

2009 M1 GARAND RIFLE CLINIC

The NCRPA High Power Rifle M1 Garand Clinic will be on Saturday May 30th, 2009. The clinic will be held at the North Carolina National Guard Training site in Butner, NC on **Range #4**. There are green signs that show the way to the training site. The clinic is hosted by the North Carolina Highpower Rifle Team.

The proceeds of the clinic are used to run the state shooting teams. Expenses include the cost of participation in the National Matches, rifle maintenance, ammunition, junior equipment and expenses, etc.

CLINIC SCHEDULE

8:00 AM—Registration

8:30 AM—Clinic begins with a class work session which will consist of safety, basic positions, operation of the M-1, range commands and target operation. The class will include subjects such as care and cleaning, reloading for competition, equipment, and use of a data book.

11:00 AM—Firing range. Relays one and two on the line, relays three and four in the pits. Participants will fire sighters, record zeros and fire 20 shots prone slow fire, 10 shots prone rapid-fire, 10 shots sitting rapid-fire, and finally 10 shots standing slow-fire. There will then be a pit change and relays three and four will fire while one and two pull targets.

The clinic should be over by approximately 4:00 PM. There will then be a session explaining the North Carolina Civilian Marksmanship Program and the M-1 sales program.

All rifles and ammunition are furnished by the CMP. Members of the North Carolina Rifle Team will instruct and coach. Fees are \$50.00 per day for adults and \$25.00 for Juniors (Juniors are eligible up to their 20th birthday). The Clinic will be held at Range 4 of the National Guard Training Center, Butner, NC. Brass will become the property of the person participating in the clinic. Clips will be retained for future use.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Early registration is encourage since the clinic is likely to fill up.

Bring your own food and drinks. None will be available on the range. You may wish to bring a stool or chair for the seminar portion. On arriving at the range, bring equipment with you to the pits as you may not have time to return to your vehicle.

Participants may use their own ammunition if preferred. Ammunition issued will be .30 cal. (30-06) M-2 Ball.

Shooting stools, coats, mats, spotting scopes, etc. are not necessary, but would be nice if you have them.

Participants are required to operate targets and police the range and pits upon completion of firing.

On arrival at the clinic, report to the statistical office in the pits to confirm squadding.

While membership in the NRA and NCRPA is not required, it is strongly encouraged.

Directions to 1000 Yard Firing Range at Camp Butner

- 1.) **Take I-85 North** from Durham.
- 2.) Take **exit 191** (Hwy. 56).
- 3.) **Turn left** at the stoplight at the end of the exit ramp.
- 4.) **Drive .4 miles**, and **turn right** at the first stop light. This is **33rd street**, but there is no street sign at this intersection. You will know you are close to the intersection when you cross over some railroad tracks.
- 5.) **After drive 2.1 miles** you will come to a **stop sign**, and then **turn left**. This is Hwy. 75.
- 6.) **Drive .35 miles** and **turn right**. You will see a **sign** on your left that reads, "**N.C. National Guard Camp Butner Training Site.**"
- 7.) **Drive 2.2 miles** and **turn right** on **W. Range 4 Rd.** Note you will pass an old armored personnel carrier (APC) on your right before you turn right. **DO NOT** turn right at the road immediately after the APC.
- 8.) **After no more than 50 yards** or so, **take your first right** at the **sign** that reads, "**S. Range 4 Rd., 1000 yard firing line.**" This is a dirt road. This road will go through a tight left-hand turn after about 100 yards and its name changes to **E. Range Rd.** Continue straight down this road, which parallels the firing range, until you come to the first group of people on your left on the firing range, or continue to the pits.
