Your Landlord Must Provide A Safe Rental

It's natural for student renters to get pretty focused on one thing and one thing only when they go to rent a place, and that's monthly cost. While it's great to be able to pay rent, buy books, and eat something besides ramen during the semester, it's not a smart move to put up with unsafe rental conditions in the place you call home while you're studying here at UM.

A couple of important things to know: Egress windows are a necessity in basement apartments, and working smoke detectors are required in all rentals. Gas furnaces are not permitted to serve more than one rental unit (why should you pay for someone else's heat?), and stairways need to be safe, which means their rise and run are consistent and they have appropriately installed handrails and guardrails.

These are just a few important safety requirements for your rental, all of which your landlord is obligated to facilitate. You can get a complete list of requirements by contacting the UM Off-Campus Renter Center in the UC, and if you have any questions or uncertainties about the safety of your living situation, request a FREE (that's right, free-no ramen excuses) housing inspection from a City of Missoula housing inspector through the Voluntary Residential Housing Inspection Program (VRIP).

With papers, exams, presentations, and the no-doubt spectacular social life you manage to fit into all that school stuff, you don't have time to live in an unsafe environment. If you have any uncertainties about the safety of the place you're renting, follow every good professor's advice: Ask questions! The information is available and so is the FREE (did I say free?) housing inspection that will ensure the place you rent is safe-no matter what you pay per month.

Ask the Renter Center for an inspection today!
