

NATIONAL INDICATOR FRATERNITY APPLICATION FORM

Umpires that meet the following requirements can be nominated for the National Indicator Fraternity located in the National ASA Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

A. EXPERIENCE

1. Must have umpired or served as a National Championship Umpire-In-Chief in at least three (3) National Championships which could include the Interservice competition, or the National Team Festival.
2. Attended an ASA Advanced Umpire School with two (2) of the above. (effective 1998).
3. The applicant must have been an ASA registered umpire for at least seven (7) years, but does not have to be currently active.

B. APPROVAL

The local association commissioner and the National Umpire Staff member within the umpire s region must approve the applicant.

NOTE: The Commissioner or National Umpire Staff member should not make the nomination if item (1), (2), or (3) under experience are not achieved.

C. APPLICATION FORM

1. Application forms may be obtained from your local association UIC, your National Staff Member in their region, or from:

2. Only current application forms will be accepted.
3. The applicant, the N.U.S. member in their region and the local association Commissioner must sign the form.
4. Application forms, which do not have the signature of your local association Commissioner and the N.U.S. member in their region, will be returned with the application fee.

D. APPLICATION FEE

A one-time nonrefundable fee of \$15.00 must accompany the application. Make check payable to the AMATEUR SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION.

E. PHOTOS

Applications must have three (3) passport size photos attached.

F. APPLICATION DEADLINE

1. Applications can be submitted at any time of the year for consideration, and if approved, membership materials will be mailed at that time.
2. Applications must be received by December 1st of each year in order for your name to be placed permanently in the National Softball Hall of Fame for that year and will be included yearly in the Umpire Case Book.
3. Incomplete or unqualified applications will be returned with the application fee.
