

IT'S A BEAUTIFUL SIGHT to stand on a mountaintop and look down into a valley. But it's a different perspective altogether when you're in that dark valley trying to get up to the mountaintop!

We have probably all had "valley experiences" or times of trouble and hardship. But it is possible to get out of those valleys. God wants us to live continually on the mountain-

top of His victory in Jesus Christ!

You have to come out of your valley if you're going to experience the abundant life God intends for you to have. God has provided the way for you to come out of the valley, but He's not going to do it *for* you.

You have to get yourself out of your valleys—the valleys of sin, past mistakes, financial despair, and sickness—by coming in line with God's Word. Then you have to make confessions based on what His Word says about your situation.

### **FAITH THAT RECEIVES**

The woman with the issue of blood in Mark chapter 5 blasted her way out of the valley of sickness by receiving the *dunamis*, or the power, of God by faith. She didn't know it, but she was using the same faith principles that Jesus gave us in Mark 11:23. In this scripture, Jesus taught us how to activate God's power to blast

away obstacles so we can walk out of any valley the enemy tries to put us in.

23 For verily I say unto you, That whosoever SHALL SAY

### **MARK 11:23**

unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but SHALL BELIEVE that those things which he SAITH shall come to pass; he SHALL HAVE whatsoever he SAITH.

The law of faith Jesus is talking about here is to believe in your heart what God says, confess it with your mouth, and then act on what you believe. Let's see exactly how the woman with the issue of blood obeyed this spiritual law.

What did this woman do when she heard about Jesus? She *said*, "I know what I'll do. I'll go to Jesus and touch the hem of His garment. And when I touch Jesus, I'm going to receive my healing" (Mark 5:28). She *said* it!

First, she *believed* in her heart that Jesus could heal her. Second, she *said* it with her mouth. Third, she *did* something about it. She went to Jesus and touched the hem of His garment in faith. And then she *received* what she had said was hers! (See Mark 5:25–34.) That's exactly what Jesus said to do in Mark 11:23!

The Bible says, "Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom. 10:17). Jesus is the living Word (John 1:1). So when this woman heard about Jesus, faith came to her.

In the same way, when we read or listen to the written Word, faith comes to us. That's the only way we can make our faith grow. We don't get more faith by praying for it. The Bible says God has given every person the measure of faith (Rom. 12:3). We don't have to get any more faith. We just need to *use* and *develop* the faith we already have!

### **DYNAMITE FAITH**

Faith in God's Word is like a blasting cap to a stick of dynamite. If you throw a stick of dynamite down on the ground and it doesn't have a blasting cap on it, nothing will happen. But once you put a blasting cap on that dynamite, watch out! If you throw it down and that blasting cap hits just right, that dynamite will ignite and explode!

# It's Your Choice!

Many people think they need to stay in their valley because *God* put them there. They think God is a mean Ruler looking down on the earth with a giant flyswatter in His hand, just looking for someone to hit. And every time someone does something wrong, He swats them and says, "Ha! I got you, buddy!" Many people picture God that way. But He's not that way at all!

The devil—the enemy—is the one who's mean! He tries to entangle us in his snares and bog us down in his valleys of defeat. He likes to keep us trapped in the shadows where we can't even see daylight because the mountains are so high.

THE DEVIL WILL HOLD YOU CAPTIVE IN HIS VALLEYS OF DEFEAT AS LONG AS YOU LET

**HIM.** You see, it's your choice. You can choose to keep walking in those valleys. In fact, you can be born again, filled with the Spirit, and Heaven-bound, and still live in the valley all your life.

But God doesn't want you to live in the valley of defeat. He wants you to act on His Word in faith, blast your way out of the valley, and live an abundant life in Jesus! Living for Jesus is the greatest life there is!

In the same way, when you use the measure of faith according to Mark 11:23, it becomes a blasting cap to the dynamite power of God. Just add that blasting cap of faith to God's power. It will blast you out of any valley the enemy tries to trap you in!

What happens if you hook up a bundle of dynamite sticks to a detonator, put the dynamite on a mountainside, and set off the charge? The blasting caps will ignite, and the explosion will blow a huge hole in that mountain!

That natural example of dynamite can help you understand how to operate the spiritual law

of faith. The power of God, which is like the power of a dynamite blast, is available to us. We just have to ignite it with our faith. We do that by believing God's Word in our hearts and confessing it with our mouths.

You *can* come out of any valley you may be in right now by blasting your way out with God's Word! There's no use for you to wallow in the muck and mire of sin, condemnation, poverty, or sickness! There's a way out of that mess!

I don't care if the devil has thrown all kinds of obstacles onto the path that leads out of the valley you're in. Jesus already told you in Mark 11:23, "Just believe in your heart and say to any problem or obstacle, 'Get out of my way!' and it will be removed." That's how to blast those obstacles out of your way so you can come out of *any* valley!

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


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YOU CAN'T REAP A

CROP—NATURALLY OR

SUPERNATURALLY—

WITHOUT sowing seed.

THERE IS A LAW of sowing and reaping in both the natural and the spiritual realms. And it's a law that works! Yet many believers have not realized and understood the importance of this biblical principle, especially in the area of finances.

We know we can receive our needs met by faith in god's word, just as we can receive healing or any other blessing found in god's word by faith in that word.

We could also be blessed materially through a manifestation of the Holy Ghost. Remember the widow woman in the Old Testament? God spoke to her through the prophet Elijah. And although there was a famine in the land, her oil cruse just kept pouring out oil and the meal barrel just kept giving her meal (1 Kings 17:16). That was just as good as money.

There are supernatural manifestations for us very often in the area of finances when we faithfully obey God and sow seed. These manifestations of the Holy Spirit are as *He* wills. We can't *make* them happen. However, whether there is a manifestation of the Holy Spirit or not, we always have the Word to act upon.

# **Another Side**

Yet there's another side to faith in God's Word for finances. You can't reap a crop—naturally or supernaturally—without sowing seed. You can't just go out into the backyard and say, "I'm going to pick some tomatoes," if you haven't planted any tomatoes! Or you can't say, "I'm going out into the field to pick cotton tomorrow," and expect to pick any cotton if the ground hasn't been prepared and the seed sown. If cotton hasn't been planted, you're not going to pick any cotton!

I think that folks often miss it in this area when it comes to faith for finances. They want God to bless them, all right, and it's amazing how He'll have mercy on them and help them sometimes. But oftentimes, they're trying to exercise faith principles to reap a crop when nothing has been planted!

FROM MY EXPERIENCE THROUGH-OUT MY MANY YEARS OF PREACHING FAITH, I THINK MORE PEOPLE FAIL WHEN IT COMES TO FAITH FOR FI-NANCES THAN ANYTHING ELSE. The reason is that they're trying to exercise faith for finances, but they haven't planted any seed.

### **LUKE 6:38**

**38** GIVE, and IT SHALL BE GIVEN UNTO YOU; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For WITH THE SAME MEASURE THAT YE METE WITHAL IT SHALL BE MEASURED TO YOU AGAIN.

You see, the Bible plainly says, "Give, and it will be given unto you. With the same measure with which you sow, it shall be measured back unto you." Jesus Himself said it.

Second Corinthians 9:6 says, "He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully." **IF YOU WANT A BOUNTIFUL CROP, YOU'VE GOT TO SOW BOUNTIFULLY.** 

So in your own life, just go ahead and obey the Bible in the area of finances. Pay your tithes and give offerings. Act on God's Word in faith and He will bless you, because He's faithful and true to His Word.

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# PREACHERS

THE RUGGED WILDERNESS of northeastern Nevada offers crystalline lakes, majestic mountains, and spectacular scenery. It's a place where the morning silence is broken by chirping birds, buzzing flies, and lowing cattle. It's also the place Bo Lowe, a 1994 Rhema Bible Training College grad, and his wife, Cathy, call home.

In the summer of '92, after seriously seeking the Lord, Bo had an encounter with Him on a lonely dirt road. Bo had loaded salt blocks for livestock in the back of his truck and was headed down the dusty road with a

broken heart. He thought God didn't care about him enough to talk to him the way He spoke to

Tears welled up and Bo couldn't see to drive.


He had to pull over. He reached for his Bible and it fell open to Psalm 32. There he read, "I will lead you and guide you. I'll watch over you. Do not be like the horse or the mule that have no understanding" (vv. 8-9).

Bo worked with horses and mules. He knew God had spoken specifically to him and given him direction for his life. And at that moment he also knew he was supposed to go to Rhema Bible Training College.

Shortly before Rhema classes began that fall, Bo and Cathy sold their milk cow to help with expenses, hitched up the horse

> trailer, and loaded up their possessions. Leaving the pristine countryside behind, they made the 1,500-mile cross-country trip to Broken Arrow.

> For Bo, moving to Oklahoma was like moving to a foreign country. He loved the rugged ranch life. He, Cathy, and their daughter Shawna lived in cow camps and followed the cattle as they grazed on the wide-open mountain ranges.





acres. With a Nevada buckaroo mindset, Bo thought they could just set up camp on the back side of Rhema's property and live there while he went to school. They even brought their horse so he could ride to class!

When the Lowes arrived at Rhema's suburban Tulsa campus, Bo's first thought was "Oh, no! What have I done?" Then he asked Cathy, "Now what do we do?"

### **DIVINE CONNECTION**

Discouraged, the Lowes stopped at a nearby gas station and Cathy used a pay phone to call the only contact they had. When a recording told her the number had been disconnected, her heart sank. But before she hung up, they heard a man behind them ask, "Are you Bo and Cathy Lowe?"

The man—the son of a Nevada buckaroo they had once met—happened to be driving by, saw their flat-brimmed buckaroo hats, and knew they had to be from Nevada. So instead of pitching their wall tent on Rhema's back 40, Bo, Cathy, and Shawna set up camp on the man's property until they got an RV. And he had pasture for their horse.

# SEND ME ANYWHERE, BUT PLEASE NOT NEVADA!

While Bo attended Rhema, he often told the Lord he would go anywhere-even Africa. The one place he didn't want to go was

The buckaroo culture is unique. These men and women think and live differently from city folks. But by the time Bo graduated, he knew he and Cathy had to go back to Nevada!

# **RAISING UP SICK ANIMALS**

"I never had any intention of preaching," says Bo. "I just thought I'd go back and work on the ranch. If someone asked me about Jesus, I could tell them. That was my whole plan."

The Lowes fell right back into ranch work. They started noticing animals that needed to be healed. No one told them they couldn't pray for animals, so they prayed for cows, horses, sheep, cats, dogs . . . you name it, and they prayed for it. And the animals were healed!

One time a cow had a difficult time giving birth and the calf had to be pulled out. As a result of the rough delivery, the cow became paralyzed. She couldn't get up and was lying flat on her side. Bo and Cathy laid hands on her, and about two weeks later she was up and walking—totally healed!

In another instance, a blind sheep named Priscilla received her sight after prayer. Then she was badly kicked by a horse. She was paralyzed, had a broken leg, and was bleeding from her mouth. After the Lowes prayed for her, she completely recovered within two weeks. Some time later their ranch manager, who had witnessed these healings, had a stroke and became paralyzed on one side. He had never been open to the Gospel. But when Bo and Cathy visited him in the hospital, he grabbed Cathy's hand and said, "I want what Priscilla got." The Lowes laid hands on him, and he later returned to the ranch without any paralysis!

# **GOING TO THE REMOTE PLACES**

There are very few churches in northeastern Nevada. Before Bo and Cathy came to Rhema, they drove three hours one way to attend church once a month!

God began dealing with the Lowes to bring the Word to ranch hands and people in small, remote Nevada towns. They decided to start in the mining town of Jarbidge.

When they got there, they learned that the town was going to hold a street festival called "Jarbidge Days." Vendors could buy space along the dirt road—the only road—that ran through town. Bo wanted to set up their wall tent as a church. But he was told that first he had to talk to Jack.

The Lowes found Jack at the bar in the Tired Devil Saloon. Bo said to him, "I'm a preacher of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I want to buy some street space to set up a tent and have cowboy church Sunday morning."

"You can set up right out there," said Jack.

"How much do we owe you?"

"Nothing," Jack replied. "You can't charge God."

The Lowes set up their tent during the festival and around 30 people showed up. That may sound like a small crowd, but at a later Sunday service, everyone who lived in Jarbidge except two people came to church!


# **CIRCUIT COWBOY PREACHERS**

The Lowes' outreach to small northern Nevada towns has expanded. Every week they travel to a different place to bring the Gospel to ranch communities. Their services are geared to ranch families and workers, which means church starts later in the morning so people can feed the animals and finish chores.

From their home in Jackpot (pop. 1,195), Bo and Cathy can drive to Jarbidge in two hours. The last Sunday of the month they make a 2 1/2-hour trek to Starr Valley. And twice a month they drive 4 1/2 hours to Owyhee (pop. 953) to hold services on the Duck Valley Indian Reservation, the most remote reservation in the U.S.

The Lowes don't plan to stop what they're doing. "I always tell people, 'I'm not a pastor. I'm all you have till one gets here,' " says Bo. "But it doesn't seem like anybody is coming."

Bo and Cathy are happy to crisscross northern Nevada to minister in these out-of-the-way places. God cares deeply for these people, and the Lowes are committed to bringing the Gospel to them.

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# Hope—The Missing Ingredient

**FAITH OPERATES** in the unseen realm. It is a spiritual force that we can't see, taste, touch, hear, or smell. So we must find another way to know more about this subject.

In my search to know more about faith, the Holy Spirit began to speak to me about the importance of hope. He said, "Faith is motivated by your hope; frustration is motivated by your problems." He further said, "My people are in frustration; they are not in faith." Then God said, "If

hoped for, and the evidence of things not seen." Since that's the case, I must first understand what hope is if I ever want to be a person who operates in faith. THE LORD THEN BEGAN TO SHOW ME THAT WITHOUT HOPE, MY FAITH HAS NOTHING TO GO AFTER.

Hope is the missing ingredient. Without it, we won't make the finish line. Hope is what our faith is running to obtain. Hope is our goals, our visions, and our dreams; it is the revelation of what God said

He would do for us. Faith, well-grounded in Bible hope, will go out to get whatever we need and bring it back to us. However, too many of us are trying to release faith

when faith has nothing to go after.

For the sake of illustration, think about a well-trained dog. One of his favorite games is "fetch." If you toss a ball, he takes off. The dog will run to the toy, grab it, and bring it back to you; and he will do this over and over and over. Hours, days, or months may pass, but as soon as you

let him know you are ready to throw, the dog comes!

Now think of it this way: The dog represents your faith (I call him "Faith Dog"), and the ball represents your hope. You need to take your hope (your dreams and God-given plans) and throw! Your faith then has something to go after. Don't be fooled, though. Faith will sit at your feet—just like a dog—until it has something to fetch. Faith cannot run after something that's not there!

So throw your hopes, visions, and God-given dreams out there. This will give your faith something to go after. We don't have to be consumed by our problems. It leads us only to frustration. Instead, we can choose to be consumed by hope. Then we'll be in faith, and through faith we'll see God's promises become a reality in our lives.

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

**EFFECTIVE PRAYER** involves boldness. There are many things we do not need to pray for—but it is all right to pray for boldness.

We do not need to pray for faith, because our faith is increased by feeding it on God's Word and exercising it. But the Bible does show us that we can pray for boldness.

Peter and John were bold when they used the Name of Jesus to minister to the lame man at the gate called Beautiful. They were bold when they proclaimed the Name of Jesus to the crowd that gathered. The Jewish authorities noticed their boldness and commanded them to preach and teach no more in the Name of Jesus (Acts 4:13, 18).

Being let go, they went to their own company and reported all the chief priests and elders had said to them. Then the whole company of believers lifted up their voice with one accord in prayer unto God.

### ACTS 4:29-30

**29** And now, Lord, behold their threatenings: and *grant unto thy* servants, that with all boldness they may speak thy word,

**30** By stretching forth thine hand to heal; and that signs and wonders may be done by the name of thy holy child Jesus.

That prayer was answered!

### **ACTS 4:31**

**31** And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with *boldness*.

Another New Testament example of someone seeking boldness is Paul. This apostle of faith asked the Church at Ephesus to pray for him "that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly, to make know the mystery of the gospel, for which I am

an ambassador in bonds: that therein I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak" (Eph. 6:19–20).

The Ephesians' prayer for Paul was a prayer of supplication.

### **BOLDNESS TO ACT**

We may not know what to pray for, but thank God, the Holy Spirit does. We need boldness to act on God's Word and on what His Spirit may say to us. I can sense the Spirit searching for those whom He can trust to pray and act with boldness. He needs them.

Many people have jobs and duties that prevent them from giving themselves wholeheartedly to intercession. Yet I have found that as we go about doing whatever we have to do, on the inside of us, we can be praying.

There are jobs where it would be very difficult for you to pray while working. So God would have to seek out someone else. But there are some jobs—particularly if you are not working with your mind but with your hands—where you could give yourself to prayer even while you're working.

Don't throw off that burden to pray when it comes. Be bold to act on it.

One day while I was still pastoring, I was driving along attending to some business and visiting people. Suddenly, I had an urge to pray for my younger brother. He was backslidden at the time and not walking with the Lord. An alarm went off within me.

So I went along praying on the inside, even while I was talking to other people. On the inside of me, something was reaching out to God on his behalf. I carried that thing around with me two or three days until it just lifted. I didn't know what it concerned.

Later on, in conversation, my brother said to me, "I'll tell you one thing. The Lord sure helped me the other day." At that time, he owned a ranch. He told me that a 5-gallon can of gasoline he was holding in his hand exploded. He was not the least bit hurt!

But three days before it happened, I was praying. I am satisfied if I had thrown that off and not yielded to it, my brother could have been severely burned and perhaps killed.

What if I hadn't prayed?

### **BOLDNESS BEFORE THE THRONE**

### ISAIAH 43:25-26

**25** I, even I, am he that blotteth out thy transgressions for mine own sake, and will not remember thy sins.

**26** Put me in remembrance: let us plead together: declare thou, that thou mayest be justified.

Here is a challenge from the covenant-keeping God to Israel. It is also a challenge to the Church. For if God kept His covenant with them, He will keep His covenant with us.

The believer has covenant rights in prayer, as well as other covenant rights.

Yet one outstanding problem defeats believers in their prayer life. When we come to God, we have a feeling of inferiority, a sense of sin consciousness, because we know we have failed. We have a guilt complex. And when we come into the presence of God, we don't know whether He hears us.

But look at what God said: "I, even I, am he that blotteth out thy transgressions for mine own sake, and will not remember thy sins" (Isa. 43:25).

Why did God say He would blot out our transgressions? He did it for His own sake. He wanted to bless us, and He couldn't without doing this.

When we know that God blotted out our sin—that He doesn't remember we ever did anything wrong—we can come to Him with confidence and faith. We lose sin consciousness and instead have Son consciousness!

We are sons of God. We are joint heirs with Jesus Christ. We are covenant people. We have a legal right—a gospel right, a family right—to enter the throne room.

When Jesus went into the presence of the Father, He didn't go in with just His head, leaving His little finger outside saying, "Oh, I'm embarrassed." No! He didn't have any condemnation in His little finger.

We are the Body of Christ. That means the Body can go into the presence of God the Father with the same confidence and assurance that the Head can. Boldly!  $\dot{\blacktriangledown}$

Jesus' prayers were always answered. As we pray according to His guidelines, we'll have better results.

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
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# TURNING STUMBLING BLOCKS INTO STEPPING-STONES

THE FAITH WALK is not a walk of ease. It's not always fun to endure life's problems. But James 1:4 tells us to let endurance run its full course. We would probably rather go through life on "flowery beds of ease." But that's not the way life works. We live in an imperfect world with imperfect people, and life is not going to be easy all the time.

We need to understand, however, that our faith won't grow without being tried and proven. In life, we will experience trials of our faith. But during those things we must "count it all joy" (James 1:2). The basis for faith is the Word of God, and the proof of faith comes from living a life of faith.

God never promised that the Christian life would be free of tests, trials, and adversity. But He did say in Isaiah 43:2, "When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee."

When we hold on to God in the waters of adversity, we have His promise that we're not going to drown. It doesn't matter if we can't swim, because the Lord is going to hold us up in that water.

Our Heavenly Father wants us to rely totally on Him. So many times we want to do everything in our own strength. We try to fix the situation.

Jesus said, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matt. 11:28). God wants us to trust Him completely. When we do, He is able to fix the situation.

### **UNSHAKEABLE FAITH**

We must base our entire life on our faith in our Heavenly Father. Everything around us may fall, but if we will hold on to His hand, He will hold us up in the midst of every storm.

The enemy goes about as a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour (1 Peter 5:8). He's trying to shake our trust and confidence in God. He's trying to get our eyes on our problems.

Now what do we do when life brings problems our way? What should be our response? There is a saying, "When life gives you lemons, make lemonade." Lemonade is pretty good—just add a little sugar to it and it's wonderful! So when life's problems come, we can go to God with them and let Him turn them around for good.

# CLIMB ON THOSE BUMPS!

That reminds me of a story about a little boy who was leading his sister up a mountain path. The way was not easy. Finally the little girl said, "Why, this isn't a path at all! It's too rocky and bumpy!" To this her brother replied, "Sis, the bumps are what you climb on!"

You may think, "Hey, I've had a whole lot of bumps in my life. Maybe I'm going to climb really high!" That may be the case, because the enemy loves to throw his biggest bumps in the paths of

those who he knows are going to be great successes for God.

So instead of allowing those bumps to become stumbling blocks, use them as stepping-stones! In my own life, I've always tried to take that attitude concerning problems. I say, "I won't let bumps cause me to stumble. I'm going to step higher and higher until I climb over the top of those bumps and obstacles."

God doesn't promise to remove every obstacle from our path. But He does promise to help us overcome them and climb higher in spite of them.

Difficulties can help us climb higher if we'll use them as stepping-stones. Too often, though, we only want to complain about them. Sometimes we may try to kick them out of the way or jump

over them. Or more often, we try to go around them. But when we finally get around one, there's sure to be another bump in our path.

When facing these bumps, it's easy to want to turn around and go another way. But we don't have to quit or give up, because we can turn stumbling blocks into stepping-stones!

When circumstances come, I encourage you to get up on those stones and say, "I'm more than a conqueror through Christ Jesus" (Rom. 8:37). "Greater is He that is in me than he that is in the world" (1 John 4:4).

When you get to the next stone, your body might be racked with pain or weakened by a serious disease. But get up on that

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stone and say, "My God has delivered me. He has healed me. By His stripes I am healed" (Ps. 34:19; 1 Peter 2:24). If fear is surrounding you, get on that stone and say, "God has not given me a spirit of fear but of power, love, and a sound mind" (2 Tim. 1:7).

Whatever the circumstance, find a promise in the Word concerning your situation. Then confront the problem and say, "I cannot go under for going over" (Mark 4:35). "I am standing on the Rock—the Rock Christ Jesus—and He will put me over!" (2 Tim. 2:19 TLB).

This is how we climb over adversity. Trials come to every one of us. And they don't just come one time-they keep

Asking "why" when tests and trials come only hinders us from defeating those trials and walking in victory. And continuing to ask "why" will defeat us every time.

Maybe you can't get over the circumstances of life because you've been asking, "Why, God? Why me? I've stood on Your Word. I've prayed. I've lived life as well as I know how. Why is this happening to me?"

The Lord wants us to stop questioning Him and start trusting Him. He will bring us through every situation. So let's stop spending time questioning the circumstances. Instead, let's use those circumstances as bumps we can climb on.

Start turning your stumbling blocks into stepping-stones. Find scriptures that deal with whatever circumstances you are facing. Then begin to "step" on each stone with the Word until you are victorious in Christ. Start praising the Lord for victory over those stumbling blocks. Use them as stepping-stones and climb to the place God has destined for you!♥

**THIS MONTH** we set aside one Sunday to honor mothers. As I have said previously, I came into this world on Mother's Day. I often told my mom that I would never be able to top that gift to her. She would just grin, laugh, and have a witty comeback as only my mother could.

My mother passed away in February of 2011 at the ripe age of 95. This will be the fifth year that I have been unable to express my appreciation to her for her life, love, and example. As I reflected on my years with her, I began to realize the influence she had on my life.

Of course, she taught me many things. One thing she consistently pounded into me was, "Lynette, keep your head high and look people in the eye." She knew that two characteristics of low self-esteem were walking with your head down and avoiding direct eye contact. She wanted her children to know that with God's help, we would always be successful in life and could stand tall. When she was being photographed, I would be amused to hear the photographer constantly say, "Lower your head a little." She always held her head high.

My mother taught me more by example than by instruction. Through observing her, I learned to be a caretaker. Mother was always there to take care of any family member who was sick. We knew that her potato soup was just the right antidote for any ailment. It seemed like that soup started the healing process. And she didn't just open a can—she made the soup "from scratch," as she would say. It had the right ingredients to settle every symptom.

My mother taught me to be a protector. Her brother and other family members died in a storm when I was very young. Consequently, whenever a storm arose, she would be concerned

for her family's safety.
Since we did not always live in a sturdily built house, when a storm came (and they seemed to usually come in the middle of the night!), she would drag me out of bed and take me to our neighbor's storm cellar.

My mother taught me the

importance of preparing meals for my family. She loved to cook. Nothing fancy—just country cooking. Biscuits and gravy was her breakfast specialty. She always presented a beautiful table. Whether it was for family or

friends, you would have thought she was hosting the president. We sat down to a tablecloth, placemats, cloth napkins, and unique china. I never saw a paper plate or a cooking pot on her table.

Did she sit down and instruct me in cooking and table-setting techniques? Absolutely not. However, I watched her prepare food time and time again, and I desired to follow her example. Therefore, I began to ask her what I could do to help in the kitchen. That is when she began instructing me.

My mother showed me by example the importance of taking time daily with the Lord. Each morning I would find her reading her Bible and praying. Whatever was going on in our lives, she assured us that God was in control and would take care of it all. I saw the importance of giving to God as I observed her each week write out the family tithe and offering checks.

My mother showed me by example how to be a ministry partner. I observed her always standing beside my dad and being just as committed to the ministry as he was. She never complained of the sacrifices required. When I was just an infant, Dad left the church he was pastoring to start a new church in South Texas. He told my mom, "Can up all the food you possibly can. At least we won't starve while starting a church." (In those years you did not freeze food—you canned it.) They often laughed as they reflected on those memories.

This brings me to my last points: my mother never lost her sense of humor, nor did she consider herself old. She would always say, "If you want to stay young, hang around young people." She'd mention that when she was around 80, someone asked for her identification to make sure she qualified for the senior citizen discount. Obviously, humor and not dwelling on her age kept her thinking young, even in her 90s.

I encourage you to take time to do something special for your mother. Express your gratitude for all she has done for you. Don't wait until it's too late for her to hear your kind words.
