How to Locate Contact Information for Your New Mexico Legislators

To find the names and addresses of your elected New Mexico senator and representative on the Internet, go to <u>http://legis.state.nm.us/newsite/legislatorsearch.asp</u> or <u>www.vote-smart.org</u>. If you do not have access to the Internet, you can contact your County Clerk's office.

There are two ways to access the contact information for your state senator and your state representative on the Vote Smart website.

1. For this option, you do not need to know your district numbers.

a) Enter your nine-digit Zip Code in the box at the top left of the website's home page. If you don't know the last four numbers, enter four zeroes.

b) When your legislator's name pops up, click on the name to get the contact information.

- 2. If you know your district numbers,
 - a) Click on "Current Elected Officials" (in red, at the top of the page)
 - b) Click on "State Officials"
 - c) Under "State Legislature" at the top right of this page, click on either "Senate" or "House of Representatives"
 - d) Click on the name of your senator or representative

Reminders

1. When you address an envelope to a legislator, remember to use his or her title (Rep. John Smith or Sen. Diane Garcia, etc.).

2. Elected officials will change after the November elections. It is a good idea to send newly elected officials the same thank-you letter and to send a copy of that letter to New Mexico Arts.
