#### Does your community know who you are and what you do?

Pubic Relations promote our mission and the people we serve. It is a key component of membership renewal and new growth.

1. Market yourself in a positive and meaningful way. Ask other civic and service organizations to attend a unit meeting or ask to attend their meeting. Discuss what service each provides to the community and how the ALA can form partnerships to broaden service offerings.

2. Get the word out that the ALA is there. Set up booths at local events to share the mission and vision of the ALA. Make a big deal of all activities sponsored by your Unit and Post.

3. Make friends with your local media. Newspapers, radio, television, internet, as well as rack cards and brochures provide different ways to promote the ALA.

Does your Unit know you? Do you know your fellow members? "The Membership Connection" adds value to you as an ALA member. Help your unit connect with members in different ways:

1. Call or e-mail a member to invite them to a meeting, an event, or just to chat.

2. Add members to mailing lists immediately (Post/Unit, county, district, state, and national mailings).

3. Welcome all members at meetings or events, even if you have known each other for years! There may be a member who

doesn't know everyone, so share who you are.

4. Share something about yourself (why you joined the ALA, what programs you would like the unit to be involved in, the skills you bring to the unit, a recent volunteer experience, a new idea!).

5. Ask your unit president to present a "Member Packet" at a meeting. Packets are available through department headquarters. Discuss the packet contents at least once a year, to help current and new members understand their rights and benefits as a valued ALA member. Benefits change, so it's one way everyone understands the value of their membership.

6. Follow-up with members you haven't seen in awhile. Check if they are OK or need help.

7. Hold joint meetings, dinners or events with the Post to build a strong American Legion Family presence in the community. HAVE FUN!

• No Member Left Behind: Every member is important to the ALA! We encourage units to follow-up with non-renewals and members to renew their membership. If the ALA loses you as a member we lose a valuable asset to the organization.



### Are there eligibility requirements?

Yes. Camp American Legion serves Veterans who are injured or disabled, either physically or mentally. They must be honorably discharged and residents of Wisconsin. The camp is handicapped accessible. You do not need to be a member of The American Legion to apply.

#### How do I apply?

First, fill out an application. You can print one from the Camp American Legion web site http://wilegion.org/programs/veterans\_ affairs/camp\_american\_legion or go to your local American Legion Post. Your County Veteran Service Officer can also help you apply! Applications are available in some VA primary care clinics. Second, your physician must certify that you need rest and relaxation to help you recuperate from surgery, illness or other medical or mental health condition. Last, mail your application to:
