The story begins with a strong attention getter such as a quote or description of the event(s) to draw readers in and hook them on the story.		
Sources of information and quotes are accurately cited/credited throughout the story.		
Quotes utilized in the story help to make reader's empathize with the person/group being profiled.		
Story presents a unique angle that might not be covered in a general news story.		
Written stories are free of spelling, grammar and punctuation errors.		
Podcasts/video stories are well rehearsed and presented using a strong, clear voice and correct grammar and pronunciation.
