Use the *simple present tense* to talk about things that usually happen.

Each day, census takers turn in their completed work to the crew leader.



Use the *simple present tense* to talk about *habits*.

Richard drinks a large cup of coffee at work every morning.

He works at the U.S. Census Bureau office.
