Seventy students representing 17 Dallas/Fort Worth area school districts and two private schools took part in the 2002 spring and summer Lone Star Leadership Academy programs. Delegates represented the following school districts: Allen, Arlington, Birdville, Carroll, Carrollton/Farmers Branch, Coppell, Crowley, Frisco, Grand Prairie, Grapevine/Colleyville, Hurst-Euless-Bedford, Highland Park, Keller, Mansfield, Northwest, Plano and Richardson.

In between the summer programs, Education in Action met with social studies and gifted and talented curriculum directors and coordinators in several D/FW area school districts.
