Role of the Courtroom Observer

Each team participating in CRF's Mock Trial Program is required to designate a person to serve as an official Courtroom Observer.

The general rule is that nothing in the courtroom should be touched or moved by Mock Trial participants.

The Observer's responsibilities include:

Ι,

- Checking the status of the courtroom before and after each trial to ensure that all furniture and courtroom items are replaced to their original positions and conditions; and
- Watching for proper treatment of courtroom by participants and spectators during the trial.

The Observer's responsibilities DO NOT include watching for rule or procedural violations.

Every Courtroom Observer must complete the following checklist and return it to the Presider at the end of every trial.
