Position Descriptions

Teacher: those who are certified to teach children and do so for the organization being represented. This includes classroom teachers, ESL teachers, bilingual teachers, Title I teachers, special education teachers, etc. The critical descriptors are: **instructional responsibilities** and **certification**, for that purpose.

Para-Professional/Aide: those who assist school district professional staff in any capacity other than instructional. This can include school-community liaisons, social-work aides, or translators. This role is defined by its exclusion of actual in or out-of-class instructional responsibility.

Other: all positions not specified. This includes adult education teachers, school psychologists, counselors, students, secretaries, etc.
