Court rejects case against election law AUSTIN - A three-judge panel of the U.S. Fifth Cir Oct. 3 rejected a case chal lenging the constitutionality of a 2011 Texas election law faulating deputy voter reg egulating deputy voter res istrars.
In a 2-1 ruling, the majority of the panel said the plaintiffs Voting for America
Inc., Brad Richey, Penelope Inc., Brad Richey, Penelop
McFadden and Project Vot Inc. "have not made a clea showing" that certain provi sions of the law violate thei First Amendment rights o are preempted by the federa Voting Rights Act
Plaintiffs challenged thes five points in the state elec tion law:
(1) Prohibition of non state residents from servin as volunteer deputy registrar (2) Prohibition of a vol unteer deputy registrar from serving as such in more tha one county;
(3) A compensation pro vision;
(4) Prohibition from pho ocopying or scanning vote egistration application ubmitted to a deputy vote egistrar but not yet delivere o the county registrar; and (5) Prohibition of voter deputy registrars from send ng completed voter regis ration applications via U.S mail.
The appellate court's rul ing reversed a lower cour uling and ordered that the case be sent back to the dis rict court level for furthe proceedings. Fifth Circuit Judge W. Eugene Davis dis

Charleston, S.C., was the setting for Edgar Allan Poe's "kingdom by the sea" where his child bride, the "beautiful Annabel Lee," lived and died, and for his horror story, "The Gold Bug."
