Graduation Update

Dear SRHS parents and family members,

This information will be mailed out ASAP. Below is important information about graduation this year:

- Graduation will be held at Bailey Field at Santa Rosa Junior College on Friday, June 5th at 6:30 p.m.
- Every graduating senior is allowed to pick up six free graduation tickets in the Business Office. Due to capacity issues, two additional tickets are available for purchase for ten dollars each. Ticket prices have increased due to cost increases.
- Beginning May 1st, Santa Rosa High School will only accept cash, cashier's checks, or money orders for payment in the Business Office.
- Seniors must pick up their graduation tickets by June 1st in the Business Office. Any tickets not picked up will be open to the public and sold to families that would like to purchase more tickets.
- Every person, regardless of age, even infants and newborns, needs a ticket in order to attend graduation. This allows enough seats for everyone and to have an accurate population count.
- Seniors must return their cap, gown and tassel in excellent condition on Monday, June 8th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the Attendance Office in order to receive their thirty dollar (cap, gown and tassel) deposit back.
- There will be a mandatory senior meeting on April 29th to discuss graduation and the 25 Day Rule.
- Graduation rehearsal is mandatory for all seniors!
- We encourage all seniors to attend Project Grad. For more information on Project Grad, please see the Panther Purr or go to santarosahighschool.net.

Four AQ Students Clinch NATIONAL Scholastic Arts Awards


ArtQuest is pleased to announce that four Advanced Placement Studio Art students have won at the National level in the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards for 2015. The four were all from the ArtQuest Visual Fine Arts specialty area. Tyler Gonzales won Silver for his portfolio of 8 works and also Silver for his self-portrait paper dolls, with costumes of various musicians. A Silver went to Miles MacDiarmid for his large-scale charcoal monument drawing, titled "Chimp Games" and Megan Ramirez won Gold for her drawing with watercolor, "Spaghetti Cheeks." Kate Trapnell took Gold for her self-portrait paper dolls with costumes of notable American Women, and also Silver for her piece, "Living Room Diptych." The winning students, their very happy teacher, Brooke Delello, several of their parents and a grandparent, plan to attend the congratulatory weekend in New York City this June, which includes a celebration of the national award winners at Carnegie Hall. All four students plan to attend four-year colleges and all have received large scholarships. Both Tyler and Megan are deciding between Cornish and S.F. Art Institute (SFAI), Miles is leaning toward SFAI and Kate will attend Oberlin. This is only the second year that ArtQuest students have entered the Scholastic Art & Writing Competition. They also garnered 59 Awards at the regional level earlier this year. The Scholastic competition identifies teenagers with exceptional artistic or literary skill and promise, and brings their remarkable work to a national audience. It is the longest-running, most prestigious recognition program for creative teens in the U.S.; noteworthy past winners have included the likes of Andy Warhol, Truman Capote, Richard Avedon, Joyce Carol Oates, Robert Redford and Stephen King. Congratulations to these four students - you are all certainly in good company!

AQ 21st Spring Showcase Looks Back 20 Years and a Blast From the Past

April 2nd was a great night and celebrating the first 20 years of ArtQuest was definitely in the air, on the screen and in lots of other works shown! Miles MacDiarmid, Advanced Placement Studio Art and AQ Visual Fine Arts student, was lauded on stage as the winning entry for the Showcase poster image. With the poster's image of an eight-armed man holding icons of each of the AQ Arts Specialties, it captured the essence of the AQ anniversary. Miles was awarded a \$250 prize from AQ and Friends of AQ for his achievement. Performances in the Auditorium during the first part of the show included two beautiful pieces by the SRHS Orchestra and two lovely works by the Chamber Singers. Emcee Annie Samuels, AQ English teacher, kept the show rolling and Jan Sofie, AQ Director discussed the significance of ArtQuest's 20 year mark and the importance of authentic Arts Education at school. The AQ Dance Company performed an in-process contemporary performance piece depicting a family gathered at a table and their challenging relationships, which Ms. Samuels quipped "kind of reminded her of an AQ staff meeting!" ArtQuest@20, a video produced by an AQ Video Arts student crew and directed by Advanced Video student, Alex Rennie, was a highlight of the night. Portraying the last twenty AQ themes through a lens of humor, the film focused on capturing the essence of each year in about 30 seconds or so and culminated in a "more perfect union" (from last year's theme) of a few hundred AQ students tuning into the call of AQ and running out to gather together on the front steps of Desoto Hall to hold up individual white flags forming a giant number "20", with fireworks exploding all around them. AQ Theatre Arts students performed excerpts from their last few plays and other selected scenes and pieces in the Black Box Theatre. Timebased media from Digital Arts and Video Arts was screened in the Library Computer Lab to an enthusiastic crowd and Core projects were displayed in the main part of the Library. The Multipurpose Room was filled, as usual, with a long line to see the incredible works by Digital Arts, Photography and Visual Fine Arts students. The Main Building hallway was also an exciting exhibition space this year, with large-scale Digital Arts self-portraits hung all along the upper wall and multiple display cases filled with interesting works from all of the visual arts disciplines. Another new element for 2015 was the photo booth provided by "A Flying Camera" which gave everyone a chance to pose for photos with their friends, with each photo strip having an imprint of the Showcase event as a memoir. HUGE thanks go out to the Friends of ArtQuest Board and its many volunteers who helped make the event such a success. A very special thank you to Christi Corradi, Friends of AQ Volunteer Coordinator, for her extra efforts in helping make everything go smoothly. Here's to the next 20 years of Arts Education excellence at AQ and SRHS!

For the second year in a row, and out of the three years they've competed, ArtQuest Video Arts students have taken first-in-the-state at the SkillsUSA California Conference. The team of **Sequoia Cipes** and **Spencer Cortright** won the Gold for their Television (Video) Production PSA on the theme "SkillsUSA- Agents of Change." The team of **Sunce Franicevic** and **Luis Vazquez** took the Silver medal in the same contest category. SRHS Internetworking students took the state gold for the sixth year in a row, out of their six years of competition! The Gold Medal winner was **Austin Le** and the Silver Medal went to **Ruben Flota**. Also, a SRHS alumnus, James Webb, was the Gold Medal winner in Post-Secondary Internetworking. Over 2000 students competed in San Diego in the April event in over 100 job skill and leadership competitions. Only Gold Medal winners can compete at the Skills USA Nationals and represent California and their high schools. First Time AQ Alumni Part of Academy Award-Winning Film

CITIZENFOUR, the film about Edward Snowden and his allegations that the NSA was conducting unauthorized surveillance of U.S. citizens, *won* the 2015 Academy Award for best full-length documentary film. As reported in the March 2015 issue of the Panther Purr, two one-time AQ students, **Jacob Appelbaum** and **Leif Ryge** were involved in the making of the film. Directed by <u>Laura Poitras</u> and shot in Hong Kong, the film documents the first interviews of Snowden by journalist Glen Greenwald. "Citizenfour" refers to the name that Snowden used when he first contacted Poitras about his assertions. Both Appelbaum and Ryge were enrolled in the late 1990s in what was then called AQ Multimedia (an AQ Arts Specialty since divided into Digital Arts and Video Arts) and currently reside in Berlin. Appelbaum is in the cast and shown lecturing about what he says is the increasing invasion of citizens' privacy by the US government. Ryge worked on the crew and directly with director Poitras on research and in other capacities and is individually recognized in the credits.

(A lot of) information about Project Graduation Reservations

The reservation forms for the Project Grad party are available - on the website, in this Panther Purr, and in the main office. Please take a moment and read the following guidelines to smooth the reservation process for your student. STUDENTS ARE NOT ISSUED "TICKETS" – they are added to the reservation database, and they will receive a wristband at the door. Please have your student check the Project Grad "reserved" list on the wall outside the attendance office a few days after they have turned in reservation form to make sure they are on list. This Reserved List will begin to be posted about May 18.

/*/ BOTH /*/ student and parent or guardian /*/ MUST SIGN /*/ the reservation contract area. Each year, many reservations are delayed due to the lack of a parent/guardian and/or student signature. Even though there is language in the contract that seems to contradict the requirement for both signatures, we need to know that both the parent/guardian AND the student are aware of the rules and guidelines for the party, and the signatures acknowledge this.

The senior class this year is large – <u>please make sure that you follow the instructions on the reservation form to</u> <u>make sure your payment is properly recorded</u> – put your student's name on the memo line of the check AND write the check number in the space indicated on the form. If possible, <u>please return your student's reservation</u> <u>form and payment in a sealed envelope, and avoid the use of staples</u>. Paper clips are preferable to staples if you are not using an envelope. The forms are to be returned to the main office – Project Grad has a mailbox on the wall to the right as you enter the main office.

<u>Project Grad is a celebration for the entire SRHS Senior Class 2015 – it is not limited to graduates only</u>. If your student has had academic or other difficulty and will not be "walking" in the graduation ceremony, they are still encouraged to attend Project Grad and celebrate the year with their class!

The reservation for the party is \$70 which includes EVERYTHING at the party. Students only need to bring their ID that night – no money is required after they have their reservation. **If your student needs financial assistance,** the principals will have scholarship forms. <u>NO STUDENT IS TURNED AWAY FROM PROJECT GRAD FOR LACK OF FUNDS</u>!

<u>Please plan on submitting your student's reservation by the middle of May</u>. The last minute reservations create problems. Last year, over 40 students bought their tickets "at the door" – we want as close to 100% participation as possible, but waiting until the last minute makes it difficult to properly register the students for the event. This is a safety issue as well as a logistical issue – if a student registers at the door and there is a health concern, it is difficult to get that information to all of the staff at the last minute.

In addition, students earn bonus Grand Prize raffle tickets for <u>early reservations</u>. Students who reserve on the final week of school, or register at the door, will NOT be eligible for hourly prizes, but can still earn regular Grand Prize raffle tickets during the party. Grand Prizes last year included A JOB (!), a \$250 GAS CARD, FLAT-SCREEN TV, DORM REFRIGERATOR, ELECTRIC BICYCLE, and MANY, MANY MORE! This year proves to be just as exciting!

- **Completion of the SRHS Athletic Packets:** These packets can be found in the main office at SRHS, from the coaches, or online at www.santarosahigh.net/athletics The packet is 15 pages long with a lot of important information regarding SRHS athletics and the expectations we have for our students athletes, and their parents/ guardians. The last 4 pages in <u>this packet that must be turned into the Athletic Director two weeks</u> prior to the first day of practice. The Athletic Director's box is located in the main office.
- A current sports physical dated after June 2015: Part of the athletic packet that is turned into us is a physical examination printout from your doctor's office, which is filled out and signed by your physician documenting your student is physically healthy and cleared for the rigors of a high school athletic team. This physical is good for the full year. If your student participates in more than one sport during the year, he/she does not need to submit a new athletic packet or a new doctor's clearance.
- Eligibility: Your student is a student first and foremost and must have received a 2.0 grade point average from their second semester coursework in the spring. Probation may be a possibility for student athletes who earned a 1.5 GPA or higher for the semester if they earned a 2.0 GPA or higher for the 3rd quarter report card, and they have not been on probation in grades 10-12. Note: New students to SRHS from another high school or incoming 9th graders from a non-SRCS campus must physically bring the Athletic Director their report card from last year. This report card must have both 3rd quarter and the 2nd semester grades posted. For further questions, please contact the athletic director.

Santa Rosa High School Athletics Donation Request

Dear Parents/Guardians,

A school's athletic program is a valuable activity that contributes to a student's overall educational experience. SRHS Athletes can earn high school P.E. credit

Santa Rosa City School's Board has approved Administrative Regulation 6146.11 Alternative Credits toward graduation, last year. What this regulation states is that any SRHS Student Athlete who participates on a sanctioned CIF team, can earn 5 credits of P.E. for this participation. Athletes can earn up to 10 total credits for their high school participation but before an athlete can earn any credits through athletics, the athlete must have completed 10 credits prior to the start of the sanctioned sport. Once the regular season ends for the athlete, the coach of that sport will forward all eligible names to administration for awards of credit. Athletes cannot miss more than 10 days of practice to be eligible for credits toward graduation. **The athlete will not have to deal with any paperwork to receive credits. All paperwork will be dealt with through coaches/administration/athletic directors/counselors.** Counselors will be given information on approved student athletes and they will add these credits to their transcript upon receiving approval through administration once checking their eligibility. Students can ask their coach if they are eligible at the end of the season. They can then monitor by checking on the Home Access Center (HAC). If they have any questions or concerns after the season is completed, they may contact Ms. Valente, the Assistant Principal in charge, at dvalente@srcs.kt2.ca.us.

Loss of Transportation Fees

Prior to June, 2013, any student who was interested in participating in a SRHS sport, was required to pay a \$50 "transportation fee." Santa Rosa City Schools is supporting the Federal and State Government in making athletics programs accessible for all by no longer charging a "transportation fee" per sport. Whereas, SRHS supports accessibility for all in all their programs, SRHS is also very aware that the financial loss of the transportation fee is going to be devastating for our athletic programs. This means more burden will be placed on parents'/guardians' shoulders to help the programs continue. Parents/Guardians will be needed to volunteer to drive athletes to meets/ games, to support fund-raising with which our children will be asked to be involved, and in many other ways. In the end, our students will continue to receive the huge benefits of being involved in extracurricular sports and, as parents, we will be more involved with our children.

Concussion Testing At SRHS

For the 2014-2015 School year, SRCS base-line concussion tested over eight hundred athletes. This was the second year this process was offered to SRCS athletes in its history. This testing is not new, but the process is very new to athletic directors, coaches, parents, and athletes. The information garnered during baseline testing was used later for athletes who were suspected of receiving a concussion during a match/game.

SRCS will continue to baseline test our athletes for the 2015-2016 school year. Sports being tested are: football, soccer, basketball, softball, volleyball, and baseball. Once an athlete completes a single baseline a year, he/she is not required to perform the test again that year unless injury occurs.

As a mother of a daughter who was knocked unconscious after hitting the floor from a brutal hit from an opponent, I was thankful for the opportunity to compare her baseline with her injury test. As a parent, it was a tangible piece of information that helped me gauge her brain's healing process.
