RE: TSSAA Membership Dues and Catastrophic Insurance

The following information contains:

- 1. Memo in regard to membership dues and catastrophic insurance

- 3. 2014-15 TSSAA Membership Invoice The purpose of the 2014-15 TSSAA Membership Invoice is to allow you to return one form regarding the fees at the beginning of the school year involving your membership and to submit the necessary forms to get the year started off in a good manner for all of us.

Please be aware that according to Article I, Section 2 of the TSSAA Bylaws membership dues must be paid no later than September 1. There is a \$5 per business day late fee charged to any school that fails to pay their membership dues by September 1.

With this in mind, we would like to call your attention to a couple of critical points in the information:

1. You must submit the TSSAA Coaches Registration Form. Please remember that all classified employees serving as coaches and non-faculty coaches must be listed in order for insurance coverage to apply to them and to the student-athletes under their supervision. You <u>must</u> return the TSSAA Coaches Registration Form and fee (if applicable) in order to receive your TSSAA ID Cards and TSSAA Championship Event Cards.

Non-Faculty Coaches and Classified Employees are now required to complete the NFHS "Fundamentals of Coaching" and "First Aid, Health, and Safety for Coaches" **prior** to coaching. Coaches who have completed the TSSAA Online Coaches Training and passed the ASEP Coaches Education courses (Coaching Principles and Sport First Aid) prior to May 15, 2013 are not required to complete the new NFHS courses

2. This year we are publishing the TSSAA Directory. In order for your school and coaches to be listed, you must complete and submit the TSSAA Directory Form and submit it to our office via fax: (615) 889-0544 by August 31, 2014.

- 3. TIAAA/NIAAA Membership Dues There is a place on the Invoice for your school to join the Tennessee Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association and the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association. See the attached flyer, and visit tiaaa.org or niaaa.org for more information about these organizations.
- **4.** Catastrophic insurance assessment for football playing schools (\$5.00 per player) is required. The total number of players on your eligibility list is the determining factor in submitting this information.
- 5. Rulebook Orders Please be aware that a rulebook in each of the sports listed will be sent to your school at no cost as part of your membership fee. Each year we receive requests from member schools for additional rulebooks for other coaches. If you order additional rulebooks, they will be mailed to you prior to the beginning of the season.
- **6.** The most important part As you review our bylaws, there are many statements in regard to the most important part. It could easily be argued that the most critical statement in our bylaws is Article I, Section 7, which states:

The principal of each school, in all matters pertaining to the athletic relations of his/her school, is responsible to this Association. Administrators must realize that they have more responsibilities than the general public to understand the purpose of high school athletics and the principles behind the TSSAA rules, and they must maintain that level of understanding and purpose when dealing with the general public and students. The principal shall exercise control over all finances, the scheduling of contests, and all other matters involved in the management of the school's athletic program. Any school whose athletic program is managed by a non-school group shall not be eligible to hold membership in TSSAA.

We are an organization of schools with administrators in charge of the athletic programs of all member schools. Please make certain that the Membership Invoice is signed and dated by the principal of the school.

The 2014-15 TSSAA Membership Invoice and all required forms should be submitted by mail along with your check.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES WHO ARE COACHING AND NON-FACULTY COACHES

(Please read carefully!!)

Before submitting your coaches, please be reminded that all coaches will fall under one of the following categories:

- 1. Full-time employee (a minimum of 100 school days) of a board of education with a Tennessee state teaching license or the equivalent.
- 2. Retired educator (five or more years' experience) with a valid Tennessee state teaching license or the equivalent.
- 3. Non-faculty coach - Anyone approved by the principal, superintendent, and/or local board of education in the normal course of employment procedures in accordance with applicable state law. All non-faculty coaches shall be submitted to the state office annually. Use of a non-faculty coach who has not met all the requirements or who has not been submitted to the state office shall result in a fine of \$500.00.
- 4. Classified Employee any individual employed by a member school or school system in a position that does not require a teaching license or the equivalent. The use of classified employees as coaches is subject to the following restrictions:
 - a. The classified employee must be employed 30 hours or more per week in a non-coaching position and may not be an independent contractor or an employee of an independent contractor;
 - b. Although not counted as a non-faculty coach, he/she must be submitted to the state office annually and meet all requirements listed below.

Use of a classified employee coach who does not meet all the requirements listed in the TSSAA Bylaws or who has not been submitted to the state office shall result in a fine of \$500.00.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1.

Q. Are student teachers considered non-faculty coaches?

A. If he/she is currently student teaching, he/she is allowed to do whatever his/her supervising teacher (college professor in charge) allows him/her to do as part of his/her total educational experience. He/She would not be considered non-faculty while he/she is student teaching.

Q. Are retired educators considered non-faculty coaches?

A. No.

3.

Q. Do non-faculty cheerleading coaches have to be registered with TSSAA?

A. Yes. However, it is not necessary for you to pay for non-faculty cheerleading coaches. We only need the names for insurance purposes. Non-faculty cheerleading coaches do not have to complete the NFHS Courses. Also, non-faculty cheerleading coaches must attend the Cheerleading Rules Meeting each year.

Q. Can I register a non-faculty coach after I have submitted my Non-Faculty Coaches Registration Form for the year?

A. Yes. Once they have been approved by the principal, superintendent, and/or local board of education, they can be submitted to our office on school letterhead, signed by the principal or by submitting another Non-Faculty Coaches Registration Form which can be found on our website under Forms. Also, the registration fee of \$50.00 per coach must be submitted as well.
