#### **HCI Student on National Stage**

Grade 12 student Dallas Stadnyk, from Humboldt Collegiate Institute, competed in the Provincial Skills competition on April 10-11 in Prince Albert. The competition consisted of secondary (high school students) and post-secondary groups competing in 42 different trade related competitions. For the Provincial Competition, Dallas was given a blueprint and a pile of lumber and eight hours to build the required pergola bench. Dallas competed his project well under the allotted time requirements and was presented with the gold medal in secondary carpentry at the evening's awards ceremony. This was the second consecutive year Dallas was awarded this particular award.

The gold secured Dallas's spot on the provincial team as Saskatchewan's representative in secondary carpentry for a second straight year. Last year Dallas travelled to Vancouver as Saskatchewan's representative and was able to finish 5<sup>th</sup> in the Skills Canada National Competition. He now had a year of experience and understood the context of the competition and was hoping to improve his standing from the previous year.

This year Dallas travelled to Toronto to compete in the National Skills Competition was held at the International Centre June 4-8. The venue once again housed the 42 different competition areas and had 20,000 visitors over the two days of intense competition. Also there were several VIP guests including Honourable Jason

Kenney, Minister of Employment and Social Development; Bryan Baeumler of "House of Bryan"; and "Disaster DIY", and Paul LaFrance of "Decked Out".



The next two days involved 12 hours of intense blueprint reading and fabrication. Dallas led the pack at the end of the first competition day framing and sheeting his floor and walls. The second day of competition started with another strong push by Dallas which went right till the last seconds of competition where Dallas secured his final piece of trim on the window. After looking around the competition floor we discovered Dallas was the only competitor to complete his project. It was thought that he would possibly be in the running for a medal assuming he kept his mistakes to a minimum. Following the competition a number of judges take measurements and assess each competitor's ability to follow the blueprints as required by the competition.

The final results of the competition were revealed the following afternoon at an extremely high energy closing ceremony. Competition after competition was called up and the bronze, silver, and gold medal winners were called out by province and name followed by a loud cheering from the crowd of approximately 2,000. The carpentry competition for students was announced and Dallas took this place on the podium and received his bronze medal.

This was an extremely rewarding for a student who has worked hard in the Humboldt Collegiate Institute Industrial Art and Carpentry classes and also participated in the Extracurricular Skills program offered at Humboldt Collegiate lead by Brian Hinz. Dallas is a grade 12 student planning on pursuing carpentry after high school and is focused on obtaining a journeyperson's certificate. He is also hoping he has another opportunity to compete in the Provincial and possibly National Skills competition in the following years as a post-secondary student.

As a large group we gathered to watch Delvena and Judy make fried bannock which we all enjoyed with homemade raspberry jam that the grade 2/3 students made during their Pioneer Unit. We also enjoyed baked bannock in the afternoon that Roseann made for us just to taste the difference between the 2 types.

We really enjoyed listening to our elder speak about when she was young and the significance of Aboriginal Day for all Canadian people. We all learned a song in Salteaux as well a few common words in Salteaux.

Delvena was very thankful to all of us for organizing a day like this, and thought it was long overdue. She did say it is so important for us to do this as we all exist and live together, and to live in harmony we all must understand each other's culture better. She hopes we will continue to do this every year.
