The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation

The mission of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation is to cure cystic fibrosis and to provide all people with the disease the opportunity to lead full, productive lives by funding research and drug development, promoting individualized treatments, and ensuring access to high quality, specialized care. The CF Foundation tirelessly pursues its mission by supporting scientific research, which is dedicated to the discovery and development of new therapies. At the same time, it funds and accredits a network of specialized treatment centers that provide state-of the-art care for people with CF, including the local CF Care Centers at Children's Mercy Hospital and at KU Medical Center. By applying the principles of **efficiency, innovation** and a **results-driven** approach, the CF Foundation is making a profound difference in the lives of those with CF.

The CF Foundation Is Efficient — For more than two decades, the Foundation has been recognized as one of the most effective and efficient organizations of its kind and is an accredited charity of the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance.

The CF Foundation Is Innovative — Nearly every CF drug available today was made possible because of the Foundation's support and our ongoing work with researchers and the pharmaceutical industry to find a cure. **The CF Foundation Is Results-Driven** — The CF Foundation has raised and invested hundreds of millions of dollars to help develop CF drugs and therapies. Through our efforts, the life expectancy of a child with CF has doubled in the last 30 years, and research to find a cure is more promising than ever.

CF Foundation Needs Your Help — Real progress toward a cure has been made, but the lives of young people with CF are still cut far too short. We need the public's continued support to fulfill our mission and help extend the lives of those with the disease.

What is Cystic Fibrosis?

Cystic fibrosis is primarily a lung disease caused by a defective gene that makes the body produce thick, sticky mucus that clogs the lungs and leads to life-threatening infections. This mucus also obstructs the pancreas and stops natural enzymes from helping the body break down and absorb food.

Ten million people in the U.S. – or one in 30 – carry the defective CF gene.

When the Foundation was established, children born with cystic fibrosis were not expected to live long enough to attend elementary school. Today, thanks to research and care supported by the Foundation, many people with CF are living into their 30s, 40s and beyond.





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The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation has unrestricted financial reserves of about 15 times its budgeted annual expenses, following a one-time royalty sale in 2014. These funds, along with the public's continuing support, are needed to help accelerate our efforts to pursue a lifelong cure for this fatal disease, develop lifesaving new therapies and help all people with CF live full, productive lives. Important Note on Attendance at Foundation Events: To reduce the risk of getting and spreading germs at CF Foundation-sponsored events, we ask that everyone follow basic best practices by regularly cleaning your hands with soap and water or with an alcohol-based hand gel, covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue or your inner elbow and maintaining a safe 6-foot distance from anyone with a cold or infection. Medical evidence shows that germs may spread among people with CF through direct and indirect contact as well as through droplets that travel short distances when a person coughs or sneezes. These germs can lead to worsening symptoms and speed decline in lung function. To further help reduce the risk of cross-infection, the Foundation's attendance policy recommends inviting only one person with CF to attend the indoor portion of a Foundation-sponsored event at a specific time. For the outdoor portion, the Foundation recommends that all people with CF maintain a safe 6-foot distance from each other at all times.

The Shoot for the Cure is an annual two-day fundraising event which benefits the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. This event has something for everyone!
