### ATTENDANCE FACTS: Information You Need To Know

Daily attendance is important for all students. Students who attend school regularly are more engaged in learning, have a greater sense of belonging in the community are more likely to obtain a high school diploma.

### Attendance facts:

- If a student misses 2 days of school per month they will miss one month of school in the year.
- If a student misses 15 days of school per year they will miss an entire year of school by their senior year.
- If a student is 10 minutes late for class every day they will miss 6 days of instruction per year.

Dropping out of school is a process not an event. Students who drop out of school often begin the process of disengaging from school as early as grade 3.

### What the family can do:

- Participate in school events like assemblies, open houses, special events like concerts, and celebrations of learning.
- Have a parent-child discussion about the importance of going to school every day.
- From the first day of school be consistent in your support for daily attendance.
- Talk to the school as soon as problems occur.
- Help your child get ready for school every day through such things as homework monitoring, regular bedtimes and planning for breakfast and lunches.

### What the school can do:

- Create trusting relations among teachers, students and staff; and ensure that each child has a trusted adult in school.
- Communicate with families making sure they are informed about special events, positive calls to parents and early conversation if there are concerns.
- Have high standards for all students and provide academic and social-emotional supports to all students.
- Create welcoming environment for students and parents.
- Reward and acknowledge students for good attendance.
