Richmond Foundation Parent Pledge Drive Update



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
Thank you very much to the 16 families who donated to the Richmond Foundation Pledge Drive last week. As of April 23, 56 families have made a donation which will help fund an additional first grade teacher next fall. That is 21% of the families at Richmond. The total as of 4/23/07 is \$34,125. We are just over halfway to our goal of bringing in \$60,000.

It is not too late to make your tax-deductible donation to the Richmond Foundation, BUT **time is running short**. Some of the best teacher candidates are seeking jobs now. Your donation will help ensure that a great new teacher will be at Richmond in the fall.
