

# Whassup?

Because many people have come up to me recently and asked numerous questions about Glendora and her city government, I am going to do a Question and Answer column today.

**Q. Glendora has spent millions of dollars on lawsuits. Why?**

A. Glendora has NOT spent millions on lawsuits! We have not lost a significant lawsuit in more than five years. More importantly, the city has not spent one penny – not one! – as a result of any act, error or omission on the part of the Council in the four years.

The last lawsuit the city “lost” was the Gagne case. This case was settled because then Council Members John Harrold and Dick Jacobs took a position that undermined the city and made a defense untenable.

**Q. I understand Glendora is being sued by LA County. Can you tell me why?**

A. Sure. Glendora has begun the legal process to consolidate our three redevelopment agencies into one. This would lengthen the life of all of them and keep millions of property tax dollars in Glendora. LA County wants the property tax for itself and is therefore fighting the consolidation.

**Q. What is the risk to Glendora of this lawsuit?**

A. There is no risk. We can only win or break even. If we don’t fight the county, they will take the property taxes by default. We have a very good chance of winning and keeping the taxes in Glendora. That’s good for Glendora Taxpayers!

**Q. A retired Glendora police officer sued Glendora. Why?**

A. He wanted additional retirement benefits that *had not* been negotiated by the Police Officer’s Association. The City declined to provide them; he sued and lost. That’s also good for Glendora Taxpayers!

**Q. The City has raised water rates every year since 2003. I’m told they have increased by 327%. True?**

A. No! Rates have increased significantly since 2003 – about 16% per year, compounded; about one fourth the amount claimed above. This was necessary to start repairing our system and eliminate operating losses. Not raising rates would have been irresponsible and a betrayal of our citizens. See my Examiner article from last week!

**Q. The Council has doubled their own pay and benefits; also, I hear they have increased dues taxpayers pay for City Council Club memberships by 1,000%**

A. Whoa, someone’s nose is going to grow!! Let me deal with the biggest fabrication first:

Taxpayers DO NOT PAY FOR ANY CLUB MEMBERSHIPS for Council members! There are no “club memberships”, period. The only benefits made available to Council Members are health insurance and dental insurance. I don’t believe any council-member takes the health insurance and the council has no say on the cost of these benefits in any event. Finally, this council did vote to increase the compensation paid to council members; not for us, but for future council members. There had not been an adjustment in council compensation for more than 15 years. It was long overdue.

**Q. Critics claim that you have given “millions in tax rebates” to “political backers”! What say you?**

A. Not True! We have not paid a dime in tax rebates to anyone!

**Q. Others say you have given “millions” to “developers.” True?**

A. Non! Nein! Nyet! No! We have given nothing to developers!

**Q. On August 17, 2005 The Tribune reported that Glendora was facing bankruptcy. How do you respond?**

A. On August 18, 2005, the very next day, The Tribune retracted that story as untrue. The reporter was suspended without pay for inaccurate reporting. We are an exceptionally healthy city financially!

**Q. How can someone say these things if they are not true?**

A. It’s called freedom of speech! Freedom of speech however, does not require that the speaker be taken seriously, or that his or her statements are accurate, let alone truthful.

# Election Sign Vandals Arrested

Daughter of recalled councilman Sonny Marshall

**GLENDORA** — The three incumbent City Council candidates have been plagued by having many of their signs defaced with printed negative overlays using an extremely sticky, slimy adhesive, preventing removal.

Monday, February 19th, at about 10 p.m., on his way home, Councilman Gary Clifford happened upon two women in the process of defacing the signs at Foothill Blvd. and Lone Hill.

When Clifford asked them whether they were going to remove the stickers, they said no and took off in a car.

He followed them while calling the Glendora Police and they were stopped at Sierra Madre Blvd. and Valley Center.

According to Capt. Rob Castro, the two Glendora 18 year-olds were identified as Kelieigh Marshall and Christina Giammalva.

Marshall is the daughter of ex-councilman, Sonny Marshall, who was recalled along with Dick Jacobs and ex-Mayor and current council candidate, John Harrold. The Lexus the two were in is registered to Sonny Marshall

and contained many more of the overlay stickers.

Police made an arrest by way of a Private Persons (Citizen’s) Arrest. Both were booked, interviewed at the police station and released on a misdemeanor citation to appear in court.

Virginia Marshall, wife of Sonny Marshall, appeared at the arrest location. Further investigation is planned and others may be charged in the matter.

Although all three incumbents have had their signs defaced, the

majority of the defacing has been to Mayor Tessitor’s signs.

Tessitor was a leader in the recall campaign against then Mayor Harrold, Councilmen Marshall and Jacobs. The three were recalled by Glendora voters after they obstructed the construction of the Glendora Marketplace, fired the City Manager and all the City Commissioners. Kristin Parisi, Harrold’s co-host on his cable TV program, is employed by Sonny Marshall and is also running for City Council.

### Azusa's Campaign Finances at Whose Expense?

I recently read with great interest and amazement a newspaper article ("Chagnon has top spot in finances") in the San Gabriel Valley Tribune relative to the upcoming City of Azusa March 6, 2007 elections for Mayor and two Council seats. It was a well documented and researched article dealing with campaign contributions for all eight candidates (two for Mayor and six for Council).

It not only informed the residents of Azusa of the amount of contributions that each candidate has received up until January 20, 2007, but also the fact that current Mayor Diane Chagnon and current Councilman Angel Carrillo are the only two candidates that have accepted large contributions from developers, sub-developers, and contractors currently under contact and doing business in Azusa development and redevelopment projects. For Chagnon \$25,000 of \$32,000 received and for Carrillo \$5100 of \$6600 received.

I could not help but notice the coincidence of the placement of

that article just below the headline news of that same day dealing with U.S. Congressman Gary Miller, 42nd District ("Miller Ties Benefit Developer"). Miller's ethic issues and problems stem from his relationship with Lewis Operating Company, one of the Southland's largest real estate developer, as well as his questionable purchase and sale of properties for large profits.

As a twenty-three year resident of Azusa and a retired government employee involved in multi-million construction and redevelopment projects for nearly 30 years, I find that the acceptance of campaign contributions from developers and contractors currently doing business with the City of Azusa to be not only unethical but a major conflict of interest.

Needless to say, I was completely stunned and disappointed the next day, February 16th, 2007, when I read an article in that same newspaper entitled, "Azusa City Council Recommen-

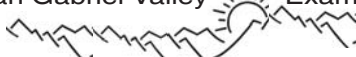

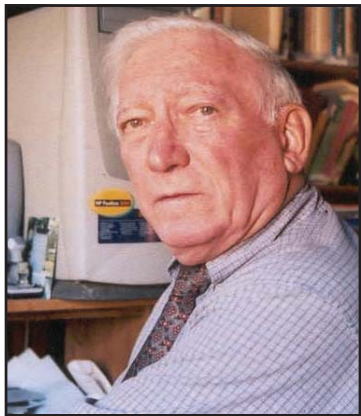


# We Should Have Seen This Coming!

## Your Tax Dollars And Those Delta Levees

When engineers, hydrologists and soil scientists spoke in a single voice following the New Orleans levee failures during hurricane Katrina, Californians finally thought seriously about a similar disaster facing this state. With two-thirds of the state's residents, including the San Gabriel Valley, dependent upon a steady flow of water from the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, a comparable levee failure here would be a far greater calamity.

For a hundred years the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers have been ineptly penned in to prevent flood waters from spreading over vast areas of the agricultural-rich Delta. Frequently major floods have caused levee failure or simply ridden over them, leaving farm land awash to a depth of ten or more feet.

Patch-work, band aid repairs have followed, holding the rivers in check - until the next great flood. In fact, it doesn't even take a flood for the levees to fail. On a clear day a few years ago a levee failed because of the deterioration of the soil underneath it. An entire island disappeared for a time.

Throughout 2006 politicians, editors and just plain citizens demanded that the fragile levee system of our Delta be bolstered. Southern Californians, as prime users of fresh water pumped from the Delta, were as concerned as residents of the Delta

region.

The culmination was passage of two major bond issues at last November's election: Prop 1E and 84, which collectively provided nearly \$5 billion for levee repairs. Compared to the other bond issues enacted at that same election, the levees appeared cheap. L.A. County voters supported both bonds, overwhelmingly.

But some of those most knowledgeable about the geology of the Delta warned that what looked like a massive expenditure of funds for levees was in reality a great waste of money. Five billion would only shore up a small portion of a sixteen hundred mile levee system, all of which was in trouble.

If that wasn't bad enough, all the talk about prohibiting development in a flood plain that couldn't really be protected seemed to pass over the heads of the State Reclamation Board,

the San Joaquin county town of Lathrop and an energetic developer.

As the governor, the legislature and most newspaper editorial boards urged passage of the levee bonds, another force was quietly moving in another direction.

Stewart Island, for decades an agricultural tract, lies along the San Joaquin River. Its other two boundaries are branches of the San Joaquin, creating the island near Stockton. A few years ago the little town of Lathrop annexed it, about the time that a giant European company, Cambay, decided to put 11,000 homes and a business park on the largely uninhabited island.

Never mind that the island has been inundated three times in the last century. Cambay proposed a 300 foot wide levee, several times the usual width, to protect the development. Of course, the flood waters have to go somewhere, and Cambay's super levee will cause a levee failure elsewhere. And we'll pay to shore that one up.

Using conservative statistics that failed to consider environmental changes that have alarmed most scientists, Cambay was able to convince the State Reclamation Board, which has some authority over levee adjustments and development in the flood plain, that Stewart Island would no longer be in danger.

Enter FEMA, that failed agency that justly bore the brunt of public criticism over its dismal performance in the wake of the Katrina disaster. FEMA blessed the project, ruling that a large portion of Stewart Island, where the first 2400 homes would be built, was no longer a flood plain.

Never mind that the Reclamation Board gave Cambay its approval without a public hearing. Some of our local city councils have been accused of that too: violating the law by enacting measures that weren't on the agenda. What champions of big business would call "frivolous lawsuits" - to force the Board to rescind its action - followed. The Board did rescind, but in the next breath, after giving a ho-hum hearing to the complainants -

simply repassed its original approval.

Which gets us back to those billions in levee bonds you San Gabriel Valley voters cast ballots for last November.

It doesn't take a genius to imagine that in the near future Cambay, Lathrop and the newly housed residents of Stewart Island will be demanding their fair share of our levee bonds - to further protect them from the inevitable flood that they will tell us will cause tens of millions of dollars in damage if we don't act now.

And we should act now... to force the Reclamation Board to rescind its approval of this Katrina waiting to happen.

# An Early Look at 2008: The Democrats

To write this early about the 2008 race for the White House is, at best, a risky proposition. The field is so deep, the candidates so varied, and the process is so unpredictable. Predictions and even observations made at this time can easily be eclipsed by a number of developments occurring between now and the first contests in Iowa and New Hampshire in January of 2008.

There are already, ten democrats and 13 Republicans who have either announced their intentions to run or appear likely to do so.

Last weekend, I was at the Democratic National Committee meeting where all ten Democrats delivered speeches before the party's leaders. I came away from the event with a number of reflections.

First is the fact that this is an extremely diverse field, rich in experience, presenting real choices for Democratic voters. By diversity, I don't mean gender, race and ethnicity - although these factors do represent an exciting feature of this contest that can't be ignored. Listening to the Democratic hopefuls, what struck me as most intriguing were the very distinctive messages and even meta-messages they conveyed.

There were, of course, some

differences in how several of the key issues were addressed. But these differences were not so great that even a casual observer would not have been able to discern a consensus Democratic case for 2008: fixing the nation's broken healthcare, education and immigration systems; rejection of the Bush administration's unilateralism in foreign affairs in favor of a restoration of America's diplomatic leadership in the world; and protecting the middle class and poor from the ravages of unfair tax cuts and loss of employment opportunities. Given this list of problems to be addressed, as I noted, there were some differences in the solutions proposed. But they were not as great as the candidates may attempt to project them to be, in their efforts to appeal to various segments of Democratic voters.

The real differences lay else-



where, in fact, on a deeper level.

Ms. Clinton, for example, far and away the leader in early polling, exudes not only confidence but an aura of inevitability. After Democrats have been in exile for six years, she promises a return. Her supporters convey the message that not only can she win, but that she will win and so "get on the train now, because it's off and running."

Clinton touts her experience, her ability to do real politics, and her toughness in battle. She is the legacy candidate saying, "I know how to fight." Without saying more, she reminds the faithful of both past glories and hurts.

The message she sends is clear: if you want to win and get back what we had before, I'm the one who will get you there. I know who I am, you know who I am, and you know what I can do - an evident reminder of past

candidates who never quite solidified their message.

Former Senator Edwards who never stopped running after the Democratic defeat in 2004, has become a force in his own right. He targeted core Democratic issues, heightened his profile in key primary states, and built a national organization. Focusing on the highly evocative message of "two Americas," which he first exposed to the nation during his 2004 primary campaign, he has captured support in the liberal wing of the party. Like John Kennedy, he projects powerful images of blight, poverty, the growing gap in health care, and the insecurity of America's poor and working class, to develop a compelling message that has resonated with the Democratic faithful.

And then there is Senator Barack Obama. If John Edwards is adopting the John Kennedy persona with his "other America" theme, Obama is a latter-day Bobby Kennedy whose youthful and charismatic message of hope is bringing inspiration to a new generation of voters.

Senator Obama, initially dismissed by some as a phenomenon, appears to be the real thing. His bestselling books and his compelling speaking style have not only inspired, but conveyed

wisdom and deep understanding of some of the most complex issues facing contemporary America.

Through much of his speech at last weekend's Democratic meeting, the audience sat spellbound, captivated by his unique appeal. He did not present a litany of issues and solutions - these he promised would come later. His message was one of hope and his promise to end cynicism and "politics as usual." The rapturous applause that greeted his conclusion made it clear that his message resonated.

These three, the current frontrunners and the most intriguing candidates to emerge, by no means exhaust the Democratic field. New Mexico's Governor Bill Richardson and Senator Joseph Biden, Chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, point to their strong foreign policy credentials, so necessary to fix America's troubled standing in the world. This is also the message of former General Wesley Clark, who has yet to declare his candidacy.

Connecticut Senator Thomas Dodd brings not only an impressive record in foreign and domestic policy, he is also a force-

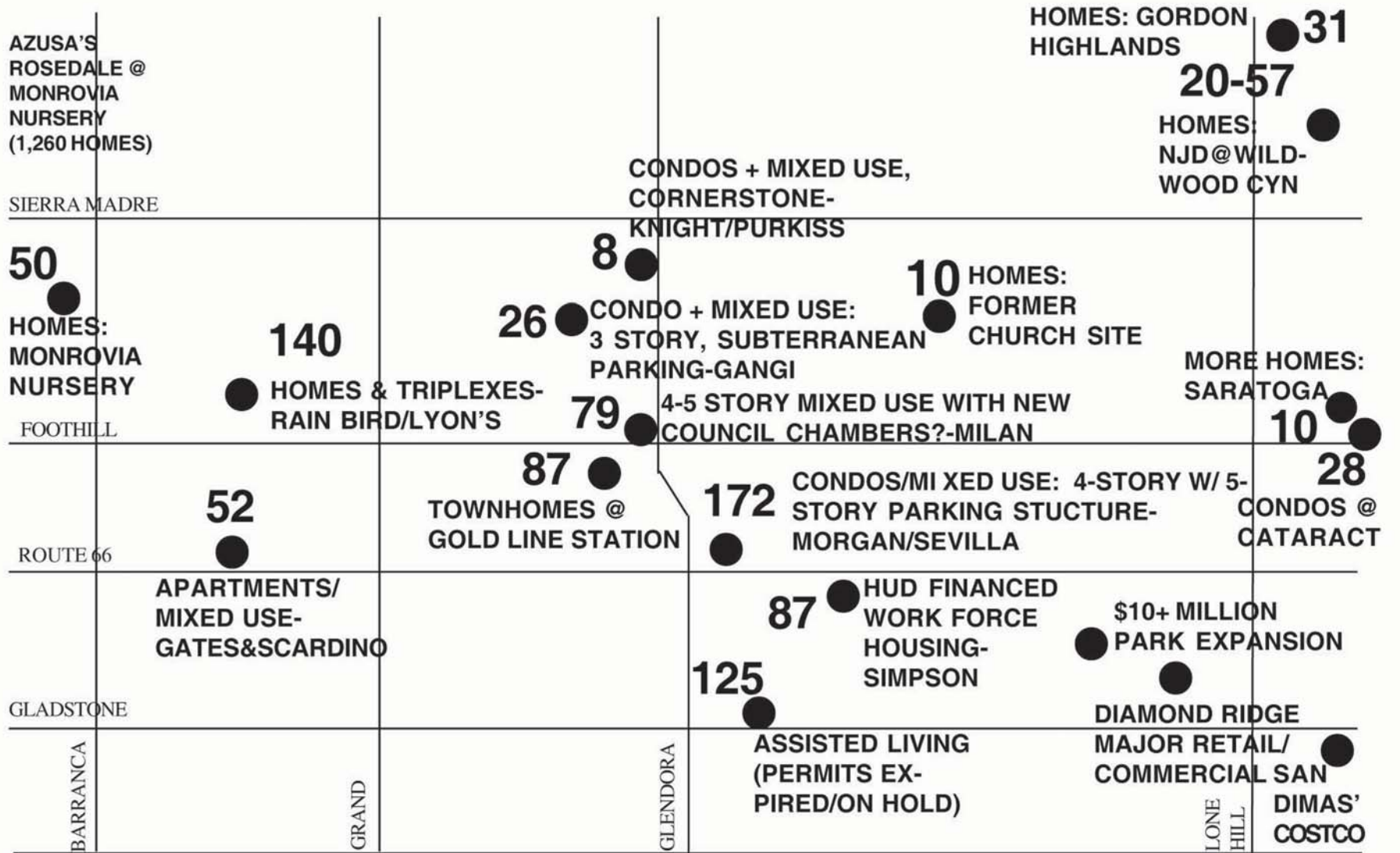

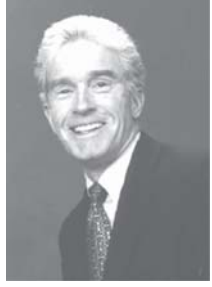


# The Chairman Travels To Capital Hill

Every six months, the Chairman of the Federal Reserve makes his way up Capital Hill for his testimony regarding the state of the economy. Last week, Chairman Bernanke sat before the legislative body for two days describing what turned out to be a very warmly received speech. The key line from Bernanke's testimony is that the Federal Open Market Committee is not yet ready to relax its anti-inflationary stance. He repeated the warning from the last FOMC statement that the "predominant policy concern is the risk that inflation will fail to ease as expected and that it [the FOMC] is prepared to take action to address inflation risks if developments warrant."

That said, the Chairman reiterated the Fed expectation for growth to moderate and inflation to fall. The Fed's central tendency forecasts for growth is lower than in July, but the inflation forecast was left unchanged. The central tendency forecast for GDP in 2007 is 2.5% to 3.0%, down from 3% to 3.25%. The central tendency forecast for core PCE inflation is 2% to 2.25%, the same as it was in July. For the unemployment rate, it is 4.5% to 4.75%, down from

4.75% to 5%.

Of these, the most surprising is the inflation forecast, because the core inflation rate at the end of 2006 was 2.2%, already in the central tendency range for 2007. The Fed is unusually skeptical in forecasting below trend GDP growth for a year and no decline in inflation, especially since core inflation has fallen significantly in the past four months.

In Bernanke's text, he stressed the overall good health of the economy, even as it "appears to be making a transition from the rapid rate of expansion ... to a more sustainable pace of growth." The principal source of moderation is the correction in the housing market, though spillover from the housing slowdown appears to be minimal.

Inflation pressures have abated, he said, but monthly numbers are volatile so the Fed cannot take the recent downward trend for granted. Bernanke credits falling energy prices for the moderation in both headline and core inflation. Recent price moderation in rents has been by far the most significant factor in the slowdown in core inflation, but Bernanke failed to mention it.

Delinquency rates on household loans remain low, the Chairman said, though he admitted to the recent spike in sub prime mortgage delinquencies. The wave of bankruptcies did not warrant a mention in the prepared text.

Risks to the outlook noted by the Chairman are "significant."

The ultimate extent of the housing market correction is difficult to forecast and could be worse than expected by the Fed. It's noteworthy that the correction to date has already been worse than anticipated by the Fed.

Spillover from the housing correction is also possible. That could mean slower consumer spending and slower job creation.

The primary upside risk, he said, is that growth could exceed

expectations if consumer spending continues to increase at the "brisk pace seen in the second half of 2006."

Observations: In talking to an economist friend of mine that follows the Fed's moves and actions, he notes there are two issues that should be pointed out. On the one hand, bond investors should be thrilled with the Fed's tenacity against inflation. Bernanke's credibility as an inflation fighter is undeniable after just a year at the helm of the Board of Governors.

On the other hand, the Fed has tended to ignore bad economic news and panic at good news over the course of that year. As this friend of mine stated, "If the Fed thinks inflation expectations are so dangerous, why do they spend so much time fanning

those expectations?" Bernanke's characterization of consumption as too "strong" in the second half glosses over the fact that consumption slowed in the second and third quarters before jumping to 4.4% in the fourth. (And even the 4.4% rise was not as strong as all that, because almost 1% of that real rise came from a decline in prices.)

The Fed's assessment of housing is similar. Sub prime lenders are closing their doors, mortgage spreads are starting to rise, banks and mortgage companies are tightening credit standards, making mortgages more expensive, mortgage applications are falling again. Yet, the Fed worries that housing might rebound, derailing the slowdown.

## Financial - Ask Julia

*How can I save on my home heating bill?*

Lower your furnace thermostat 3 - 5 degrees, use extra blankets, check your water heater temperature, and inquire about the utility company's payment plan. If there are any rooms in your house that you are not using, close the furnace vent(s), and the door, to those rooms. Check to see if your attic is adequately insulated, and close your fireplace flue when not in use. Make sure your furnace is running efficiently - change the filter monthly, remove the dust, and check to see that you are not inadvertently heating the attic due to a loose panel or duct work. (Don't laugh, this happened to me last year - the access panel had fallen open; much of the furnace heat was wasted on heating my attic!) The repair man told me that the gas company will check the furnace for free, but I haven't tried that yet.

*Can I claim a deduction that I don't have a receipt for?*

For any deduction that you should have a receipt, or some proof of the expense, you could claim the deduction, but if you are audited, you may have to pay the difference, plus penalties and fees. Is there any way you can obtain legitimate proof? Do you keep a day-timer type calendar, a diary, or a log of some sort that you may have noted the expense? This might stand up in an audit,

even without a receipt. There are some deductions that are "standard" which don't require receipts. Check with your CPA for further tax advice.

*If I pay off past due debts that have already shown up on my credit report, will that be noted and my credit score improve?*

Nope. "Lates" are negative and stick with you like tar on your foot at the beach!

Sometimes a creditor will report you as 30-days late, when you can prove that you were only 10 days late. In this case, put up a fight! Send a copy of that page of your credit report along with proof of when that payment cleared your bank, and/or when the creditor received your payment, to each credit reporting agency, telling them that you want that negative information removed from your report.

*I get many offers to refinance my home loan - some sound like they are from the govern-*

*ment, others sound like my loan is about to change and I'll have to make much higher payments or lose my home. And, what's a "no cost" loan? How can I tell what's good?*

As you know, I'm a Sr. Loan Officer and a Mortgage Coach, and let me tell you, it really infuriates me to see these borderline-unethical mailers, radio, and television offers. There's supposed to be Truth-in-Lending, but some folks try to get as close to the edge of truth vs. lies as they can without getting in trouble. A "no cost" loan can mean several things - either that all the costs will be rolled into your loan, or that you are paying a much higher interest rate, giving them enough profit that they cover the costs. Either way, you are going to pay. You don't honestly expect anyone to work for free - you wouldn't, right? But, there are ways to pay for the service you are getting that make it beneficial to you, too. A win / win situation.

*What are the different investments in relation to when I have to pay taxes on them?*

Although certain events and distributions may be subject to taxation, and individuals would be responsible for the appropriate liability, here's some general information. You're going to be taxed now (basically annually), on savings, checking, CD's,

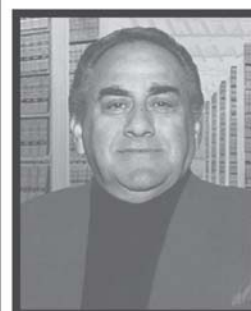

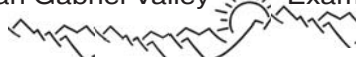

# Glendora Republican Club Calls On Harrold and Parisi To Disavow Sleazy Campaign Tactics

The Board of Directors of the Glendora Republican Club today called upon Glendora City Council candidates John Harrold and Kristin Parisi to disavow the actions of their campaign supporters in defacing, vandalizing and destroying campaign signs of their opponents. Harrold/Parisi workers were caught by the Glendora Police Department Monday night putting defamatory stickers on the campaign signs of Councilmen Gary Clifford, Ken Herman and Doug Tessitor.

"We're willing to give Mr Harrold and Ms Parisi a chance to show their disgust and contempt for these illegal and un-American actions by their supporters", said Club Director Garrett Conrad. "We call upon Harrold and Parisi to issue an official statement today declaring under penalty of perjury that they had no knowledge of, nor involvement with, these criminal actions of their supporters".

Harrold and two allies were recalled by the voters of Glendora in 2002 after gaining control of the city a year earlier. Their three member council majority promptly fired the City Manager, removed all sitting City Commissioners and presided over an unprecedented year of turmoil in City government.

One of the Harrold allies recalled along with him, was former Councilman Sonny Marshall. Marshall continues to be a strong supporter of John Harrold and currently

employs his running mate Kristin Parisi, in the office of his construction company. One of the workers caught defacing the signs of the three incumbent Glendora councilmen was the adult daughter of recalled Glendora councilman Sonny Marshall.

The statement by the Glendora Republican Club also called for a full investigation by the Glendora Police Department into these crimes and full prosecution as provided by law.

They noted the irony of Deputy District Attorney John Harrold being implicated in campaign tactics that violate the law, and urged him to immediately come clean with any information in his possession to aid the police investigation. Conspiracy to commit crimes, and to cover up those already committed, can be charged as either misdemeanors or felonies, depending on the severity of the crimes involved.

The Glendora Republican Club is Glendora's oldest and largest political organization, dating back to the 1950's. Glendora is strongly Republican by voter registration, and it's voters have a reputation for supporting clean campaigns and honest government. The City Council election is scheduled for March 6, 2007.

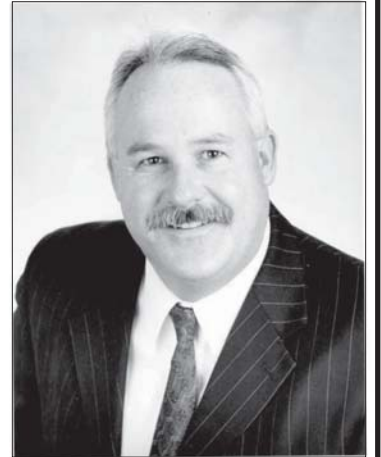

# Glendora Police Arrest Suspect Who Fled After Fatal DUI Traffic Collision

**GLENDORA** — On February 15 at approximately 8:32 pm, Glendora police received a call of an injury traffic collision at the intersection of Loraine Avenue and Bennett Avenue in Glendora.

While officers were responding, citizens reported that the driver of one of the two involved vehicles was fleeing the scene on foot, and that he was being chased by two Good Samaritans.

When officers arrived, they aided the driver of the second vehicle, a 63-year-old female Glendora resident, who was trapped and unconscious inside her vehicle, a 1999 Ford Contour sedan.

The Ford Contour was broadsided directly at the driver's door by the front of the second vehicle, a 2003 Mercedes-Benz E320 sedan, causing the Mercedes-Benz' driver-side airbag to deploy.

Other responding Glendora officers cordoned-off a neighborhood where the two Good Samaritan teenagers last saw the fleeing driver/suspect run. Pasadena PD's helicopter arrived to assist, just as Glendora officers caught the suspect hiding in the front yard of a residence.

Glendora resident Basil Winn, 26, was intoxicated and arrested.

He was charged with felony driving under the influence of alcohol resulting in injury to another person, and felony hit & run resulting in injury to another person. He is being held at the Glendora Police Department jail with bail set at \$100,000.

The second driver/victim was initially transported to Foothill Presbyterian Hospital. She was then transported by helicopter to LA County/USC Trauma Center for treatment.

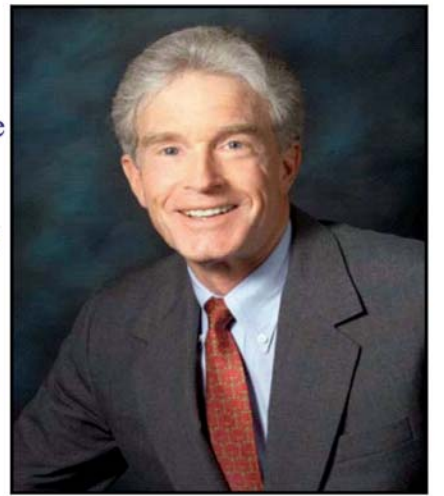
On February 15 at 9:36 pm, the victim was pronounced dead at LA County/USC Hospital.

The suspect, Basil Winn, was additionally charged with Vehicular Manslaughter-DUI with gross negligence. The bail remained at \$100,000.

On February 16, 2007 a bail enhancement was obtained increasing Suspect Basil Winn's bail to \$250,000. Basil remains in custody at the Glendora Police Department and is expected to be arraigned on Tuesday, February 20, 2007 at West Covina Superior Court.

ful speaker who, like Edwards, reaches traditional Democratic voters. Iowa's two-term former Governor Tom Vilsack presents a steady hand and strong leadership credentials. Then there's Senator Mike Gravel, an anti-war hero from the days of Vietnam, and Congressman Dennis Kucinich, Congress's current leading anti-war champion. At this early stage, none of these seven have made it into double-digits in national or statewide polling, but as I said, it's too early to write anyone out. As Richardson reminded the party faithful, "stay loose" - this race is just starting.

Domestic or international crisis can change the campaign's dynamic, as can a candidate's mistakes, past or present. Should former Vice President Gore make a late entrance into the campaign, the entire picture could change - and change dramatically.

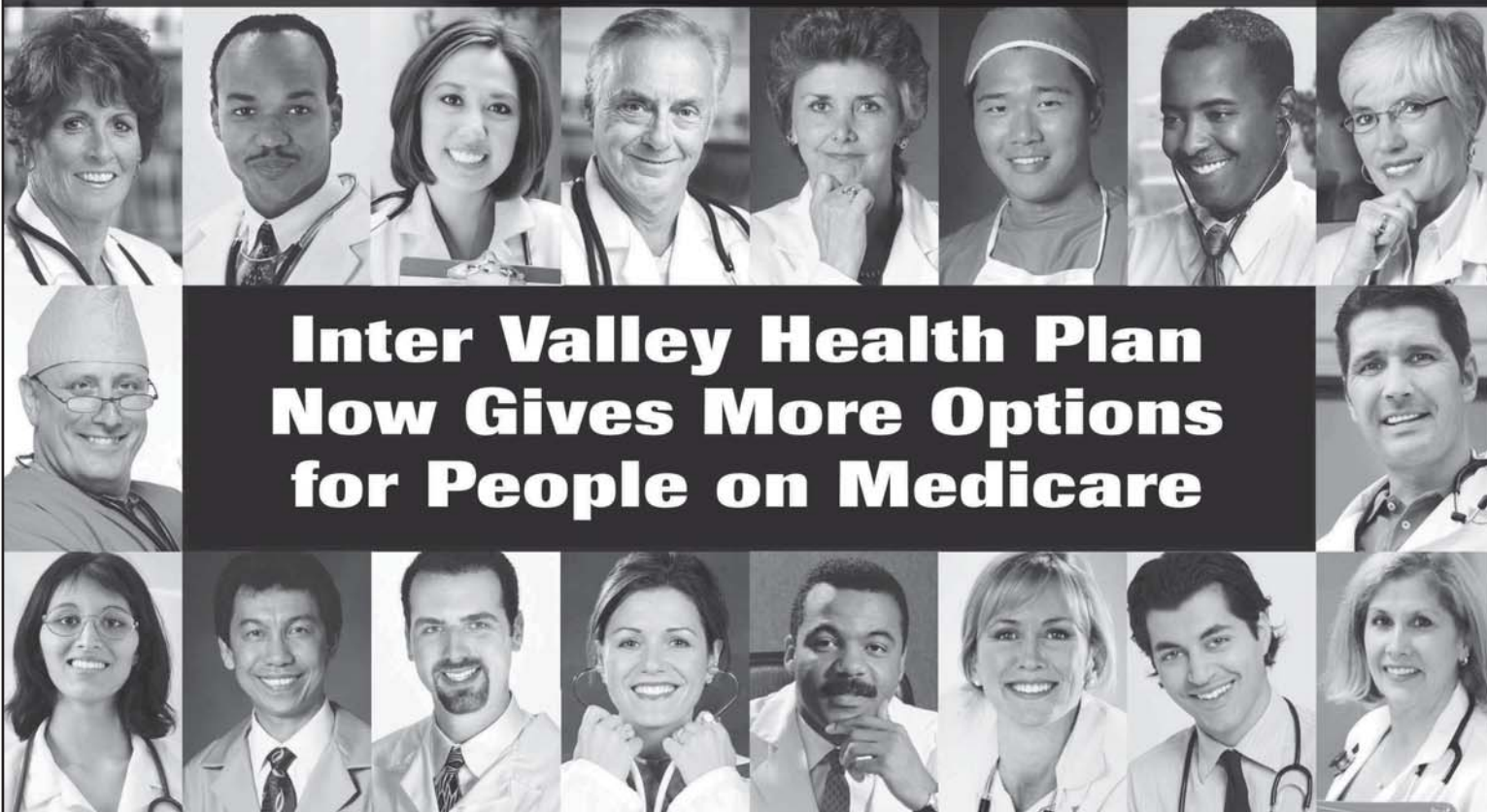
Even with this, one thing is clear: Democrats have one of the richest and most diverse field of candidates as any I can recall. It will be a fascinating campaign to watch.

reporters covering the Bernanke testimony was: if Bernanke simply repeated what the Fed has been saying for months, why did the stock and bond markets do so well in reaction? There are several good reasons. First, Democratic senators were gracious to the Chairman. Some expected a more hostile reception. Second, the Fed is sticking with its forecast of slowing growth and falling inflation, and third, Bernanke's emphasis on the strength of the fourth quarter takes on a whole new meaning as it becomes increasingly clear that the 3.5% advance estimate of GDP growth is going to be revised much lower, perhaps to 2.0%. Finally, it's reassuring to investors to see the Fed Chairman stand firm on the need to resist inflation in the face of even mild political pressure to relax its vigilance.

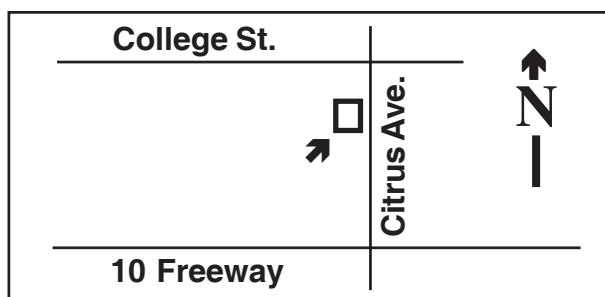

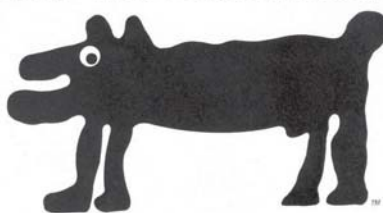

The Glendora City Council has approved a change in the priority of CDBG funding for the 2007-2008 fiscal year. The 2007-2008 One-Year Action Plan and amended 2002-2007 Consolidated Plan will reflect the changes proposed for both documents. The 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan includes a description of the activities, funded with HUD Community Development formula grant funds that will be undertaken during the next year (July 1, 2007-June 30, 2008) to address priority needs. For fiscal year 2007-2008 the City of Glendora anticipates receiving from HUD a total of \$353,842 in CDBG funds. In addition, the City will receive \$75,000 in unallocated funds from Program Income (deferred loan repayments). The total anticipated funds are projected to equal \$428,842 for fiscal year 2007-2008.

The Glendora City Council and the Planning and Redevelopment Department staff are vitally interested in improving and increasing communication with Glendora citizens in the areas of housing and community development.

The approved Annual Action Plan (2007-2008) which incorporates that section of the Five Year Consolidated Plan (2002-2007) and describes the strategy to carry out federal programs is at the following locations throughout the City:

Projects Approved by the Glendora City Council at the February 13, 2007 Council Meeting

For the 2007-2008 fiscal year the following activities were approved by the Glendora City Council at its February 13, 2007 meeting for submittal to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The following information describes the activities approved for funding for the 2007-2008 fiscal year CDBG Program One-Year Action Plan.

A. Housing Rehabilitation and Preservation Programs
Historic Preservation Rehabilitation Grant Program
This program would provide funding to complete repairs on historic buildings within the City of Glendora's designated Historic district. The program provides a maximum \$10,000 grant to correct building code, health and safety violations. It is expected that 3 grants would be completed during the 2007-2008 fiscal year.

Code Enforcement
This program will aid in eliminating substandard housing, removing blighted conditions, promoting property maintenance and insuring conformance with City zoning and building ordinances, as well as State and County health codes in Redevelopment Project Area 3 along the Route 66 corridor between Amelia & Barranca.

B. Public Service Programs
American Red Cross Meals on Wheels Program
The project will provide two nutritious meals Monday through Friday to Glendora residents who are homebound in Glendora. The participants receiving the meals are low and very low-income residents of Glendora. An average of 79 Glendora residents participated in this citywide program on a daily basis during 2004-2005. They expect to serve an average of 35 Glendora residents per month. The American Red Cross is located at 957 North Grand Avenue, Covina.

Citrus College Orfaela Family Children's Center
Funding for this program will provide two and one-half low and moderate income Glendora residents with access to licensed family day care and pre-school services for their children. Glendora families presently make up 20% of the students attending the day care program. Citrus College is located at 1000 West Foothill Boulevard in Glendora.

YWCA - WINGS
The primary goal of the citywide YWCA - WINGS domestic violence program is to provide battered women and their children up to age 18 with emergency shelter and prevention and intervention services. The YWCA is located at in West Covina

Eye-DAS (Eye Diseases Are Serious) by Eye-DAS Foundation
Eye-DAS provides an educational and social environment for adults with vision disorders who reside in the City of Glendora. The visually impaired members meet on a regular basis so that they can be informed about medical and social issues related to their visual problems, made aware of available resources and enjoy interactions with others with visual challenges. Eye-DAS Administrative Offices are located at 150 West Route 66 in Glendora.

Glendora Reads! - Adult Literacy
Provide adult literacy services to 25 new adults including tutoring to Glendora adults over 16 years of age, especially low income adults and at-risk youth. They also sponsor Outreach programs for adults who are homebound or disabled in health care-retirement facilities and the community unable to access onsite library services. The Glendora Library is located at 140 South Glendora Avenue in Glendora.

Project Sister - Senior Citizen Safety Program
Project Sister Sexual Assault Crisis and Prevention Program is implemented citywide. The Senior Safety Program, an educational program strives to increase awareness by seniors on potential risks of being victims of crime including sexual assault, robbery, burglary and financial exploitations. Project Sister also provides a 24-hour crisis hotline, hospital and court accompaniment and individual and group counseling as needed by participants of the program and residents of Glendora. Project Sister's Sexual Crisis and Prevention Program administrative offices are located at 363 South Park Avenue, Suite 303 in Pomona.

Glendora Welfare Association
The Glendora Welfare Association, through Operation Improvement, intervenes with assistance in cases of financial emergency. Food vouchers, motel vouchers, gasoline vouchers, bus tokens, rental assistance and utility payments are issued for short term use. This program is for Glendora residents and is administered Citywide. Glendora Welfare Association is located at 114 North Glendora Avenue, Suite 218, Glendora.

East San Gabriel Valley Coalition for the Homeless
The East San Gabriel Valley Coalition for the Homeless provides emergency shelter and food each night during the cold weather months from mid-November through March. In addition, they provide year round emergency assistance to homeless and "at risk" persons and families such as food, clothing, diapers, hygiene kits, blankets, etc. as well as information and referrals, transportation assistance and social service advocacy. The Coalition is located at 1345 Turnbull Canyon Road in Hacienda Heights. This is a citywide program.

Charter Oak Unified School District-Language Arts Workshops
The Charter Oak Unified School District Language Arts Workshop will provide supplemental instruction at Washington School which includes reading, language, writing and grammar for second through fifth grade students

C. Projects approved by City Council as a result of amending the 2002-2007 Consolidated Plan
Public Improvement Project
The \$198,748 that was approved by the City Council as a part of the 2007-2008 One Year Action Plan will provide for the installation and/or replacement of approximately 135 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) curb ramps at various locations Citywide.

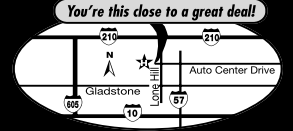
