The Summer Field Research Course is a one-week to two-week experience that takes high school students on a physical and academic journey into one of our spectacular national parks. During the course, students actively learn to think like scientists as they conceive, design, and carry out their own ecological research project and participate in National Park Service research. Students will also learn wilderness travel and camping skills as they hike and sleep under the stars. At the end of the course, students will present their research findings to national park scientists, NatureBridge staff, and other Summer Field Research Course students. Financial aid will be awarded based primarily on the student's financial need, while also taking into account the application completed by the student and the letter of support provided by a teacher or other community leader.
