The response of the PACC family to this annual offering, which supports the United Church of Christ's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States, is truly heartwarming. Members of the church also have been very generous when there are special appeals for disaster relief. Earlier this fall we sent a check for \$660 to help with recovery from the earthquake in Pakistan.

### Chapel update

The Chapel painting party had a long but successful day priming most of the new room on October 23. Thanks to all who helped out. With some minor scheduling adjustments we are still hoping to have the Chapel useable for the Fair. ### **Report from Church Council**

At the Council of Deacons' October meeting the Rev. Paul Nickerson, MACUCC Associate Conference Minister for Evangelism and Church Vitality, made a presentation titled "Discerning Your Congregation's Future." After devoting much of our energy in the past few years to restructuring our governance, to the capital campaign and to talks about a potential merger, the Deacons are considering a process in which we all might participate to update this congregation's vision.

### **Report on the MBA Fall Meeting**

On Sunday afternoon, October 24, 2010, Margaret Bell and Judie and Dick Phelps attended the Fall Meeting of the Metropolitan Boston Association of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ at East Congregation Church, UCC, in Milton, MA. At the meeting, business of the Association was discussed and reports were received. Rev. Ken Baily, Moderator of the MBA, welcomed all in attendance as did Rev. Eric Marean, co-pastor of the Milton Church. Rev. Wendy Vander Hart, Associate Conference Minister, welcomed the assembly and reported on changes taking place in the MBA local churches. One church in transition is the Goodland Congregational Church, a Korean congregation, just beginning their ministry in West Medford.

Reports were also received from the MBA Treasurer, Just Peace Ministry, and City Mission Society. A testimonial was given by Rev. Karin Case, a newer Clergy, who spoke on the value of the Pastoral Excellence Program sponsored by the MBA and MACUCC. This program reaches all clergy, new and seasoned, providing them with professional development and area discussions to assist them in their ministry. The Offering of the afternoon went to the Sustaining Pastoral Excellence Endowment Campaign of the Massachusetts Conference which sponsors these programs.

Following the business meeting, the delegates, clergy, and visitors moved to the Sanctuary of the church for a program on the new songbook of the UCC, "Sing! Prayer and Praise". The workshop included singing several of the new songs from the songbook, which some may define as contemporary Christian music, but which the UCC would rather have defined as songs that support the theology and beliefs of the UCC and its members. It is the first time that the UCC has published a songbook of this type. Those in attendance were inspired by the music and joy that came from singing Christian songs. Branden Grimmett, Organist at the First Congregational Church of Somerville, who served on the committee that published the songbook for the UCC, led the workshop. He told of the development of the songbook, and responded to a question and answer session concerning music in our Worship.

The Fall Meeting closed with communion and a blessing.

### Get your oranges and grapefruit

PACC again will be ordering delicious oranges and pink grapefruit as a fund raising project in December 2010 and March 2011. The oranges come about 35-40 to a box, and in December will be seedless navels (very juicy and sweet; usually one orange will fill a 6 oz. glass), and in March will be temples (a few seeds, easily peeled). The grapefruit come about 20 to a box, and will be pink both times. They are \$28 per box, \$14 a half box... and, yes, you may buy 1/2 box of each, or 1-1/2 boxes, or... Although the orchard went up in price, and thus we have had to also, it is still about the same price as the grocery store on a per-pound basis, and a far better price than the gift catalogs. They make good gifts for others and good healthy eating for yourselves. If you are interested, please pick up a form from the table in the narthex, fill it out and return to me (or to Kathy in the office) with a check or cash fruit by December 5 for delivery on December 11. The orchard will not ship the fruit if they are unhappy with the quality for any reason, so no checks will be cashed until the fruit arrives. Thank you.
