TRYOUT GUIDELINES

- Hair pulled back, we must see your face (pony tails)
- No gum, acrylic nails, or jewelry
- Candidates need to wear a plain white form fitted tee or tank and dark colored shorts.
- Comfortable lace up shoes should be worn at all times.

TRYOUT CLINICS, PROCEDURES AND OBJECTIVES

- The candidates will be given a number which they should wear the two days of tryouts.
- Candidates will go over: Stunting, Jumps, Cheer, Tumbling (if applicable) and a Dance.
- Candidates can choose what stunt position you want to tryout for (flyer, base or backspot).
 Coaches may move you during tryouts to a position they think will be a better fit.
- A panel of judges, cheer coaches, and those teaching the clinic are present at the tryouts.
- We are looking to select squad members that demonstrate strong skills in the following areas:

Tumbling Motion Technique Jumps Stunting Dance Vocal Flexibility Attitude Spirit Energy / Enthusiasm

*A straight to extension cradle is required to make the varsity team (As a flyer, base or backspot)

ELIGIBILITY

- Candidate must have a 2.5 GPA at the end of the 3rd quarter to tryout. (3rd quarter or cumulative)
- Cannot have more than one 'F' in a class, and no NG's (an 'I' or a 'NG' is calculated as an 'F')
- Candidate must have AND maintain a 2.5 GPA for each quarter during the school year or they will be removed from the squad. There is NO probationary period! This becomes effective immediately (this means that candidates who make the squad must have a 2.5 GPA for 4th quarter).
- Candidate must attend pre tryout meeting with at least one parent on April 13th.
- Candidates must have all required documents signed by a parent/guardian in order to participate.
- Candidates must be in good health and must work to maintain good health in order to cheer.

SQUADS

Summit Academy High School has a JV (Freshman, Sophomores and Juniors) and a Varsity team (Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors). There will be a competition team made up of the Varsity team. JV cheerleaders wishing to tryout will be used as alternates and will be pulled up to the competition team as needed. The amount of cheerleaders is not set. Many factors go into how the team(s) is set up such as: number of girls, stunt groups, etc. Coaches reserve the right to move any cheerleader to varsity whenever needed. This includes games, performances and other cheer needs.

COMMITMENT

Participating in cheerleading is an exciting and fun experience. However, it requires a HUGE amount of time and commitment by all members, not only during the school year but the summer as well. As a member of the cheer squad you will be required to support all of the athletic teams at Summit Academy High School throughout the entire school year. This means in addition to practices you will be cheering 2 to 3 nights per week. If you are on Competition Team (Varsity), you could have as many as 3 maybe 4 nights during basketball season. Cheerleaders do more than cheer at games; they make posters, plan assemblies, and have other various responsibilities as they support the athletic teams at SAHS. You will also be required to attend two training camps and practices during the summer as well as all fundraisers. (Coaches may make exceptions on a case by case situation.) Any long term or recurring situations may cause dismissal from the squad. If you are going to participate on the cheer squad it is important to know and understand what kind of commitment will need to be made. Cheerleading is a team sport and we plan to stunt a lot. If there is just one person missing from practice it prevents the whole team from being able to stunt.

FINANCIAL COMMITMENT/FUNDRAISERS

-The *approximate* cost is \$330.00 for cheer camps, \$220.00 for uniform, \$70 participation fee, \$30 cheer fund fee and \$300.00 for optional items such as camp wear, bags, warm-ups. Additional costs may come up (pictures, secret sisters, dinners etc). These prices do not include competition. Comp team will be competing locally in December – February, and possibly going to Nationals in California in March. Local competition fees will cost about \$300 (clothing, music, comp entrance fees). And if we decide to go to Nationals it will be an additional \$800+ (flight, hotel, food, etc). We will have fundraising that will help offset the costs. (Bearbook and Mini cheer) If you work hard on the fundraisers provided, it is possible to earn all of the money due. Each cheerleader is responsible to contribute or fundraise \$30 for the cheer fund. This money will be used to fund the various needs of the program (treats, supplies, judges, and equipment.) All additional money raised will go toward the cheerleader's costs for uniforms, camp, etc. Here is payment break down and the due date:

Game scheduling will be handed out early so you can know when and where each game will be.

SUMMIT ACADEMY HIGH SCHOOL CHEERLEADING PHILOSOPHIES, EXPECTATIONS, AND GOALS

- 1) **ACADEMICS** A cheerleader's first responsibility is to his/her academic program. Participating in cheerleading should not compromise the education process. All cheerleaders must maintain a 2.5 GPA with no F's or NG's every quarter. Failure to meet grades will result in dismissal from the team. There will be no probation. Grades will be checked every other week to keep cheerleaders aware of their grades. There can be no F's or NG's allowed or you will not be allowed to cheer. It will be required to come to all practices and games to work on school work if grade check expectations are not met.
- 2) **RESPECT** Cheerleaders will be expected to respect and listen to coaches at all times. Cheerleaders will treat their team members, peers and teachers with the same respect.
- 3) **EFFORT** Cheerleaders will engage in cheering, dancing, tumbling, and stunting while on the squad. The Summit Academy High School cheer squad adopts and executes a comprehensive safety program including conditioning and effective-spotting techniques at all times. All cheerleaders are expected to stunt. Tumbling that is done at tryouts must be kept the whole year. Make sure your tumbling you tryout with can be done on hardwood and concrete (basketball and football games)
- 4) **PURPOSE** The PRIMARY FUNCTION of the cheerleading squad is to support interscholastic athletics and to promote school spirit in a positive way. Throughout the year the cheerleaders support events in the following sports: Football games (JV/Varsity), girls soccer, wrestling volleyball games, girls and boys basketball etc. Cheerleaders will also support during pep rallies, assemblies and other needed activities.
- 5) **COMPETITION** is secondary to promoting school activities. Cheerleaders should strive for excellence in cheerleading, dance, tumbling, and stunting techniques. All cheerleaders involved will be expected to give 100% effort to become their personal best.
- 6) **WORK** We realize that some students must maintain employment to participate in this organization, but their first obligation must be to cheer. Practices, fundraisers and performances may not be missed because of work. If they are missed, the athlete may not be able to participate in future performances.
- 7) **OTHER COMMITMENTS** Coaches are okay with students participating in other groups and organizations. Only if it doesn't conflict with the cheer schedule or affect the athlete's ability to stay alert in practices or games. Students are not allowed to miss practices, performances, fundraisers, etc. for outside groups. However, we support students who want to be involved with their school. If it is a SAHS team/club (soccer, tennis, debate etc) the athlete can be excused as long as there is enough notice (month in advance).
- 8) **ABSENCES** All excused absences must be cleared with coaches. Excused absences consist of:, extreme illness, death or funeral, weddings or school excused activity. Coaches must be given as much notice as possible if these events occur. Unexcused absences: work, appointments, social events, parties, etc.
- 9) **PROBATION/DISMISSAL** The coach will determine probation time. The member on probation may not dress or perform with the squad but must attend all games, practices and carry out all assignments. (Probation list is on "Honor code" sheet)
- 10) **INJURIES/SICKNESS** If a student becomes injured the advisor/coach needs to have a doctor's note in hand. This note needs to include a diagnosis, expected recovery time, and when the student will be back practicing at 100% in order to sit out at practices, performances, etc. Otherwise, the student will be expected to practice and perform at 100%. Remember, injured students are expected to attend practices and performances supporting their team, and depending on the severity of the injury, mark routines when able. If a student is ill they are still required to come to practice and watch. If they are too sick to sit and watch they must get a doctor's note.

Summit Academy Cheer Team Honor Code 2015-2016 School Year

Summit Academy cheer team members should demonstrate high standards of ethics and sportsmanship and promote the development of good character and other important life skills. All team members are expected to carry themselves in a manner which brings pride to Summit Academy High School.

All of the following will not be tolerated and are terms for automatic dismissal from the team:

- The involvement in and illegal/criminal activity (Drugs, alcohol etc)
- Failure to maintain a 2.5 at the end of each quarter. There is NO probationary period.
- No F's or NG's in any class at the end of each quarter.
- Cheating in school.
- Sexual harassment or hazing.

There are certain actions that will be cause for discipline. Discipline could include suspension from games, probation, and in certain cases dismissal from the team. The coaching staff and school administration will decide all disciplinary actions. The following is a non-comprehensive list of these actions:

- Receiving and 'F' or 'NG' on grade checks (every 2 weeks)
- Inappropriate behavior at games and other school functions (dealing with cheerleading or not)
- Disrespect to advisors, fellow squad members, staff or student body.
- Bullying or cyber bullying in or out of school. (text, twitter etc)
- Foul language or obscene gestures.

Team members are also required to do/maintain the following:

- 2.5 GPA. (each quarter)
- Respect for all religions, races, disabilities and backgrounds.
- Respect for others (no gossiping about team members)
- Should be positive leaders, set good examples, display a positive attitude and work to develop a sense of pride at all times.
- All expected behaviors are to be maintained on social networks sites.

To cheer at a game, a student must be in attendance at school on the day of the contest. Exceptions to the above rule would be a doctor appointment, a family or medical emergency, or extenuating circumstances. These exceptions require a note from the student's doctor (for appointments) or parent/guardian and the exceptions will be reviewed by the coach and the administration who will determine the eligibility of the student to participate.
