## **ORDINANCE ADOPTING COMPREHENSIVE PLAN** (Smart Growth)

#### TO THE MANITOWOC COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, Manitowoc County approved a contract on June 21, 2007 for a project under which the Bay-Lake Regional Planning Commission would prepare a multi-jurisdictional Comprehensive Plan for Manitowoc County pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.1001; and
WHEREAS, the project included public participation at every stage in the preparation of the Comprehensive Plan, provided for wide distribution of the proposed elements of the Comprehensive Plan, provided an opportunity for written comments from the public, and provided for the county to respond to those comments; and
WHEREAS, the Planning and Park Commission, after providing the required notice, held a public hearing seeking public comment on the proposed Manitowoc County 20-Year Comprehensive Plan, consisting of Volume I: County Plan and Volume II: Manitowoc County Resources, on December 7, 2009; and
WHEREAS, the Planning and Park Commission has provided the County Board with a copy of the Comprehensive Plan and recommends that the County Board adopt the Comprehensive Plan; and
WHEREAS, the County Board has carefully reviewed the recommendation of the Planning and Park Commission and has determined that all procedural requirements and notice have been satisfied; and
WHEREAS, the County Board has given due consideration to the following plan elements that are required by statute: issues and opportunities; housing; transportation; utilities and community facilities; agricultural, natural, and cultural resources; economic development; intergovernmental cooperation; land use; and implementation; and
