a.) The proposed activity would...

Enable the general public to visit an important historical and ecological national monument that has been relatively inaccessible over the last 100 years.

b.) To accomplish this activity we would

Visit all accessible locations on Midway and lecture on the conservation of the wildlife, and the roll that Midway plays for seabirds and other marine life. Visitors will also directly contribute to habitat restoration by removing beach debris and invasive species, and planting native grasses in accordance with USFWS and the Biotech administrator at the monument. All of activities will be documented through writing, video and photography, and then presented upon return at at libraries, universities, and other public viewings. More specifically, documentation on behalf of Wildlife and Nature Travel will be published on WANT's website to raise awareness for the protection of Seabirds and other endemic wildlife residing on Midway, including a call to action to reduce ocean debris.

c.) This activity would help the Monument by ...

generating public awareness of Midway's unique and special habitat, so that they have a greater understanding and incentive to call for and support public and private funding necessary to

preserve and maintain the monument for future generations. Our activities would also help the monument by providing labor at no charge for habitat restoration on the island.

Other information or background: At Wildlife and Nature Travel, we are a small conservation oriented travel company who focuses on unique destinations with rare and endemic wildlife. We attempt to run all of our tours with sustainable and responsible tourism in mind, and take a multidisciplinary approach to tackling conservation issues by providing educational lectures on our tours that tie in the history, economy, and culture to the state of the environment of our destinations. This approach not only generally results in financial and public support of the areas we visit through donations, but it has a pay it forward affect by motivating our passengers to take their experiences home and share them with friends, family, co-workers, etc.

6 Purpose/Need/Scope *State purpose of proposed activities:*

The purpose of our swimming and snorkling proposed activities will provide the most indepth and well rounded experience of all the facets of Midway, such as observing the unique Marine-life that is able to thrive due to the relative protection of the lagoon and lack of fishing pressures.

7. Answer the Findings below by providing information that you believe will assist the Co-Trustees in determining how your proposed activities are compatible with the conservation and management of the natural, historic, and cultural resources of the Monument:

The Findings are as follows:

a. How can the activity be conducted with adequate safeguards for the cultural, natural and historic resources and ecological integrity of the Monument?

Prior to visiting the Monument, our guides will be fully literate in the rules and regulations of Midway though reviewing published documents and communicating with the Monument's Visitor Services Manager. Then prior to actually visiting the Monument, our passengers will be fully educated on the history and importance of the Monument, and the rules designated for the Monument's protection and conservation.

b. How will the activity be conducted in a manner compatible with the management direction of this proclamation, considering the extent to which the conduct of the activity may diminish or enhance Monument cultural, natural and historic resources, qualities, and ecological integrity, any indirect, secondary, or cumulative effects of the activity, and the duration of such effects?

Once the visitors have completed an orientation of Midway and its ecological and historical resouces, visitors will enhance the monument by participating in several habitat restoration sessions, as well as completing photographic documentation of the current state of the monument for public dissemination, such as presentations at libraries and Michigan State University Park, Recreation, and Tourism classes.

c. Is there a practicable alternative to conducting the activity within the Monument? If not, explain why your activities must be conducted in the Monument.

Due to the monument's location and unique wildlife, there is no other practical alternative that could subsitute for such an experience. For example, rather than visiting the Monument, in order to view the Short-tailed Albatross, Monk Seal, Spinner Dolphins,

one would have to travel to Japan, Hawaii, and Mexico, a feat that would not only be cost prohibitive and impractical.

d. How does the end value of the activity outweigh its adverse impacts on Monument cultural, natural and historic resources, qualities, and ecological integrity?

The monument will receive hands on habitat restoration, plus public documentation and exposure that will lead to future conservation efforts and greater public awareness of its importance and need for preservation.

e. Explain how the duration of the activity is no longer than necessary to achieve its stated purpose.

Due to flight schedules and the size of the monument, the amount of time scheduled for this visit allows us just enough time to properly document, through observation and photography, all historical, natural, and cultural aspects of the island.

f. Provide information demonstrating that you are qualified to conduct and complete the activity and mitigate any potential impacts resulting from its conduct.

Myself and Akos have been guiding trips all over the world in locations (i.e. Antarctica) that have extremely strict requirements for human codes of conduct on shore and with wildlife, such as maintaining a 5 meter distance between yourself and the wildlife. We have worked in both large and small groups, and are familiar with general public handling requirements as well as mitigating and potential forms of conflict.

g. Provide information demonstrating that you have adequate financial resources available to conduct and complete the activity and mitigate any potential impacts resulting from its conduct.

Wildlife and Nature Travel has an insurance policy and private funding to support and compensate any potential impacts resulting from the improper conduct of itself, its affiliates or its passengers.

h. Explain how your methods and procedures are appropriate to achieve the proposed activity's goals in relation to their impacts to Monument cultural, natural and historic resources, qualities, and ecological integrity.

Our company's premise is to promote sustainable tourism policies no matter what location in the world that we travel. We accomplish this by operating (and developing if nothing substantial exists) within the historical, cultural and political framework and

regulations for each location. We also strive to work with local operators, rather than giant corporations, to ensure that they receive the greatest impact from our visit. Our passengers are thoroughly informed of any and all policies, rules and requirements for traveling to these destinations, and our tour leaders are extremely well experienced in conducting such trips and conservation projects associated with them.
