



Concurrent Enrollment Options Agreement and Registration Form

- You have indicated that you are interested in enrolling in one or more college course(s) while a high school student. The State of Colorado provides several options for high school students who meet high school standards to begin college prior to graduating high school. The purposes of these options include promoting content standards, providing academic challenges and providing access to academic courses that may not be available at a local high school to meet high school graduation requirements. MSU Denver offers three concurrent enrollment options for high school students who meet the requirements and are approved by their high school counselor or principal.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT OPTIONS at MSU Denver:

- **ASCENT.** The 5th year ASCENT program allows you to take a full schedule of college course work immediately following your senior year of high school. High school students under twenty-one years of age, who have met all district's graduation requirements, have completed 12 college credit hours, and do not need remediation are eligible for this program. To enroll at an eligible post-secondary institution a student must have completed the minimum course prerequisites and all required assessments.
- **CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT.** High school students under twenty-one years of age, enrolled in the 9th - 12th grade in a school district, who demonstrate academic preparedness, are eligible for the concurrent enrollment program. Students enrolled in 12th grade at a school district may enroll in remedial courses, if approved by the school district. If a high school student is retained for instructional purposes in the 12th grade, they may not enroll in more than 9 credits concurrently during the repeat year. To enroll at an eligible post-secondary institution a student must have completed the minimum course prerequisites and all required assessments.
- **STUDENT EDUCATION & ENRICHMENT (SEE).** High school students 16 years or older may enroll in college courses at MSU Denver as a non-degree-seeking students under the SEE Program. To enroll at an eligible post-secondary institution a student must have completed the minimum course prerequisites and all required assessments. ***These enrollments are not state-funded under the School Finance Act.*** The student is not entitled to tuition reimbursement by the school district. Home-schooled students may participate in the SEE Program.

CHECKLIST for Enrolling in a Concurrent Enrollment Program at MSU Denver:

- Submit completed Concurrent Enrollment Options Agreement Registration Form.** All students must complete and submit this form to be eligible for Concurrent Enrollment at MSU Denver. This form must be submitted for every semester the student is interested in enrolling as a concurrently enrolled Student.
- Submit Application for Admissions to MSU Denver.** In addition to the Agreement Registration Form, all students must submit an Application for Admission along with a \$25.00 **nonrefundable** application fee to be considered for a Concurrent Enrollment Program at MSU Denver. You can obtain an application from your high school counselor or by going to www.mscd.edu/admissions and click on "Printable Application 2012-13"
- Submit Test Scores.** Students who do not have ACT/SAT scores or have below college level scores, must take the Accuplacer Tests at our Assessment and Testing Center, located in Tivoli 347 or contact them for an appointment at 303-556-3677.

- Submit COF Application Form.** All post-secondary students must fill out and submit the College Opportunity Fund application online at www.CollegeinColorado.org
- Attend New Student Orientation.** All new concurrently enrolled students must complete a new student orientation. Contact the New Student Orientation Office at 303-556-6931 to reserve a space. When signing up, be sure to tell the orientation staff that you are a Concurrently Enrolled High School Student.
- Meet with an Academic Advisor and Register for Classes.** Contact Lucinda Conde in the Academic Advising Center at the Student Success Building, Room 170, 303-556- 3077 or conde@mscd.edu
- Pay Tuition and Fees.** Students under the ASCENT and Concurrent Enrollment Program will be responsible for all books, course materials and college fees. As long as the student receives a "C" or better in his/her course(s), the school district will pay the community college tuition rate for each course and the student/parent will pay the remainder of the tuition. Students under the SEE Program will be responsible for books, course materials, tuition and fees. Please contact Henry Nguyen at 303-556-6235 from the Bursar's Office for any questions.

The student is responsible to meet all application, registration and payment deadlines at MSU Denver.

NOTE: Students who register for classes after the Priority Registration Deadline will have a Late Registration Fee of \$100 added to their tuition which the student and parent may be responsible for.
