This summer, you can sign up for one of two different themed writing camp experiences.

Ages 8-10: What's your superpower?

Is it a bird? Is it a plane? No, it's a super hero—of your design! This creative camp will offer to writers in grades 3-5 the chance to bring to life heroes and heroines with powers and abilities far beyond those of mere mortals. Stretching creativity farther as far as their imaginations can reach—they will learn to develop seemingly ordinary or unlikely characters with hidden superpowers. These superheroes will be put right in the thick of action-packed plots where they vanquish nasty villains. Writers in this camp will create and illustrate a two-page comic strip, of 18 frames or less, that tells an original triumphant tale that is sure to astound readers.

Ages II-I4: So you want to be an author?

This camp for older writers, aged 11-14, is designed to teach more advanced writers strategies that published authors use to develop character, setting and plot. By researching story ideas for setting, character, historical accuracy or time period, authors will learn to write with more accuracy and authenticity. This camp will focus how writers develop ideas through research beyond a search engine, and also how to apply a variety of writing strategies that work! Young writers will be able to choose genre and a portion of their piece to create a group anthology.
