Fees for 2015-16

Tuition and enrollment fees will be collected in full at the time of registration. International student tuition for the academic year is **\$269** per unit (subject to change). As indicated on the explanation of costs on the *Financial Certification* form, students must verify that they have available approximately **USD\$23,000 for each** <u>academic year</u>. Bank statements must be provided showing funds available. All documents must be translated in English.

### **TRANSCRIPTS**

To qualify for admission, students must have graduated from high school (or have attained a high school graduation equivalency) or be at least 18 years of age by the beginning of the entering semester. Official transcripts from your high school and any colleges you have attended MUST be submitted with certified English translation.

### **HEALTH INSURANCE**

**Health insurance is mandatory.** All international students are required to have a proof of health insurance. Students will be assessed a health insurance fee at the time of registration. This low cost insurance option is available to all students. To opt out of the district sponsored health insurance, students must submit proof of alternative health insurance coverage in the United States no later than the following deadlines. Failure to provide proof by the deadline, will result in an automatic assignment of insurance with fees due upon enrollment.

Deadlines to provide evidence of other health insurance coverage:

Fall semester – August 1 Spring semester - January 4 Summer semester - June 1

### HOUSING

The college does not have dormitory facilities. Most students arrange their own housing. We recommend that students utilize the Homestay Program to find housing. Guaranteed Homestays are available for a placement fee of \$350. ### NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE

Admissions decisions are made on a rolling basis. Students with incomplete application packets will not be admitted. All application materials must be received by the deadline. Admissions letters and I-20's will be issued to all qualified applicants with instructions for obtaining your VISA.

### **ORIENTATION, ADVISING & REGISTRATION**

Once you are admitted to the college, you will receive information on when you will be expected to arrive in the United States. Students are encouraged to arrive at least two weeks before the semester begins. You can arrive in the USA up to 30 days before the start of term. All new students are required to attend a *mandatory orientation* which typically occurs one week prior to the semester. During the orientation, you will meet with a counselor and will receive instructions of how to register in classes. If you are unable to enter into the US on your I-20 your I-20 will automatically be deferred to the next semester. Those that enter into the US on their Contra Costa College I-20 and **do not attend the mandatory orientation their I-20 will be terminated.**


