That number is up about 30 percent compared to 2010, when 116 campuses received the designation. Responding to Shorter Days, Trees Absorb Less Carbon-A study led by Colorado State University's William Bauerle shows trees absorb less carbon than earlier thought. Tree leaves, responding to shorter days, simply do not fix the planet's fast-rising carbon dioxide levels to the extent that scientists earlier assumed, the nine researchers write.
