1. Proposed variation

To facilitate offsite surveillance for the 1st Annual surveillance audit of this fishery.

2. Rationale/Justification

There have been no significant changes to operational practices in this fishery - in terms of gear or area of fishing - and the fishery remains within scope.

There are no Principle 1 conditions, two conditions for Principle 2 and one condition for Principle 3 conditions for this fishery assessment. All key information to carry out the surveillance, including updated management advice, is available remotely and interpretation is not compromised by carrying out the surveillance audit in this way. The client will also provide all relevant information required by the assessment team.

We will contact all stakeholders to inform them that the surveillance will be carried out remotely. They will still be given the opportunity to request to speak to the assessment team if necessary. The additional time requested will enable the assessment team to fully and accurately complete the report to be submitted to the MSC for publication on the MSC website.
