MG Set for a Return to the Roadster Market

If you appreciate the way a car can carve a countryside road more than its straight-line power, then you are likely a fan of the classic and iconic British and Italian roadsters. Unfortunately, the pickings have been slim through the years, and though the torch has been carried by other countries, with Mazda Miata and BMW Z4, we'd like to see some of the old makes back. We just might get our wish.

<u>AutoExpress</u> apparently had exclusive access to someone inside MG that confirms the (originally) British automaker is bringing back a roadster, which will be a spiritual successor to the MG TF (seen below, with its own predecessors in the background). Details were vague, citing a return date of "before the end of the decade."



MG has been limping along under ownership of SAIC, a Chinese-state-owned corporation. MG currently has a product portfolio that could be best described as middling, but with a tried and true ragtop roadster under its belt, it could once again conjure up images of MG's heyday.

According to the source, the roadster will be built on one of two new vehicle architectures under development. These platforms will be designed to be flexible enough to develop multiple vehicles under it. This is much the way that Volkswagen employs several vehicles under its MQB platform, thus lowering production costs. If that brings us a new MG roadster sooner (and for less) then we're all for it!


Denny reported that he has 19 cars and 39 people signed up for the Clydesdale Trip.

Midget Mumblings

The trip to MG 2014 in French Lick, Indiana started uneventfully. We met up with Denny and Ruth Hale east of town on Interstate 70 as planned, and we began our caravan east. I elected not to dig out my CB radio from under all the other junk crammed into the boot so I had to stay within sight for the security blanket of traveling together to have any meaning. Denny drove at or perhaps very slightly above the speed limit. There was a lot of traffic traveling various speeds, and it was hard not to let that separate us. Often I got behind slower cars and then had to catch back up. Doing so meant frequently seeing the speedo needle north of 80 but that was fine. The Midget was running sweetly and not even overheating. I took the lead for a bit after we made a pit stop. Then as planned, the Hales were turning off to enjoy lunch in wine country and we were continuing east. We both exited the Interstate, found a parking lot, and said our good byes. Off they went, and I started back east. As I did, I heard the distinctive howl of a slipping fan belt. The noise was definitely coming from under the bonnet of the Midget. But I was planning a fuel stop in another hour or so and would investigate then.

At the fuel stop, I noted that the alternator was sitting at a jaunty angle, and the belt was barely tight enough to stay on. The alternator was snug on the adjuster, but the base flopped around when shaken. I noticed the top bolt of the mounting bracket was loose. I found a wrench and attempted to tighten it with no success. So I wedged an old screw driver between the engine block and the alternator to hold it in approximately the right location and on we went toward our planned stop for the night in Mount Vernon, Indiana.

Once we arrived at our motel, I decided to rest a bit while I let the car cool down before attempting to fix its problem. Knowing that it had taken a half inch wrench to try tightening the bolt, I went to a nearby Lowes and bought a couple different lengths of 5/16" fine thread bolts and some washers hoping one would reach some non-stripped threads in the engine block. After removing the alternator, I could see the bracket was totally loose; and the other bracket bolt was also attached to nothing. It took a bit of effort to get access, but eventually I got the bracket out only to discover that both bolts were broken off flush with the side of the block. It was now getting dark and tomorrow was Fathers' Day Sunday. So I reassembled what I could and tried to get the wedging screw driver trick working again. It took several tries, but it looked like I had things temporarily working. I can't say I slept well.

Sunday morning after breakfast we packed the car and started out. Before even getting out of the parking lot, the wedge slipped out and the belt howled. Numerous attempts proved fruitless in wedging things back in place. I had to admit I needed help. Carol called car rental places that were all closed as were any local mechanics. I called the Hales who had now been joined by the Mills and let them know I needed ideas. They were still more than an hour away, so I started walking toward a nearby Walmart to see if they might have a right angle drill and some easy outs. Access to the broken bolt stubs was very limited without pulling the engine. On my way, I noticed a big Freightliner truck shop that was open. So I went there. They wanted to help but were not set up to work on little old British cars. They gave me a ride back to the motel and eventually brought one of their mechanics to take a look. At last, they decided to try to locate a local independent welder who sometimes did work for them. He just happened to be at his shop getting ready to mow the grass. The Freightliner guy gave me a ride to Jim's Welding shop. Putting his mowing job on hold, Jim loaded his portable welding truck with supplies, (Continued on page 6) and we came back to my stranded car in the motel lot. By now Rick and

Denny had decided none of their ideas were going to work. The welder quickly set up and welded a nub right on the end of the broken bolt. Then he welded nuts on these nubs and managed to unscrew the bolts. I asked his price and would have willingly paid whatever he asked. He was a fair minded person and only asked \$50. I handed him three \$20's, and we were all happy. Denny and Rick helped me get everything bolted back up and were trying to decide who should lead and who should follow since I still was hesitant to unpack my CB. The decision making process seemed to be taking forever, and I was now a few hours late for my appointment in French Lick. I hit the road and figured they would eventually follow and stop if they saw me on the side of the road.

I missed my noon meeting but did finally get there around 4 PM. We got checked into our hotel and picked up our registration package. Next morning I double checked my work under the bonnet and tidied things up a bit. Luckily that was the last of my car troubles, and we enjoyed the hospitality of NAMGBR and sightseeing in the historic resort town.

Following the awards banquet, we got to bed early as we knew we had to get up early (well early for us is before nine) and get started home before the temperatures got too high. The trip home was hot, a bit uncomfortable, and uneventful. I just set the cruise control at the speed limit and watched the miles melt away. I don't know which I appreciated more, the overdrive transmission or the cruise control. Both are great additions to any British sports car.
