The roundabout has now been reinstated with a temporary planting scheme installed. Cavendish is part of the Council's Vibrant District Centre improvement programme. Resident raised concerns regarding the condition of the car park.	The car park is litter picked three times a week and all fly tipping is removed.

Noise nuisance Sackville Street	Following a further complaint the resident causing noise nuisance has been visited by the Neighbourhood Officer and warned that any further breeches will result in removal of noise equipment if witnessed. There have been no further complaints.
Fly tipping by Silly Sids	This has been removed and possible CCTV relocation.
Recycling sites	Recycling sites are to be installed on Havelock Road near the junction with Brunswick Street and Lower Dale Road by the Sure Start building. There are no further installations planned for the ward.

Neighbourhood Working

In Normanton Ward a partnership of services, residents and organisations has come together to create your Neighbourhood Team. Together they work to resolve problems and issues affecting the local community.

Normanton Ward has a Neighbourhood Board that consists of the three local ward councillors, local residents, and representatives from local communities and many partners including: Community Safety Partnership, the Council, the Police, Derby Homes, NHS Derby City, Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service and community and voluntary groups.

The Neighbourhood Board sets local priorities and plans, encourages local people to take part in decisions about their lives and communities, aims to create better relationships between communities and public services and helps services to be 'closer' to local communities

A helping hand with home repairs for older people

Handyperson Service

Carrying out small jobs around the home for older people Our Handyperson Service helps you to deal with small jobs around the house.

Who can use our Service? You need to:

- live in Derby
- be aged 75 or
- be aged 60 and over and getting income-related benefits (like Council Tax Benefit) or health-related benefits (like Attendance Allowance).

Why use our Service? We

- only use our own handy people to carry out the work.
- charge only for the materials needed to do the job and there are no labour charges.
- will discuss any costs for materials (like new taps) with you before the job is done.

What types of jobs does our Service cover?

- We can do small jobs around the home including:
- assembling small, flat pack furniture
- putting up shelves or mirrors
- repairing toilet cisterns
- adjusting overflow
- replacing taps or tap washers
- unblocking sinks
- fitting extra locks on windows and doors.



Home Improvement Agency Service

Supporting older people through every stage of home improvement Our Home Improvement Agency Service offers advice on home repairs or improvements and tells you how much they will cost. It offers peace of mind knowing that you are getting a reasonable price for larger work done to a Council-inspected standard by reliable contractors.

Who can use our Service?

You need to:

- live in Derby
- be aged 60 and over or under 60 and getting Disability Living Allowance
- be a homeowner or renting privately with responsibility for maintaining the property.

Why use our Service?

We:

- carry out a survey of the repairs/improvements you need and get estimates of the cost
- check if you qualify for any funding for the work
- put you in touch with a reliable contractor
- monitor the repairs or improvements as they are carried out
- help at every stage until the repairs or improvement are finished
- point you to other Council services that may help you, such as welfare benefits advice.

What type of repairs and improvements does the Service cover?

The Service covers:

- general building repairs
- electrical rewiring
- central heating installations
- replacement bathrooms and kitchens
- roofing work
- · damp-proof course and dry rot treatment
- drainage repairs
- replacement windows, double glazing.

Under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 if you are in charge of a dog and it fouls on any land to which the public have access, you are responsible for cleaning it up. If you fail to clean it up immediately, you commit an offence and may receive a:

- Fixed penalty notice of £50.00
- Fine of up to £1000 if you are convicted in court.

The legislation states that, if you did not know your dog had fouled it is not a reasonable excuse and a fixed penalty notice can still be issued. Please consider this when walking your dog off the lead.

How you can help

Your Neighbourhood Team advises dog walkers to Pick Up or Pay Up however, in some cases this isn't enough! We need you to be our eyes to help stop dog mess on our streets and open spaces.

Help us catch the owner!

Dog fouling has been highlighted as a problem in this area and your Neighbourhood Team and Environmental Protection Team need your help to tackle it...

If you can supply information about who is responsible for not picking up dog mess please contact your Neighbourhood Team at

Centralwest.neighbourhoods@derby.gov.uk Information such as:

- Times the dog fouling is happening
- The place where the dog is fouling
- A description of the dog and the owner
- If the owner is using the car, the registration number
- The address of the owner if known

Your support, evidence and information will help Derby City Council to issue a fixed penalty notice (FPN) or fine. If you are willing to provide a witness statement identifying the perpetrator this increases the chance of issuing a Fixed Penalty Notice or fine.
