Policy Note:

- 1. This list of personal protective equipment shall be provided for use in exposure risk areas. These items shall be replaced as used. It shall be the responsibility of the person using the personal protective equipment to replace it.
- a. In all removal vehicles there shall be provided two "Personal Protective Equipment Kits" or one "Personal Protective Equipment Kit" for each employee. The contents of the kits shall be replaced as used upon return to the funeral home. It shall be the responsibility of the person using the personal protective equipment to replace it.
- 2. If any employee has specific personal protective equipment needs regarding fit or special materials to be used because of allergic reactions, such equipment has been made available to that employee.
- 3. It is the responsibility of each employee to be sure that the proper personal protective equipment provided by the funeral home to meet the employee's needs is in good working order or proper repair and that it is readily available to the work area in which an exposure risk would require the use of such equipment.
- 4. The employee must notify his or her manager of the need to repair or replace equipment.
- 5. No employee should attempt to perform job functions requiring personal protective equipment when such equipment is not available or is not in proper condition.
- 6. Personal protective equipment shall comply with the provisions of 29 CFR 1910.132, 29 CFR 1910.133 and 29 CFR 1910.134.
- 7. Personal protective equipment shall be provided at no cost to the employee, by the worksite.
- 8. Funeral home management shall ensure that employees use the appropriate personal protective equipment provided.
