You are going to have the opportunity to create your own poetry portfolio. You will include a collection of poems that were written by yourself and published poets.

The contents of your portfolio are (in the following order):

- 1. Cover (must include a creative title and some sort of decoration or artwork)
- 2. Table of Contents (including page numbers)
- 3. Poetic vocabulary (including all of the terms on your handout, with personalized definitions and examples)
- 4. At least **5 published poems** by different poets in different forms
- 5. At least 3 poems written by you
- 6. At least 3 illustrations related to your selected poems
- 7. A back cover (no artwork necessary)
- 8. The scoring rubric

Additional Criteria:

- Make sure that your art work is neat, professional-looking, and has a unified theme
- Make sure that your portfolio is neat and pleasing to the eye; fonts and illustrations are all high quality (no hastily-made drawings and hand-written titles)
