



(NEW FEATURE) HOW I DID IT

We are trying to get some more information out to our readers about how some of the first place photographs in the N4C monthly competition were taken. **Elephant Chases Safari Truck... by Barbara Mal-Ion (page 4)**

When you are on a Safari, the camera is ready. I was on a Safari with Overseas Adventure Travel. We were stopped by a bunch of elephants on the road in Tarangiri National Park in Tanzania. Rules are that animals have the right of way at all times. The matriarch moved off the road and then charged our vehicle. I was the closest one to that. Then she did some weird things with her trunk until the other vehicle in our party took advantage of the elephants being out of the road and zoomed around us. So she charged them and I was in the prime location for this shot. I did some minor correcting of color, exposure and cropping. My camera is a Digital Rebel XT and I was using a 75-300 IS Canon Lens.

The Raven by Tom Crouse (page 9t)

It was pretty much a straight shot, except I added the raven and enhanced the fog in the background, after a black & white conversion. The ravens were all over the place but I couldn't get one to land where I wanted him so I took a picture of one and layered him in. The added fog was done by painting with a middle gray at low opacity and in "dissolve" mode on a separate layer and blurring it a bit. It was shot at Glendalough, Ireland on what was already a pretty spooky day. **Female African Lion with Warthog by Richard Finn** (page 9)

We were on an early morning photo shoot in Zimbabwe when our guide/driver stopped our Land Rover and pointed out what seemed to be a small dot in the distance. We waited for the longest time as the dot approached us. The dot turned out to be a female lion carrying a freshly killed young warthog. To my amazement the lion walked right in front of our Land Rover without even giving us a look. I must say our guide had told us not to move or make any sounds. The lion went about 50 feet past us into the brush where she had a half eaten cape buffalo. We asked the guide why she would go after a small warthog. He told us "she wanted a snack."

How N4C Projected Images Will Be Handled for FotoClave 2009

1) Each club will set up a competition on its ICM website for each of the 5 Divisions (Pictorial, Nature, Creative, Travel, Journalism). The Group Name selected for these might be FotoClave. These should probably be set up soon so that members can start submitting.

2) Members will submit their FotoClave images to these competitions in the usual fashion. It doesn't matter what the member's Level is; all Levels will be transformed into Masters when the images are submitted by the club to the N4C website. The only restriction on the number of images submitted by a member is "something reasonable", which I interpret to mean not more than approximately 20 per Division. Each club may make its own rules on this. However, no images may be submitted that were "accepted" by FotoClave previously (that is, entries that were sent to the final FotoClave judging as part of the 20 winners for each Division). The members are not allowed to submit Sequences.

A list of images to be automatically entered from the 2008 N4C Annual winners will be distributed to club representatives so that the members can avoid duplicating their images.

3) By Aug. 1 each club will submit all the images collected to the appropriate N4C FotoClave competition (by Division, of course). At this time, the submitting club will submit all its images to the Masters Level. The instructions for doing this are contained in Larry Salveson's training video available at http://host.photoclubservices.com/PhotoClubVideos/Foto-ClaveFromClubs/FotoClaveFromClubs.html.

4) A few days later (you'll be notified by email), the competitions will be ready for downloading by the clubs assigned to do the judging. These are:

Alameda
Rossmoor
Berkeley
Diablo Valley
Millbrae

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The club should download only the competition it is to judge; downloading all the competitions would take too much time. Details of how to do this will be distributed later.

A club member will be given authorization to access the N4C website for this purpose. The name of the member should be submitted to me before Aug. 1.

5) The club will conduct its judging and select 20 winners for the Division it is judging. The order of the winners is im-

material and these winners should be given the HM designation. The only restriction is that in each Division no member shall receive more than 2 winning designations.

6) How the judging is done is up to the club, as indicated in the documents from Joan Field. The Division results must be uploaded via ICM by Sept. 10. Again, specify only the competition you are responsible for by selecting it in ICM before doing the upload. Also send me an email indicating that you have sent the results.

Alternatively, the club may send me its results via YouSendIt in a Zip file containing all the files obtained by doing an Export Competition with the Export Definition set to "Default Export All Fields" and with the "Copy selected image files to Output Folder" and "Export All Places and All Honorable Mentions" boxes checked.

7) After receiving all the winners, I'll place the files on a CD to send to SJVCCC along with any necessary documentation.

8) The only section of this writeup that actually applies directly to members is (2); the rest covers the administration of the competitions.

How I Did It (Continued)

Embarcadero Fragment #2 by John Goyer (page 8) This image started as an ultra-wide shot looking down at a spiral stair case in the Embarcadero Center. The image was then rotated 90 degrees and duplicated to produce the mask-like image. The walkway leading to the staircase can be seen going to the right and left. I used some spherize filtering in photoshop to add depth to the image, and vignetted it to darken the edges - saturation was boosted to add more color interest. I used a Canon 40D with my 100-400 lens out at 400 which is a 640 with the modifier and clicked.

It was a lucky shot being at the right time with the light and the otter eating. Pretty simple if everything goes right. I took lots of images to get one.

On the Diagonal by Tim McKinney (page 1)

There were three hot air balloons at a festival in San Ramon. All I did was turn the picture at a 90 degree angle. and brightened it up a little using color correction in Photo shop.

Another Photoshop Trick by Joan Field

Darkening, Lightening and Fixing Wiped-out Areas This is a technique I figured out for myself. You might want to give it a try. Duplicate the backgroud layer.







The original photo is very bright on the drain pipe. Setting the color patches to black and white, black on top, choose the brush tool. Set the opacity to 10% and use Luminosity for the blend mode. If something is totally wiped-out, the Color mode will not allow any color to come through. Use a big soft brush and apply the darkening effect carefully. you accidentally overdo it by overbrushing twice, just shift to white and correct with that. I also darkened the background. These corrections are neutral, but if you have something totally overexposed with no color whatsoever, choose a color close-by for your foreground color. Use the soft brush again, again painting at low opacity.- you can experiment to find the best opacity. Again the Luminosity mode is the best choice as it allows color to be applied, whereas the Color mode will not.
