Re: Proposal for Family Retreat Program for Combat Veterans and Families

Dear Capt. Lambert:

Thank you for your request to submit a letter of proposal to the PAARNG regarding our plans for the Family Retreat program at Beacon Lodge Camp. PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp board of directors, staff, other Lions and interested individuals are currently developing plans to present **Project New Hope at Beacon Lodge**; a new program dedicated to the needs of disabled combat veterans. All U.S. combat veterans and their families will be welcome.

The goal of **Project New Hope at Beacon Lodge** is to expand the services provided by the camp for the past 65 years to the blind and handicapped residents of Pennsylvania to include a retreat program for veterans and their family members to deal with their lives after wartime service.

Project New Hope at Beacon Lodge Camp, located in Mount Union, PA in central Pennsylvania, offers an ideal outdoor retreat that encompasses 583 acres of scenic mountain woodland with fully accessible facilities, accommodations and activities. The camp offers two areas of housing at the camp available to veterans and their families to relax and enjoy the peaceful surroundings, while also offering the opportunity to hear guest speakers and participate in activities that include a large outdoor pavilion, playground, outdoor heated swimming pool that is wheelchair-accessible, lake for fishing and paddle-boating, nature trails, camping facilities, archery/22 rifle range, climbing tower, zip line and much more. It is a wonderful facility – a perfect place for **Project New Hope!**

PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp has five full time employees who run the office, the camp, and maintain the facilities. Other part-time personnel are hired as temporary help during the camping season. Efforts are being made to identify Federal, State and Local resources to support and run Project New Hope at Beacon Lodge. Consideration should be given to governmental agencies, local volunteers, National Guard and Reserve Units, veteran's service employees, veteran's center and hospital staff, other veterans support groups and local medical personnel. Project New Hope at Beacon Lodge will furnish accommodations and present activities in a relaxed atmosphere where veterans and families will be provided supportive,

educational, and recreational opportunities. The facilities in both the upper and lower sections of the camp can accommodate between 20-25 families. Project New Hope at Beacon Lodge can offer a weekend retreat, or a week long camping experience. The inaugural session of Project New Hope at Beacon Lodge has been scheduled for Labor Day weekend 2014, August 28th through the 31st.


Committee members are currently researching grants and other funding opportunities to make the camping session free of charge to the attendees.
