FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Book of Faith Lenten Journey: Marks of the Christian

The life of faith is a journey. The road is sometimes straight and easy, sometimes twisting over mountainous passes. We may travel through sunny days and bad weather. Along the way, we acquire habits and marks from where we've been.

I invite you into a Lenten journey this year called Marks of the Christian. Author David Miller writes,

"So often we read the Bible moralistically and legalistically. Our eyes fix on words that tell us what to do and what not to do, on what we have done wrong or failed to do. Read this way, the Bible quickly degenerates into a nagging kill-joy, pointing out our weaknesses and failures to be what we think God wants of us. It also becomes a book that is primarily about us, not about God – and what God, in incomprehensible love, is doing for us and all creation.

"A theme like 'marks of the Christian' could easily fall into this trap, devolving into a fingershaking rant about the 'marks' we should be working up to show we are followers of Jesus.

"But 'marks of the Christian' are not God's 'must-do' list for our lives. They are God's work in us. They are what happens in a human soul under the impact of a love that knows no boundaries, a grace which constantly seeks and

wants us, a God who has treasured us since before the dawn of time."

I invite you to take your Lenten journey with others in our congregation in the ways you can. Please pray about and consider the opportunity for taking the "marks of the Christian" journey alone or with a small group. Consider making Sunday worship a priority throughout Lent. Consider the opportunity for breaking bread with others for any or all of the five Thursdays beginning Feb. 25, with a simple and lovely evening prayer service afterward.

The church focuses on spiritual practices, such as fasting, almsgiving, and prayer, and community support for these during Lent, not out of any desire to dominate the lives of people, but out of pastoral concern for your benefit. Lent is a time when we reintroduce some of these practices to each generation because they are life-giving and renewing.

I look forward to walking this journey with you.


There is so much pain in the world, but there is also so much HOPE!

COUNCIL CORNER: A BRIEF RECAP OF ADVENT'S CHURCH COUNCIL MEETINGS

At the January 5 meeting, the Church Council reviewed the 2010 budget prior to the two Congregational Conversations scheduled between services on January 10 and 17. A motion to approve George Crowe as Operations Chair until the Congregational meeting was approved unanimously. A motion to award \$500 to Mark J. from the David Brandt Memorial Scholarship Fund was approved unanimously.

At the January 19 meeting, the Church Council approved its meeting calendar for 2010. It also discussed the comments from the Congregational Conversations in regard to the 2010 proposed budget. There was initial sharing of points from the Cottage Meetings, which will discussed in more detail at the Council Retreat, where a plan will be developed to share results with the congregation. There was discussion on how to provide monthly financial updates, selection of the second quarter mission, the annual giving statements, the Lenten soup suppers, and building security.

At the January 23 Council Retreat, members focused on setting norms for their work together, discussed healthy versus unhealthy conflict, and began drafting behavioral covenants. The Council also reviewed results from the Cottage Meetings and developed a communication plan for sharing those results. Finally, the nuts and bolts of being a Council member and what it means to be a Book of Faith congregation were addressed.

If you would like a copy of the full meeting minutes, you may request them following their approval by Council.

Along with Evening Prayer, this year there will be presentations on the six chief parts of Luther's Small Catechism:

There will be sign-up sheets at Advent at the beginning of the month for forming small groups for this purpose. Another possibility is covenanting with one or more people in your household, such as your spouse, to set aside time each week, or even each day, for sharing this journey. Another possibility is having a prayer and journey partner from another part of the state, country, or world, with whom you covenant to share this journey. Cottage Meetings Update

The results are in for the Cottage Meeting 20 question Stewardship Assessment and the Questionnaire Responses to the two questions: What in your mind is the single most important thing Advent is and does? and What can I personally do to further the vision of Advent? The printed results will be available at the church beginning Sunday, January 31st. On Sunday, February 14, all who wish will gather in the Library at 9:40 AM for a dialogue about those results.

The cottage meetings were intended as a forum to:

- 1) Share devotions, fellowship and prayer in a casual environment,
- 2) Invite people of Advent to review and engage in the dialogue on the Advent Mission Statement, Changed Lives, Changing Lives, Through Christ's Love and the new Vision Statement, A welcoming faith community that supports individuals and families in knowing and living the grace, truth and hope of Christ in the world.
- 3) Review the four 2010 goals of the Stewardship Committee,
- 4) Look at our ministries and have an opportunity for each person to consider ways to support those ministries, and
- 5) Offer a Stewardship assessment through the 20 question survey and the two questions stated above.

The Stewardship Committee would like to thank each and every one of you who attended a meeting and who completed the survey and questionnaire. It gave us and the Council some really good insight into the vision our members have for Advent Lutheran.

We'd also like to thank committee members Craig J. who compiled the data from the survey and broke it down into a bar graph for each question, and Virginia M. who transferred all of the

answers to the two questions on the questionnaire into a single document for your review.

Everyone in attendance also had the opportunity to ask questions and offer suggestions. Those questions and suggestions are important in hearing the voices of the congregation and will be addressed over the next few months, most likely in this newsletter. We received input through the end of November, the input was compiled in December, and written results reviewed and published in January.

The Thrivent Builds and Habitat for Humanity home build project in Morgan Hill is set to start the accepting volunteers.

SUMMARY

- The Thrivent sponsored home is located on Cory Drive (opposite #16805), bordered by East Dunne Ave, Butterfield Ave., and San Pedro Ave. It is one of 6 homes as part of the Habitat for Humanity project in Morgan Hill.
- The project is expected to be completed in 8-10 months, depending on weather and strength of the volunteer participation.

HOW TO VOLUNTEER

Groups

- A group is between 5-20 persons. A count and list of names needs to be sent to the coordinator two (2) weeks in advance of each Saturday session. This will help the coordinator to plan headcount and assignments each Saturday, since other Lutheran groups will also be volunteering in the project.
- Ted C. and Daryl Z. will be coordinating the group representing Advent Lutheran.
 If you would like to join the Advent team, let them know if you can: commit to specific Saturdays (1st, 3rd of the month), as specific date if we are assigned, a specific month, or want to be on the list on call depending on availability of assignments.

A sign-up sheet will be setup in the narthex and published on the Advent website. Specific dates assigned to the Advent team will be posted as well.

Individual

• Go to www.habitatsiliconvalley.org\volunteer\volunteernow. Fill out a short on-line registration form and sign up for a specific date. Individual volunteers can work on days other than Saturday, usually Wed-Fri. The schedule will be posted shortly.

Due to liability considerations, one must be over 18 yrs old to work on site. Youth between 16 and 18 may work on site as long as a parent or guardian is with them.

WHAT TO BRING AND WEAR

Tools and hardhats will be available on site. You may bring your own tools and equipment if more comfortable. Construction quality clothing, sturdy shoes/boots, and protective eyewear are recommended.

SKILLS

No specific construction skills are required. During the project, we will provide updates on the progress of the build and the kind of work upcoming. That way, you can plan to volunteer for a specific type of work (e.g. drywall, painting).
