Turabian Style: Sample Footnotes and Bibliographical Entries (6th ed.)

Footnotes or Endnotes

In the text, the note reference follows the passage to which it refers and is marked with an arabic numeral typed slightly above the line (superscript). Notes are arranged numerically at the foot (footnotes) of the page or at the end (endnotes) of the essay, article, or book. Notes include complete bibliographic information when cited for the first time.

Bibliography

Lists only the sources used in writing the paper. Entries are arranged alphabetically by author's surname and include complete bibliographic information.
