The Caddo Parish Commission met in legal and regular session, on the above date, at 3:30 p.m., in the Government Chambers, with President Johnson, presiding, and the following members in attendance, constituting a quorum: Commissioners Baker, Bowman, Dominick, Epperson, Escude, Gage-Watts, Johnson, Linn, Smith, Thibodeaux, and Williams (11). ABSENT: Commissioner Cox (1).

The invocation was given by Reverend James Green, and Ms. Lindora Baker led the Commission in the Pledge of Allegiance.

AGENDA ADDITIONS

It was **moved by Mr. Johnson**, seconded by Mr. Epperson, to expand the Regular Session agenda to add increasing the spending cap for materials to repair homes with major damage to \$16,500, along with allowing homeowners to do work themselves with materials purchased and a liability waiver; and add appliances to list of building items for flood victims. <u>Motion carried</u>, as shown by the following roll call votes: Commissioners Baker, Bowman, Dominick, Epperson, Escude, Gage-Watts, Johnson, Linn, Smith, Thibodeaux, and Williams (11). NAYS: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Cox (1).

It was moved by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Epperson, to add *increasing the spending cap for materials to repair homes with major damage to* \$16,500, *along with allowing homeowners to do work themselves with materials purchased and a liability waiver; and add appliances to list of building items for flood victims under "New Business"*. CITIZENS COMMENTS

Mr. Roger Richardson, 1261 Wells Island Road, Shreveport, requested that Commissioners raise the income level to qualify for assistance for flood victims affected by the 2015 Red River flood. He stated that he is only \$2,000 over the income level cap, and needs all of the help he can get.

Mr. Johnson asked that Mr. Richardson meet with Assistant Parish Attorney Bernstein and let him review issue and see where Mr. Richardson can go to discuss his specific situation.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION

It was **moved by Mr. Linn,** seconded by Mr. Williams, *that Special Proclamation declaring the month of July as "Virginia Shehee Month" be approved and read by the Clerk.* <u>Motion carried</u>, as shown by the following roll call votes: Commissioners Baker, Bowman, Dominick, Epperson, Escude, Gage-Watts, Johnson, Linn, Smith, Thibodeaux, and Williams (11). NAYS: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Cox (1).

Ms. Nell Shehee, Mr. Andy Shehee and Mrs. Margaret Shehee thanked the Commission for recognizing their mother. The siblings all agreed that their mother made an everlasting mark on the community and each one of them for the rest of their lives.

Mr. Williams stated that he had a personal relationship with Mrs. Virginia Shehee. He also said that between her and Mrs. Eddie Jones, they helped shaped his political career. Mr. Williams stated that Mrs. Shehee taught him to "humble yourself and lift others up". He also feels that there needs be a statue put up in her honor. Mr. Bowman shared the same sentiments as Mr. Williams.

It was **moved by Mr. Williams**, seconded by Mr. Linn, to adopt the Regular Session Minutes from June 18, 2015. <u>Motion carried</u>, as shown by the following roll call votes: Commissioners Baker, Bowman, Dominick, Epperson, Escude, Gage-Watts, Johnson, Linn, Smith, Thibodeaux, and Williams (11). NAYS: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Cox (1).

It was **moved by Mr. Linn**, seconded by Mr. Dominick, to adopt the Special Session Minutes from June 25, 2015. <u>Motion carried</u>, as shown by the following roll call votes: Commissioners Baker, Bowman, Dominick, Epperson, Escude, Gage-Watts, Johnson, Linn, Smith, Thibodeaux, and Williams (11). NAYS: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Cox (1).

COMMUNIQUES AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

• Mr. Williams stated that the Juvenile Justice Committee met Monday afternoon and discussed various crime prevention programs that could be used in the community. He pointed out the proposed program to provide suits to young men in the community and a possible partnership with Porter's Cleaners. He also talked about the possibility of drafting a curfew ordinance that mirrors what the City has implemented. Mr. Williams also informed Commissioners of a still to be set meeting with the City of Shreveport Police Chief, Caddo Commissioners, Caddo Parish Sheriff along with others to discuss crime in the City of Shreveport.

• Mrs. Gage-Watts stated that the Personnel Policies met some weeks ago and approved some proposed changes to the By-Laws, but in putting this information together the Clerk found some changes that were made in 2010. These changes were not put into the By-Laws, so he is cleaning document up to reflect 2010 changes and others proposed earlier.

• Mr. Epperson reminded the Commissioners and others that the Veterans Celebration Committee will meet on Friday, July 24th at 11:00 a.m. to continue working on this fall's celebration. The parade and honor ceremony is scheduled for Sunday, November 8th at the Louisiana State Fair Grounds.

• Mr. Epperson also reminded the Commissioners of the Economic Development Summit that he will be hosting on Thursday, July 30th from 7:30 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at the Regal Banquet and Conference Center, located at 7288 Greenwood Road, Suite 125.

• Mr. Dominick reminded the Commissioners of the Parks and Recreation meeting immediately following the Regular Session.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

• Mr. Johnson would like to set up a meeting with the Sheriff and the City to discuss crime prevention ways on the increasing violence in this area.

• Mr. Johnson also talked about the traveling that the Commissioners do. He stated that it seems that every time they travel, there is always a public records requesting wanting to know what they did and where they went. He explained that the Commissioners go to different regions of the Nation to see what others are doing and if those programs can be implemented in Caddo Parish.

Mr. Epperson stated that Mr. Ronnie Bryant and Mr. Lonnie Miles have been invited to Caddo Parish to analyze what could be done here to increase the population.

PUBLIC HEARING ON ORDINANCES

Ordinance No. 5492 of 2015, amending the Budget of Estimated Revenues and Expenditures for the Capital Outlay Fund and the Public Works Fund for the year 2015 to correct the 2015 Budget to include an appropriation of \$1,250,000 for the Dawson Road Project and to otherwise provide with respect thereto

Ms. Susannah Hodges, 4724 Thornhill Avenue, Shreveport, stated that she is opposed to this ordinance.

Mr. Joel Rice, 505 Longleaf Road, Shreveport, speaking in opposition, stated that he is not real sure of the status of the project. He also said that there is approximately sixty members of his family that have interest in Rice Farms, and this farm has been in their family for at least fivegenerations. He also stated that the opposition for Rice Road is a community decision, not just his family.

Mr. Rice also talked about the concerns of Dawson Road. He stated that they have legitimate concerns and believes that their issues should be resolved also. Mr. Rice believes that there is a viable option that will please all of the residents of this community.

Ms. Doris LaCour, 4560 Rice Road, Shreveport, speaking in opposition, stated that she has been a resident on Rice for at least twenty years. She also said that the residents of Rice Road do not want any increased traffic along Rice Road.

Mrs. Autumn Casaus, 4590 Rice Road, Shreveport, speaking in opposition, stated that they just recently moved to Rice Road and that reason they moved out there was because of the "country life". Her family also does not want any increased traffic along the road. She also believes that there are other options to address the problems on Dawson Road.

Mr. Kevin Casaus, 4590 Rice Road, Shreveport, stated that he is in opposition of connecting Dawson Road to Rice Road. He also stated that Dawson Road does have valid drainage concerns that needs to be addressed. He believes that there are several options that would solve their problems without connecting Rice Road to Dawson Road.

Ms. Constance Green, 4475 Rice Road, Shreveport, is also in opposition to the extension from Rice Road to Dawson Road. She also agreed that the Dawson Road residents do have valid concerns that need to be addressed.

- Ordinance No. 5493 of 2015, amending the Budget of Estimated Revenues and Expenditures for the Capital Outlay Fund and the Capital Improvement Fund for the year 2015 to provide an appropriation of \$500,000 to build a new building at the David Raines Center and to otherwise provide with respect thereto
- Ordinance No. 5494 of 2015, amending the Budget of Estimate Revenues and Expenditures for the Capital Outlay Fund and the Capital Improvement Fund for the year 2015 to provide an appropriation of \$200,000 to construct a new parking lot at the Caddo Community Action Agency (CCAA) and to otherwise provide with respect thereto.
- Ordinance No. 5495 of 2015, amending the Budget of Estimated Revenues and Expenditures for the Capital Outlay Fund in the amount of \$194,822 to increase the appropriation for hot water heaters at the Caddo Correctional Center (CCC) and to otherwise provide with respect thereto
- Ordinance No. 5496 of 2015, declaring certain adjudicated properties to be surplus and to authorize the Parish Administrator, or a designee, to sell the Parish of Caddo's tax interest in certain surplus adjudicated properties, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto.

There being no-one else to speak in favor, or in opposition to the above ordinances, President Johnson declared the public hearing on ordinances to be concluded.

ORDINANCES (For Final Passage)

It was **moved by Mr. Epperson**, seconded by Mr. Bowman, that Ordinance No. 5492 of 2015, amending the Budget of Estimated Revenues and Expenditures for the Capital Outlay Fund and the Public Works Fund for the year 2015 to correct the 2015 Budget to include an appropriation of \$1,250,000 for the Dawson Road Project and to otherwise provide with respect thereto be approved.

Budget.

Mr. Epperson asked that the Clerk re-read Ordinance No. 5492 of 2015 to ensure that the audience fully understood the contents of this ordinance.

Mr. Epperson also stated that he wrote a letter, under his signature, with his intention to let the residents of Dawson Road and Rice Road know that he no longer has an interest of building an extension from Rice Road to Dawson Road. He stated that this ordinance is to correct an error in the Budget.

Mr. Thibodeaux stated that they will not know what the alternative route is going to cost because they do not know what the alternative route is. He is in opposition of this ordinance because there is still information that they do not have. He believes that the drainage problem with Dawson Road should be treated as a separate project and funded separately.

Mr. Thibodeaux stated that he is also concerned with the wording of the letter that was sent out by Commissioner Epperson. He stated that the Commission did not vote on this matter. He asked that the Commissioners vote against this ordinance.

Ms. Baker agreed that there are issues on Dawson Road that need to be resolved; she stated that those issues should be treated separately, with a separate ordinance. Ms. Baker also said that the Rice Road residents need confirmation that the road extension is a dead deal.

Mr. Dominick agreed with Ms. Baker. He also stated from his recollection, the road would have been built based on the feasibility study; the study came back saying that it was not feasible, at this time, to extend Rice Road to Dawson Road. Mr. Dominick urged the Commissioners to vote against this ordinance at this time for the same reasons that Mr. Thibodeaux and Ms. Baker stated.

Mr. Williams stated that it will take a two-thirds vote to overturn an ordinance that has already been approved. Attorney Frazier stated that it was not voted on for the 2015 Budget. Mr. Williams argued that it was. Attorney Frazier clarified that in 2013, the Commission voted to put \$1.25M in the 2014 Budget and \$1.25M in the 2015 Budget, but it still had to be presented in the 2015 Budget and be voted on.

Answering a question from Mr. Williams, Attorney Frazier stated that \$1.2M has been already been approved and should carry until 2016 or 2017, whichever is considered the third year. Attorney Frazier stated that the Commission did not technically vote on the \$1.25M in the 2015 Budget because it was not presented to the Commission.

Mrs. Bryant stated that because the \$1.25M was not included in the 1025 Budget, it was not voted on. She also said that since the 2015 Budget has been passed, the Commission would have to vote on this amendment to include it in the 2015 Budget.

Mr. Williams stated that he is very disappointed that this funding was left out of the

Mr. Bowman said that he will be voting for this ordinance.

Answering a question from Mrs. Gage-Watts regarding the Capital Outlay extension until 2016, Mrs. Bryant stated that capital projects can be in the Budget for three years, unless you begin project; it is the completion of the project or three years in the Capital Outlay Budget for three years with no activity. The ordinance that is before you today, Mrs. Bryant said, is only to appropriate monies. She also said that the route in which the money is used, has not been determined.

Answering another question from Mrs. Gage-Watts regarding the letter that was sent out to the residents of Rice Road and Dawson Road, Attorney Frazier stated that the letter does not serve as proof or guarantee of anything. She also explained that if the Commission voted today on not going through Rice Road, the Commission could come back and overturn that vote.

Mr. Linn agreed that there are drainage issues on Dawson Road, but he will not be voting for this ordinance today. He stated that there is already enough money allocated to fix the Dawson Road problems; there is no need to allocate more money.

Mr. Linn also has a concern with the letter that was written to the Dawson Road/Rice Road residents. He stated that one Commissioner cannot represent the whole Commission.

Mr. Johnson explained that the intent of the original motion was to have \$2.5M allocated for the Dawson Road Project based on the feasibility study. He also stated that there was no road identified in the original ordinance or the original motion. Mr. Johnson also explained that this ordinance is to correct the 2015 Budget.

ORDINANCE NO. 5495 OF 2015

BY THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BUDGET OF ESTIMATED REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR THE CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$194,822 TO INCREASE THE APPROPRIATION FOR HOT WATER HEATERS AT THE CADDO CORRECTIONAL CENTER (CCC) AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO WHEREAS, the 2015 budget includes an appropriation of \$227,887 to replace hot water heaters at CCC; and

WHEREAS, CCC has five existing domestic hot water heaters that were installed in 2002 and provide all of the domestic hot water to the entire facility on a 24 hour basis; and

WHEREAS, two of the hot water heaters are completely down and beyond repair, another one requires various repairs on a weekly basis, and the remaining two are old and not reliable; and

WHEREAS, because of the poor condition of the hot water heaters, it is necessary to replace all five hot water heaters and \$227,887 is not adequate to cover the anticipated costs to replace the hot water heaters; and

WHEREAS, an additional \$194,822 is needed to cover the estimated costs to replace the hot water heaters; and

WHEREAS, the following projects for CCC have been completed but have remaining balances that can be used to fund the additional amount needed to purchase the new hot water heaters; and
