Councillor Curran said he had been contacted by a member of the public who owned land which backed onto the Council's site for development of the new leisure facility. He said this person informed that they had never at any stage been approached to ascertain if their land was for sale.

Mr McCall advised that Councillor Curran provide him with relevant details in order to clarify this matter.

On the proposal of Councillor Patterson seconded by Councillor McCreesh it was agreed to approve the above Report and the recommendations contained therein.

Arising out of the above Building Control Committee Meeting, it was agreed the following matter be referred to the Technical/Environmental Services Committee Meeting for discussion: -

1. Erection of Street Name Plates

Mr Shanks advised that at the Building Control Committee Meeting held on Tuesday 10 March 2009 it had been recommended to defer the following recommendation for discussion at the Technical/Environmental Services Committee Meeting on 23 March 2009: -

"That due to limited resources for the incoming year, the Council delay the erection of replacement dual language name plates until the end of 2009 after which the erection of same would be subject to resources being available to purchase the name plates."

Mr Shanks explained that the budget for the erection of street name plates had been reduced from £10,000 to £5,000 for the 2009/2010 financial year and that due to the limited resources available it was proposed to delay the erection of replacement dual street name plates until the end of 2009 and that priority instead be given to erecting missing nameplates, in particular in rural areas.

Considerable discussion then followed during which several Members expressed concern at the recommendations as they did not wish to see the policy for the erection of dual language street name plates altered.

Mr Shanks stated that the proposal did not involve over-turning or amending the policy but was to seek approval to prioritise dealing with those name plates which are missing.

After further discussion a recorded vote was taken on the above recommendation i.e. "That due to limited resources for the incoming year, the Council delay the erection of replacement dual language name plates until the end of 2009 after which the erection of same would be subject to resources being available to purchase the name plates."

A recorded vote was then taken and voting was as follows: - (Copy attached)

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

T.E.S/57/2009: - ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MONTHLY REPORT

Environmental Health for the month of March 2009. (Copy circulated)

On the proposal of Councillor Reilly seconded by Councillor Mussen it was agreed to approve the above Report and the recommendations contained therein.

The following issues were then raised and referred to the Environmental Health Section: -

1. Diesel Laundering Waste

Councillor Mussen expressed concern at the huge amount of diesel laundering waste which was illegally dumped across the District and which was costing the rate-payers huge amounts of money to clear up. He said this material was unfortunately sometimes illegally dumped in very scenic areas throughout the District and he requested the Council meet with the relevant enforcement agency as he was concerned there did not appear to be satisfactory progress made in apprehending those responsible for this illegal dumping. He suggested this matter be discussed at the next Meeting of the Environmental Control Committee.

Mr Farrell confirmed he would provide Councillor Mussen with the relevant costs associated with the removal of illegally dumped diesel laundering waste and added that the amount of waste from diesel laundering being dumped had considerably decreased over the past number of years.

It was agreed the relevant enforcement agency be invited to attend an appropriate Meeting of the Environmental Control Committee to discuss the issue of illegal dumping of diesel laundering waste.

2. Water Testing - NI Water

Councillor Reilly referred to water testing which had been carried out in the Kilkeel area and asked for an explanation as to the difference in "a satisfactory result" and a "highly satisfactory" result.

Mr Farrell explained that a "satisfactory result" depended on the bacterial count and if there was a presence of pathogenic organisms.

3. Interruption to Water Supply – Kilkeel Area

Councillor Reilly referred to the continual interruption to water supply and poor water pressure in the surrounding area of Cranfield and Kilkeel which he said was particularly bad during holiday periods whenever the Caravan Park would be busy and he asked that the Environmental Health Department arrange to have this matter investigated with NI Water.

Councillor Hanna said he had received several complaints regarding poor water pressure in the Kilkeel area. He said the same homes appeared to be affected and was creating a terrible inconvenience for homeowners and especially farmers who had to look after livestock. He said this problem had been ongoing for the past 5 to 6 years.

Councillor W Burns agreed with the sentiments expressed by the previous speakers regarding interruption to water supply and poor water pressure in the Kilkeel area. He said work which was to have been carried out had never been done and he requested that Water Service be instructed to have the necessary works carried out as a matter of priority in order to have the problems regarding water supply and pressure resolved.

It was agreed the Environmental Health Department urgently contact NI Water requesting that necessary works be carried out to resolve water supply problems in the Kilkeel area, as a matter of priority.

On the proposal of Councillor Reilly seconded by Councillor Hanna it was agreed to approve the above Reports and the recommendations contained therein.

The following issues were then raised and referred to the Technical/Leisure Department: -

1. <u>Swimming Lessons</u>

Councillor Reilly said he had received complaints in relation to Private Sector use of the swimming pool at Kilkeel Leisure Centre for swimming lessons and he said this matter needed to be resolved.

It was agreed Councillor Reilly be provided with an update regarding this issue.

2. Play Area – Mourne Esplanade, Kilkeel

Councillor Reilly said that the Mayor of Council had requested a Meeting to discuss the Play Area at Mourne Esplanade, Kilkeel but added that this Meeting had still not been convened.

Mr McManus said he had received no further information to date with regard to the Play Area at Mourne Esplanade, Kilkeel.

It was agreed Councillor Reilly be kept updated regarding this matter.

3. Illicit Dumping - Nicholson's Road, Kilkeel

Councillor Reilly referred to illicit dumping at Nicholson's Road, Kilkeel. He said dumping has been a major problem at this location and said he understood the Council had

previously agreed to repair the perimeter fence which he believed would resolve this issue and would be inexpensive to carry out.

It was agreed this matter be investigated and a Report be issued back to Councillor Reilly in due course.

4. Annalong Harbour

Councillor Reilly expressed concern at the fact that a business case was required for carrying out works to Annalong Harbour, yet large amounts of money was being spent in other areas of the District each year without the requirement for a business case.

5. <u>Bus Shelter – Cloughreagh, Bessbrook</u>

Councillor McGinn referred to the survey of residents of Cloughreagh Park, Bessbrook regarding the installation of a bus shelter at Cloughreagh. He said it was disappointing that following the survey it had been agreed not to proceed with installing a shelter as he said this was a very busy pick-up area for buses although he said it was understandable that there did seem to be a fear among residents of having bus shelters erected in their areas.

6. Community Floral Grants

Councillor McGinn said it was important that groups and organisations clearly understood how the Community Floral Grant System would work and he asked for clarification.

Mr McManus explained that previously the Council issued letters to Community Groups inviting them to apply for the Community Floral Grant and he said that arrangements would be done on a similar basis for the incoming new financial year.

7. Newry Canal

Councillor Curran referred to the recent Countryfile programme which focused on the restoration work which had been carried out on many waterways throughout Europe. He said Newry Canal was one of the oldest waterways and he believed that there should be more positive measures taken to have this waterway opened up.

8. Land at Riverside Crescent, Bessbrook

Councillor McCreesh referred to the proposed re-development of Council property at Riverside Crescent, Bessbrook and asked if outstanding matters had been resolved.

Mr McManus explained that following a Site Meeting held on Wednesday 11 March 2009 there had been no reference made to further costs. He confirmed the contractor went on site quite quickly after it had been agreed to proceed with the works.
