The 3rd Grade Field Trip Written by Lily Garcia 3rd Grader in Mrs. McCarty's Class



Good afternoon folks, this is Lily Garcia. On Tuesday, October 3, 2012 every third grader from Oak Grove School went to Greenbelt Forest Preserve to study ecosystems. The third graders went on the old bus. "We were learning about ecosystems and looking for animal habitats," said Ella Lawrence.



The first thing the students did was make a food chain using taxidermic animals and plants. Each group had a different habitat. They discussed the role of each thing (consumer, producer, scavenger, and/or decomposer). They shared their findings with the other students. The students loved looking at the taxidermic animals.

The next activity was to go on a nature walk. They observed animals and nonliving things. Madison Jurczyk said, "I thought that it was very cool to explore plants and insects and I thought the plants were very pretty." The students determined each item's category (consumer, food, producer, decomposer, and/or shelter.) They worked with partners. They recorded things they saw on a sheet.





After that activity the students made a Web of Life. Everyone got a card of a plant or animal. They

used string to make a food web. They pulled the string tight. They could feel the vibration of the string if someone pulled it. If a plant or animal let go of the string the ecosystem would break down, just like in real life.

Overall it was a fun day filled with learning. "I liked making food webs. I also liked walking through the tall grass." said Andrew Sorensen. The third graders want to thank the parents who volunteered to go with them. They helped make the day a huge success.
