Course Description

This course is intended to provide an in-depth focus on asthma and Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Diseases (COPD) and how they present in the primary care setting. The use of objective measurements in the diagnosis and assessment of both asthma and COPD will be reviewed in depth. In addition, this course will address the recognition, diagnosis, and awareness of the latest treatment recommendations for these conditions. By providing up to date information and data on current therapies, the course will improve clinicians' competence and performance.

The teaching modalities in this course include: didactic lectures, panel discussions, question and answer sessions, group case discussions and hands-on-demonstrations of lung function tests, spirometry, peak flow meters, nebulizers and inhalers.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- Perform and interpret peak flow measurements.
- Utilize test results and reference data to guide therapy of asthma.
- Utilize a stepped approach to control asthma and COPD symptoms in order to prevent and treat asthma and COPD exacerbations.
- Recognize the importance of objective measurements of lung function in the diagnosis and management of asthma and COPD.
- Determine appropriate referral for outpatient pulmonary rehabilitation.

Target Audience

The target audience for the course includes primary care physicians, physician assistants, registered nurses, nurse practitioners, respiratory therapists and asthma and COPD case managers. It is also highly relevant for residents and fellows, who are encouraged to attend.
