OBITUARIES DINO G. CIOCCI, 40TH RTT (1956)



Dino G. Ciocci, 81, of Wilbraham, passed away peacefully at home on Friday evening, March 8, 2013 surrounded by his loving family. Dino, a son of the late Bernardino and Theresa (Silveri) Ciocci was born in Ludlow on April 15, 1931.

Raised in Ludlow, he graduated from Ludlow High School in 1949 and received his Criminal Justice Degree from Holyoke Community College. He was activated in the Air Force in 1961 while he was a member of the Air National Guard and was in France during the Berlin Crises.

Dino was a member of the 40th RTT at the state police academy graduating in 1956. He was employed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts as a State Police

Officer for 23 years retiring with the rank of Staff Sergeant in 1979 after serving in Troops B, C, and E and as a Supervisor of the B and C Troop Forensics Labs. After retirement he worked as supervisor for Guthrie Fence in the guard rail division. He was also a professional photographer for 25 years. He was a communicant of St. Cecilia's Church and a member of the Ludlow Knights of Columbus, American Legion, American Association of State Troopers, Massachusetts Former State Police Association, Retired Troopers Association, and was an Honorary Chief of the Western Massachusetts Police Chiefs Association. Dino was an assistant editor of the FMSTA newsletter.

Dino enjoyed photography and fishing. Dino is survived by his wife of 57 years, Diva (Bravi) Ciocci; a daughter, Sandra Ciocci of Mansfield, MA; a son, Dean Ciocci of Dayville, CT; a brother, Henry Ciocci and his wife Dorothy of Yarmouthport, MA; a sister, Evelyn Ratliff of Trinity, FL; three beloved grandchildren, Kristen, Kendra, and Evan; a sister-in-law, Frances Ganguzza and her husband Joseph of Mount Arlington, NJ; and many nieces and nephews.






