

TOPIC



Throughout history, artists have told visual stories about subjects as diverse as family history, the horrors of war, the changing seasons, and human oppression. Today, book covers and illustrations, narrative quilts, political cartoons, and conceptual art are just a few examples of designs with narrative emphasis." 
DESCRIPTION:
